The Community Arts Center (CAC) is celebrating 42 years of awarding 225 Art Scholarships. The Art Scholarship Program is available to graduating seniors from Cambria County who will be furthering their education by majoring in art as a career. In 2023, \$6,750 in CAC scholarships was awarded. To date, \$80,250 has been given by CAC in art scholarships to graduating seniors. The monies are awarded from the funds that carry the donors' names, a memorial fund, the community, and Arts Center members' financial support. CAC also partners with the Allied Artists of Johnstown to aid in facilitating their annual scholarships. This has been a great way for the organizations to work together toward the common goal of fostering the artists of tomorrow.

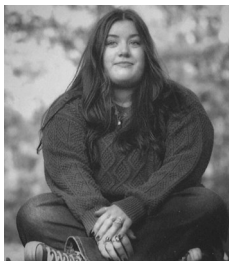

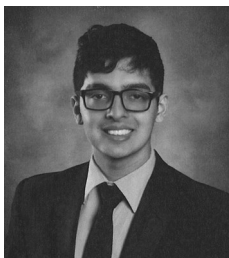

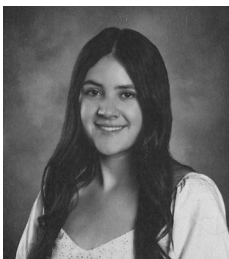
