Mentoring and Membership "Slogan for 2023"

As I write this month's article, I think back to the day I joined the Shriners. It was always my intent to be a Shriner, leading to why I initially joined my local Masonic Lodge. I joined the Blue Lodge in 1994, the Scottish Rite and then the Shriners in 2000.

As the years passed, I became highly involved with my Lodge in Sparta and the Midget Shrine Unit that was based out of Mauston, WI, at the time. Many of the initial individuals that I met from the Midgets were Bob Severson, Bud Hale, Jimmy Hover, Lloyd Byington, Bill Gant, and the Swan family; just to name a few. The Unit at that time was ready to throw in the towel as the majority of the members were in their 70's and 80's and not able to keep up with the maintenance and handling of the cars. These men had a passion for the children and the Shriners Hospitals which was why they kept the Midgets going. These same men mentored me and kept that fire burning in me to keep going. With the help from my Lodge brothers joining me in the Midget Unit; it is still active today. Since 1969, and after hundreds of parades many of the Charter Members of the Midgets have passed leaving the next generation to keep it going.

The struggles, however, continued as the unit needed to upgrade the original and dated equipment. Our Unit, like all Units, only maintained membership with no gain. It was imperative we either had to give up or take the plunge! We decided to take the plunge and replace our equipment with some help from our Temple, due to a healthy price tag. With

some hiccups and bumps in the road, "No pun intended," we purchased new cars and trailers to avoid the old equipment being a hazard in parades. To help relieve our financial burden, our Unit started a new fundraiser, in addition to parading. In 2021, the Midgets hosted their first Annual Festival of Trees event in Sparta at the Masonic Lodge. The event involves community sponsorship and provides the Midgets with additional funds to maintain the Unit. As for the Midgets, a mix up of activities draws interest from a variety of Nobles with different interests. Recently, the Midgets held their first practice for the 2023 parade season, with new cars and several new drivers. The excitement and enthusiasm is amazing to see. We have changed our approach on parading, trying to avoid too many parades in one season, as well as staying away from the holiday parades, as this is time that should be spent with family and friends. This, I believe, has helped stabilize our Unit. I guess my point is, keep the passion and fire burning so we don't lose a good Shriner from burn out; however, keep them involved and have fun!

Mentoring is the key to a healthy Temple.

Fundraising Notice

As Recorder of Zor Shriners, I am required to inform all Nobles at least once a year what the fundraising requirements are per General Order No. 1, pages 41-43. I encourage everyone to review it in its entirety but here is a summary of the critical parts of it.

It is natural to associate the Fez with Shriners Hospitals for Children. Because of this, meticulous attention must be given to all fundraising activities, including circuses, to make certain that such activities comply with the law of the land and that a contributor is not led to believe his or her money will be used for the Hospitals when all or a portion, thereof will be used otherwise. The integrity of our charity and of our fraternity must remain above reproach.

The use of the name "Shriners Hospitals for Children" or reference to the Hospitals in connection with any fundraising activity by a Temple or Noble without the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Hospitals is prohibited.

No Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), club, unit, organization of Nobles or affiliated or appendant corporations, shall engage in any fundraising activity without the express written consent of the potentate of the temple having jurisdiction, thereof.

There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children when the activity is for Fraternal purposes.

Any officer, Noble or temple which violates a provision of Fundraising Activities as outlined in General Order No. 1 is subject to discipline pursuant to the bylaws of Shriners International.

Meet your Divan **NOBLE JOSH THERRIAN, MARSHALL**

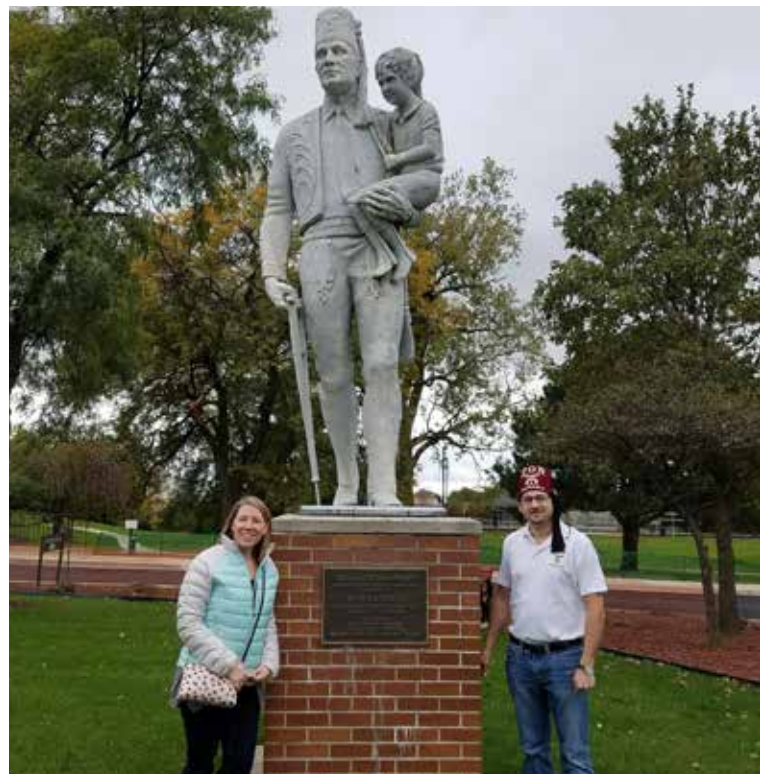

The WGA mission states that we provide wheelchairs, adaptive equipment, funds for patient activities, toys, and blankets for the children at Shriners Children's Twin Cities to enhance their quality of life through financial donations and contributions from the Shrine Auxiliaries in the Midwest.

With this in mind we found out that in 2022 the WGA funded

- 7 Power Wheelchairs
- 25 Manual Wheelchairs
- 18 Growth kits
- 118 Orthoses and repairs
- 4 ramps
- 6 lap trays
- 10 loaner wheelchairs delivered to rehab services.



Total funding of wheelchairs and mobility equipment -2022 was \$230,430.47.

Special guest speakers Marcia Montgomery, Dan Filipovich and Michael Hannual from Rehabilitation Designs, the company who takes care of all our wheelchair needs, gave us a wonderful presentation of thanks from many of the children that we have helped over the years.

After lunch Mary Rose, who is a retired physical therapy assistant, and worked at Shriners Children's from 1985 -2021 explained how the PT department used different equipment throughout the many years to assist kids after surgery to gain strength, walk and use their wheelchairs.

The representatives from the auxiliaries reported on the different fundraisers they do during the year to raise money that is sent to the WGA for the wheelchair fund. 25 total auxiliaries sent in \$270,709 in 2022.

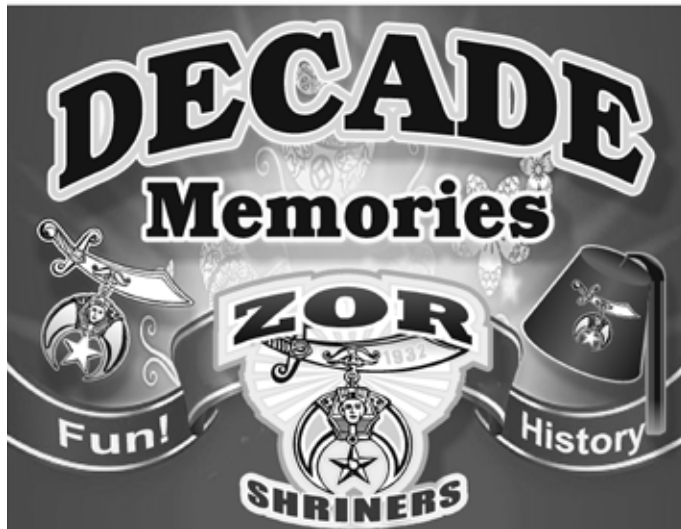

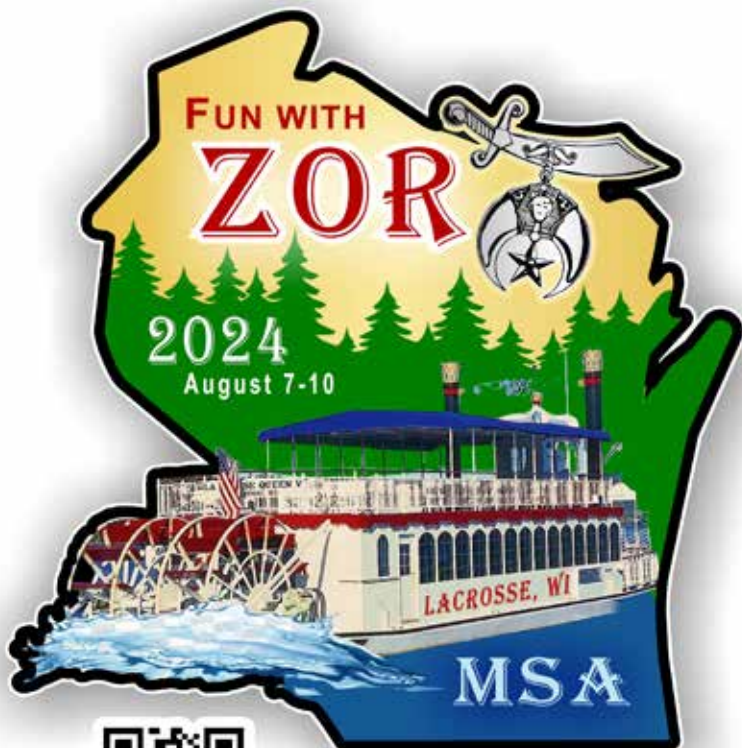
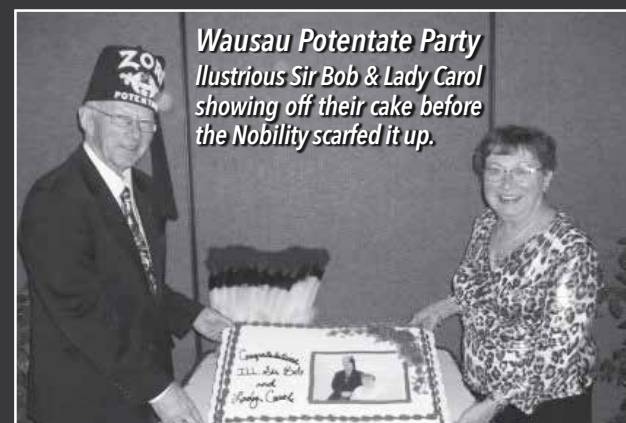
