Spring is Here!

Spring is upon us! Along with its beautiful bright blooms, long wavy grass, and meandering plant growth, Spring also brings with it an abundance of annoying flies, bugs and slithering rattlesnakes. Here are some reminders to help make this time of year more comfortable and safe for both you and your horse.

Use fly spray before and after going out on a ride.

Here is a simple fly spray recipe for those of you who are adventurous and want to make your own!

- 16 oz. Spray bottle
- 2 cups Raw Apple Cider Vinegar
- 1 Tbs Mineral or Olive Oil
- ½ Tbs Dawn Dish Soap
- 30 40 drops of any combination of the following essential oils:
- Citronella, Eucalyptus, Lemon Grass, Basil, Peppermint, Cedarwood, Lavender, Tea Tree, Rosemary
- Put all ingredients into spray bottle, shake gently and spray.

Less expensive option:

- 16 oz. Spray bottle
- 2 cups Raw-Apple Cider Vinegar
- 1 tablespoon Eucalyptus essential oil
- 1 cup water

Use Diatomaceous Earth!

Food Grade Diatomaceous Earth is a natural alternative to traditional pest controls. It can create a dry environment that stops flies from breeding when sprinkled in and around your horse's stall. It can also help reduce odors that attract flies.

Rattlesnakes are lurking!

Avoid walking through high grass and brush with your horse. Snakes – even poisonous ones would rather stay in hiding than interfere with your trail ride. If you do come across a rattlesnake, stop and let the snake retreat or give it a wide berth. Snakes are actually deaf but can feel the vibrations from the earth. They will usually retreat if given the chance. Note: A snake can strike from up to two-thirds the length of its body length. If you happen to run into the SC black rattlesnake some of us have encountered...be careful. It is very aggressive! Definitely steer clear if you see it!



REMINDERS

Ahh...Shedding time!

Spring brings shedding and a whole LOT of it! As the hours of daylight increase, a horse's winter coat begins to loosen and shed. Keeping up with grooming and brushing during this time is important for your horse, but it also means more hair on the ground.

Please take the time to sweep up after brushing at the tie rails or when washing your horse in the wash racks. Hair and muck can be placed in one of the muck buckets or trash cans nearby. Our wash rack drains can get super clogged up during this time of year!

- * Please use **Courtesy** when using arenas.
- * Turnouts 15 minutes when others are waiting. All halters must be taken off before turning horses out.
- * Trainers giving a lesson and/or riders have priority in arenas
- * Always walk horses on grounds and in between aisles
- * For your horse's safety, please do not leave horses unattended in wash racks, arenas, or at tie rails.
- * Do not tie horses to stalls, stall doors or arena fences. This can be very dangerous as horses can pull down the pipe rails!
- * Speed Limit on Sycamore Canyon Equestrian Property is 5 mph or less.
- * Please clean up after yourselves and your horses in all grooming areas and wash racks.





Juan is married to his beautiful wife Vidalia. He has 5 kids and 8 grandkids. Juan has lived in Glendora for over 36 years.


