



The ground breaking for the newest version of the Shriners Healthcare facility was held at their new location in Woodbury on Friday, July 19th 2019 at 1 pm at City Place Medical, Radio Drive. Construction will also started on the 40,000 sq ft building in which Shriners will occupy 20,000 sq. ft. on the first level.

The Shriners Healthcare for Children's new clinic space is centered around their transition in late 2018 to an outpatient clinic from a full-service Hospital. According to Bob Hering, Zor Shrine and member of the Shrine board of governors. "All surgeries will continue to be performed by Shriners Healthcare for Children–

The new location replaces the current 29 year old building in Minneapolis. The will be third location for the healthcare facility which opened in 1923.

The property is located 8 miles east of downtown St. Paul at 215 Radio Drive in Woodbury with easy access from I-94.

Construction is expected to be completed by May/June 2020.





- You'll place your lures in one of the 54 holes (buckets) you would like to fish in. You may fish all of your lures in one hole or spread them out over several holes.
- Once the tournament starts, we'll draw a hole that has a fish at least every two minutes.
- Once the active hole is drawn, we will draw out one of the lures. If your number is called you must report to the hole, with your license, before the next active hole is drawn
- When you arrive at the hole, you'll draw a card which indicates the weight of the fish
- Aces are 1lb, other weights equal numerical value in the card, all face cards are 10lbs.
- Jokers are a missed fish
- Tagged fish win special cash prizes
- You'll then clip your card to your stringer (lanyard)
- At the conclusion of the tournament at you'll turn in your stringer and the weights will be calculated






