

#### Use Request to Speak (RTS) to Influence the Outcome of Legislation

Request to Speak (RTS) is an online real-time system that allows the public to register opinions on bills being heard in committee. You can:

- Indicate whether you are "for" or "against" the bill.
- Write a brief comment explaining your position.
- Register your willingness to speak (testify) during the committee hearing.

We encourage you to use this powerful tool to make your voice heard at the legislature.

If you do not have an RTS account, please complete this form, and a league volunteer will register your account at the Capitol. We will create your account with a generic password. Once you receive an email from us that your account has been set up, we advise that you change your password immediately. Please note that you cannot register online for RTS.

#### WHAT IS A PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE ELECTION?

• The Presidential Preference Election (PPE) is an election in which voters can choose who they would like to be their presidential candidate in the upcoming General Election. Arizona only holds a PPE once every 4-years and sometimes the political parties choose not to participate if they have agreed on a candidate to represent them. The Republican party has not held a PPE since 2016. Party winners of the Arizona PPE are officially determined at the party's national convention.

#### WHY CAN ONLY DEMOCRATS OR REPUBLICANS VOTE?

• The PPE is not a primary election. This means Arizona's open primary law does not apply to the PPE. Therefore, only voters registered with the participating party may vote on that party's ballot. Since only the Democratic & Republican Parties are participating in the PPE, only Democrats & Republicans can vote in the PPE. Independent/Other/Unaffiliated voters may change their voter registration to a designated



party by February 20, 2024. After the election, voters may change their registration back to Independent if they so choose.

#### WHO CAN VOTE:

- Only voters registered with the participating parties can vote in the PPE.
- The Democratic & Republican Parties are the only ones participating in the PPE.
- This means only voters registered as Democrats or Republicans can vote in the March 19th PPE.
