The Award shall preferably be presented to Nobles not otherwise recognized as serving on the Divan or by appointment to prominent positions.

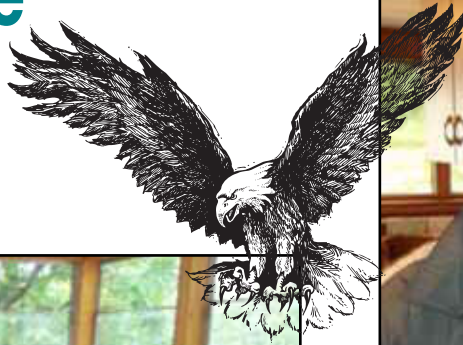

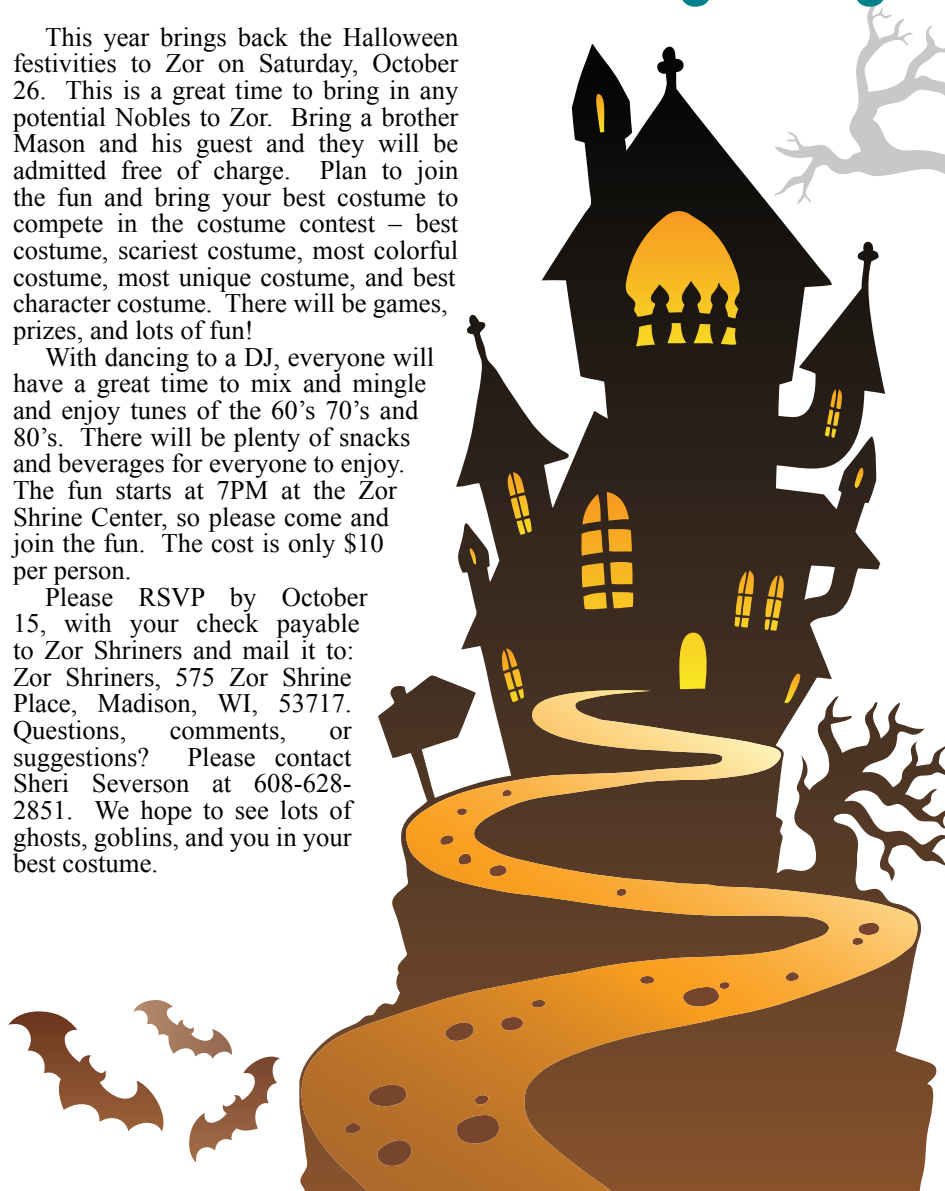


## Haunted Halloween Fright Night
