ELECTIONEERING



- (a) A candidate for an elected office in Zor Shriners may print, publish, and circulate during the year he is seeking an elected office, a resume' consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating, or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, emails, or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or Group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) The expenditure of money for gifts, favors or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

ZOR'S ANNUAL MEETING & FEZ PARTY

Zor Shriner's annual meeting and election of officers will be held on Saturday, January 13, 2024, in La Crosse, Wisconsin at the Radisson Hotel (200 Harborview Plaza).

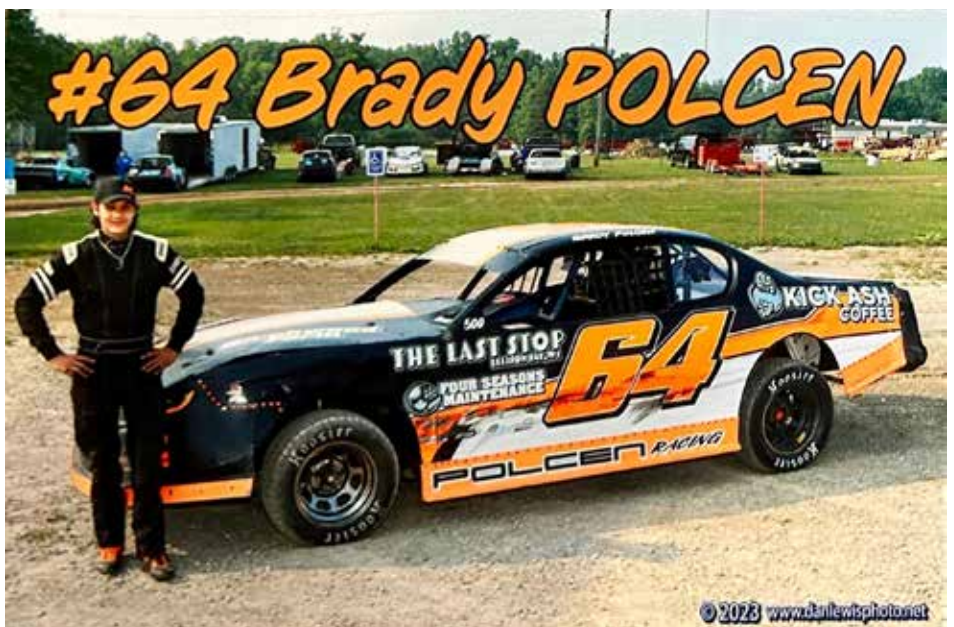
Brady, 20, is a patient at Shriners Children's hospital, and can be seen racing three nights a week in stock car #64. "I race Friday, Saturday, and Sunday and would love to race for my full-time job" Brady said.

In most ways, Brady is just like any other young adult. In his free time, he loves hunting, fishing, and bowling. But he does it all with a prosthetic leg. When he was 3, Brady was involved in a lawnmower accident and lost part of his foot.

Several years later, Brady and his family heard about Shriners Children's Chicago at a bowling tournament. He came to Shriners Children's Chicago as a young teen with a very bowed leg and a foot prosthesis. He had surgery at age 13 to correct the bowing. Doctors at Shriners who specialize in limb differences also shortened Brady's leg a small amount so he could have a better fit in a prosthesis.

After surgery, the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services team fit Brady with a below-knee prosthetic leg. He has had four prosthetics since then as he grew. This allows Brady to be able to participate in activities he enjoys today like racing.

Brady recently attended a golf outing representing Shriners Children's Chicago as a patient ambassador. He was able to show off his prosthetic and car and he even signed autographs. His goal is to race a 'late model' and one day join a team as a full-time driver.

Backpack Awareness



Backpacks used correctly can be a good way to carry the necessities of the school day. They are designed to distribute the weight of the load among some of the body's strongest muscles. However, backpacks that are too heavy or carried incorrectly can cause problems by injuring muscles or joints.



THE WEIGHT OF YOUR BACKPACK

If the backpack weighs more than the carrier's body weight multiplied by 0.15, it's too heavy. **SOMEONE WEIGHING 100 POUNDS SHOULDN'T CARRY A BACKPACK HEAVIER THAN 15 POUNDS.** Consider using a backpack with wheels if the total weight of the backpack is generally greater than 15% of your body weight.

CARRYING TOO MUCH WEIGHT OR WEARING A BACKPACK THE WRONG WAY CAN LEAD TO:

- Painful Shoulders
- Tripping Injuries
- Aching Back
- Neck Pain
- Muscle Fatigue
- Tingling Arms
- Poor Posture

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Padded back
- Waist belt
- Compartments
- Side compression straps
- Reflectors
- Two wide, padded shoulder straps

BACKPACK TIPS

The backpack should be:

- Lightweight
- No wider than your chest
- No higher than the base of your neck
- No lower than 2 to 4 inches below your waist
- Further supported by the waist belt or chest strap - if it has one

BACKPACK STAGES OF USE:

1 LOAD IT

- Keep it light - pack only what you need for the day.
- Place the heaviest objects closest to your back near the bottom of the pack.
- Use compartments to distribute the weight and keep things from sliding around.
- Hand carry a heavy book if your back pack weighs too much.
- Clean it out daily.



2 LIFT IT

- Face the backpack.
- Bend your knees, hold the backpack with both hands and straighten your knees to lift it to waist height.
- Apply one shoulder strap at a time and always use both straps.

3 LUG IT

- If your backpack forces you to lean forward to carry it, it's too overloaded!
- Bend both knees when you bend down
- Snugly adjust your backpack between your neck and the curve of your lower back by tightening the shoulder straps.
- The closer the backpack is to your body, the less strain it will cause!

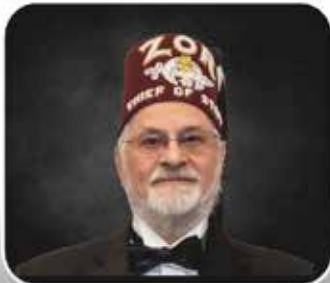

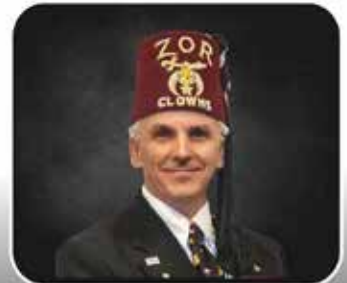

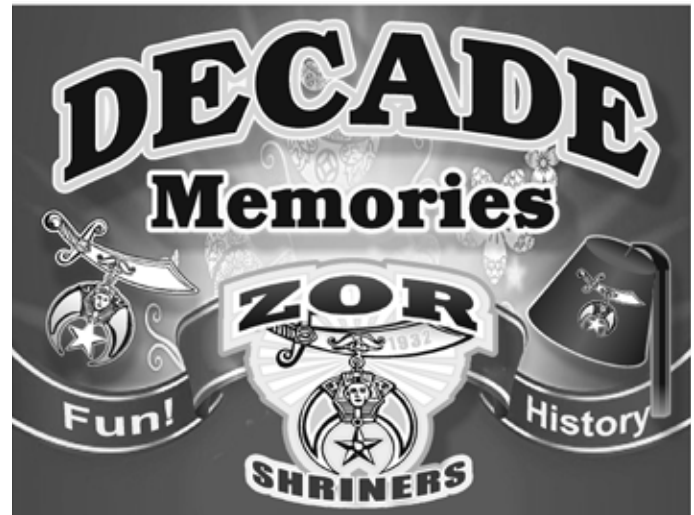
