BUDGET PRESENTATION

Corey presented the 2023 proposed budget and wanted to extend a Thank You to the congregation for the contribution increase to keep our operations going and our doors open. Motion made to accept the presentation 1. Paul Grewe 2. Hank Pleuss PASSED

FOCUSED BUDGET DISCUSSION LINE BY LINE

Corey took time to explain each line that had a change then discussion. Biggest focus is:

- Decreasing the expected incoming donations to \$260,000 based on last years giving(down \$68,000) and based on a good faith 10% increase
- No pastoral budget except for supply pastor funding

- ❖ Music and support staff cost of living raises of 8% these 2 full time staff are keeping this church running every day and the church council felt they deserve this raise! This was met with loud applause!
- ❖ Benevolence will remain @ 6% actual giving
- 1. How much to send out bi-monthly enveloped for giving is there ROI on the cost especially with the recent delay. Angio unsure of the actual cost but will investigate and did feel the ROI was indeed worth it as this was the only way some members gave their donation. We felt the mailing vs picking up at church decision could be handed over to council to make decision on.
- 2. The new proposed budget expenditure without a pastor salary don't match up there should be a bigger difference Corey is crunching numbers while we continue discussion.
 - **** the error was found that 2 cells were added twice and the actual budget expense is: \$246,507. This was acceptable and motion made to approve this adjusted/corrected amount 1. Jen Holcomb 2. Laurie Sturzenegger PASSED

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Angie identified deficits in equipment staff are using personal devices and continues to have intermittent issues with malfunctions. We need further investigation into the needs of
 - a. Camera, screen, streaming services
 - b. Cost there is \$ available to use and Paul G did remind everyone that council is able to spend up to \$10 without a congregational meeting to provide continued serves of the church.

- 3. Josh updated us on 2 things from previous town hall meetings:
 - a. Transitional Support from Synod Council has voted to hold on this paid service for the time being
 - b. Employee Retention Program funds federal program we qualify for keeping our business open through the pandemic forms have been submitted and signed and we do qualify for \$35,000. This has not been added to the budget as we do not know when this money will be received from the government.
