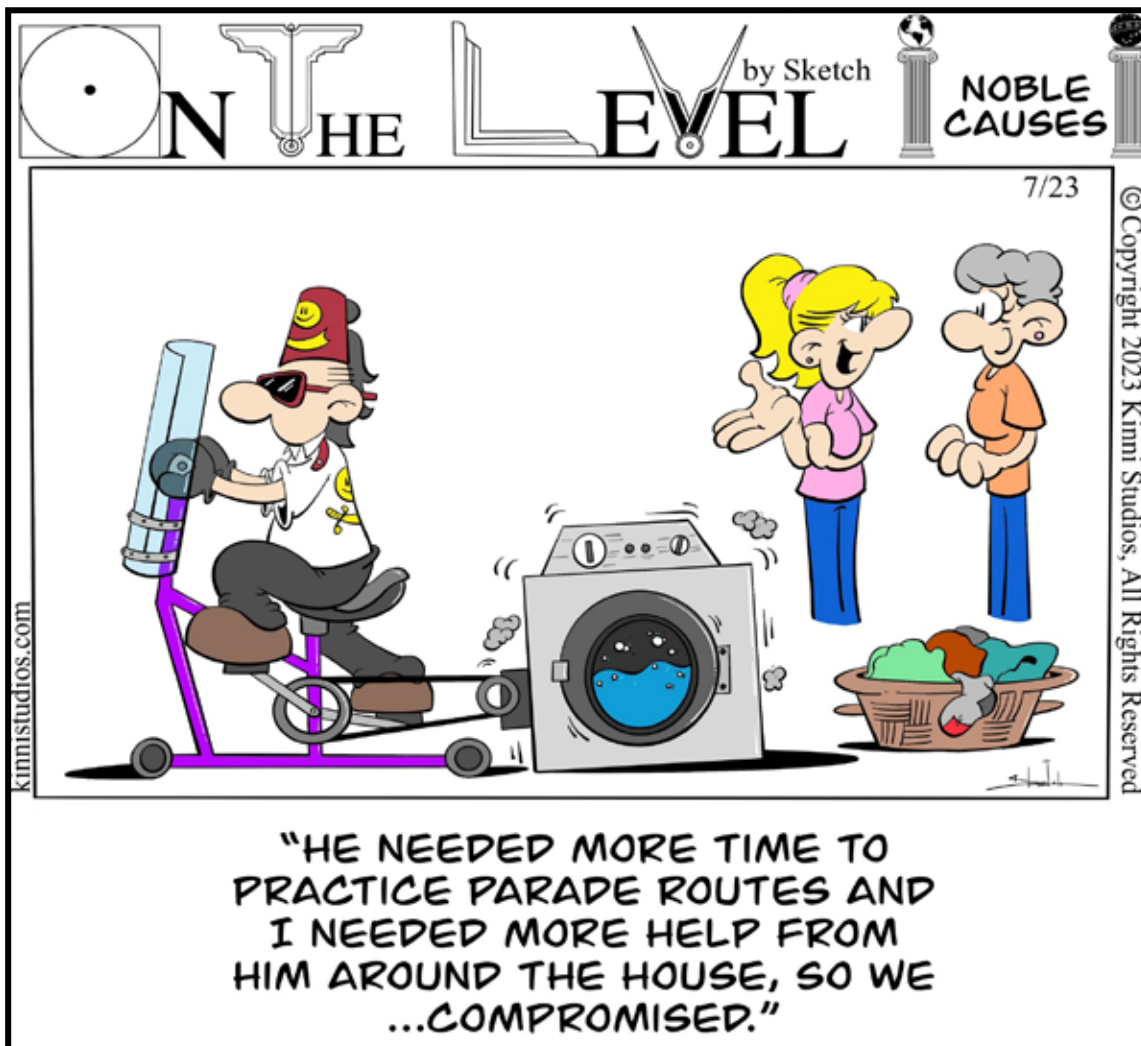

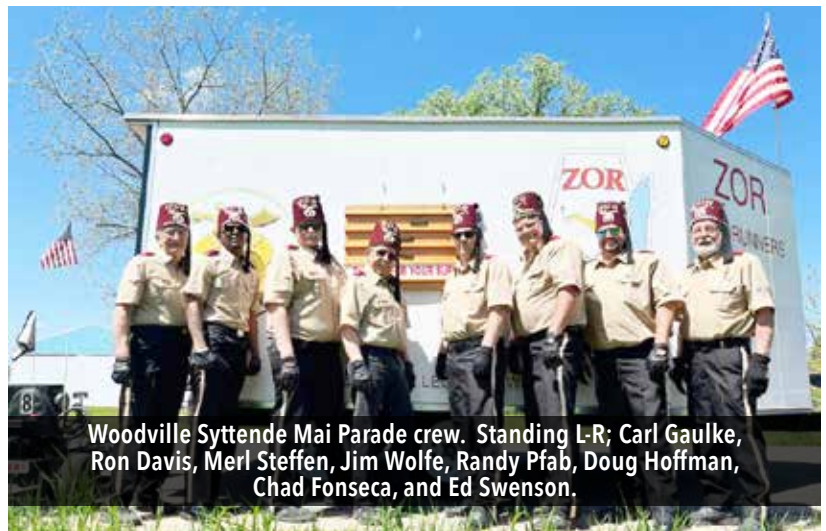
Saint Croix Valley Shrine Club Starts Parade Season

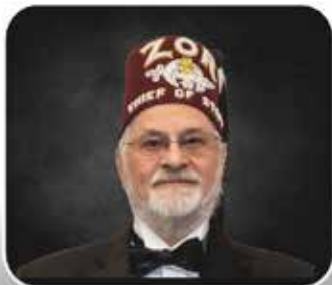

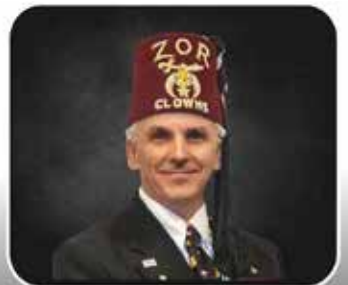

Shriners Children's Twin Cities Imagine – Believe – Achieve The Gala

Let's start with the definition of Gala: a gala is a festive celebration especially in marking a special occasion. This is exactly what this event was! This is the 8th year this fundraiser for the Shriners Children's Twin Cities has occurred. This year it was held at The Depot in Minneapolis on Friday, June 2nd, and was attended by 526 registered guests.

The evening consisted of a silent auction, dinner, and entertainment from a group of Shrine kids who participated in Camp Achieve. Attendees enjoyed an interview with Layla Welch, one of our patient ambassadors, videos of the Winter Camp Achieve and the Nordic Ski Day, as well as the presence of many current and former patients.

The silent auction was well attended throughout the evening with many guests checking their phones to see if they had been outbid. Following the silent auction, the evening switched gears and moved on to the live auction. There was a lot of excitement at this point. With the great auctioneer, it was difficult not to bid and there were bidding cards waving all over the place. It was great to see how people were really getting into bidding, knowing full well the money was going to the Shriners Children's Twin Cities.

When the number crunching wrapped up, the total raised from all the generous supporters was \$540,443.05! This fantastic achievement pushed the total money raised at the Gala fundraiser to over two million dollars since the first gala event held in 2016.

This is one of many events taking place this year for the Shriners Children's Twin Cities celebrating their 100th Anniversary. In 1923, members of the Shrine International Fraternity broke ground along the Mississippi River in Minneapolis, they established a place of hope and healing. Over the years, thousands of families have passed through the doors; whether it be at either of the previous Shriners Hospitals or the new Shriners Children's Twin Cities ambulatory clinic, trusting the staff to care for their children and give them opportunities to reach their fullest potential. Fund-



raising like this wonderful gala event helps us continue to welcome children through the Shriners Children's Twin Cities doors.

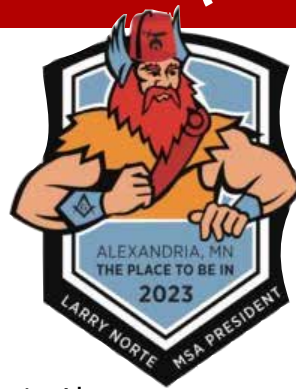
Midwest Shrine Association (MSA) 2023 Summer Session
