## GSLC Annual Meeting

January 22, 2023

### COUNCIL APPROVED: DRAFT

Attendance was 56 plus two additional who joined virtually, for a total of 58. Quorum was met.

**CALL TO ORDER** at 10:32am.

**OPENING PRAYER** – Joshua Stumpner, Council President

#### APPROVAL OF 2022 MINUTES

Requested correction to the spelling of Barb Denfeld’s name and to remove the repeat in last two sentences of treasurer’s report.

Motion made to **approve with corrections**: 1. Tim Holcomb 2. Mike Sturzenegger/PASSED

#### APPROVAL OF MEETING AGENDA (for 1/22/2023)

Add Endowment Committee members to election (names were present on the ballot sheet)

Motion made to **accept with addition**: 1. Jennifer Holcomb 2. Dia Arpon/PASSED

#### REPORTS

Correction to Confirmation report – please add Bailey Berndt

Motion made to **accept with correction**: 1. Paul Grewe 2. Joanne Grewe PASSED

#### ELECTIONS

1. Council – three council nominees are on ballot; one more was needed, but we realized that we missed one offer – Jennifer Holcomb willing to serve; nominated by MJ Horvat and added to the ballot
2. Synod Assembly – Mike and Laurie Sturzenegger volunteered and were added to the ballot
3. Endowment Committee – 5 available slots; all 5 filled with 2 poised to retire their 3-year term (Tim Holcomb and Sharon Semling); these two were willing to serve again; both were nominated and added to the ballot for another 3-year term
4. Nominating Committee – Joshua Stumpner volunteered and was added to the ballot
5. Crossways Representative – Tony Omernik volunteered and was added to the ballot

Motion was made to **accept the updated ballot and approve [vote in] all those named on the ballot**: 1. Joanne Grewe 2. Jennifer Holcomb/PASSED

#### BUDGET PRESENTATION

Treasurer Cory Toth-LaPointe presented the 2023 proposed budget and extended a sincere ‘Thank You’ to the congregation for contribution increases that have been helping to keep our doors open/operations running! Motion made to **accept the presentation**: 1. Paul Grewe 2. Hank Pleuss/PASSED

#### FOCUSED BUDGET DISCUSSION: LINE-BY-LINE

Cory Toth-LaPointe explained each line that had a change and facilitated discussion. Biggest focus areas were:

- Decreased expected incoming donations to \$260,000 based on last year’s giving (down \$68,000) and based on a good-faith 10% increase
- No pastoral budget was planned, except for supply pastor funding
- Music and support staff cost-of-living raises of 8% - these two full-time staff members are keeping this church running every day and the Council felt they deserved this raise. This was met with loud applause!!
- Benevolence will remain @ 6% of actual giving

- Question raised: what is the cost to send out bi-monthly envelopes for giving – is there sufficient return on the cost to justify it, especially with the recent delay (some members had not yet received their January giving envelopes at the time of this meeting [January 22])? Angie shared that she was unsure of the actual cost but agreed to investigate; she noted that she felt the return was, indeed, worth the cost, as this was the only way some members provided their donation. Determination was that the mailing vs picking up at church decision could be handed over to Council for discussion/decision
- The new proposed budget expenditure without a pastor salary did not seem to match up – there should have been a larger difference – discussion continued while Cory crunched numbers.  
[\*\*\* an error was found: two cells were added twice; actual budgeted expense was \$246,507. This explanation of the discrepancy was acceptable; motion made to **approve the adjusted/corrected amount**: 1. Jennifer Holcomb 2. Laurie Sturzenegger/PASSED]

## OLD BUSINESS

1. Angie – identified deficits in equipment to provide quality **online worship experiences** – staff have used their personal devices and continue to experience intermittent malfunction issues. We need further investigation into the needs of:
  - a. Camera, screen, streaming services
  - b. Cost – there are funds available to use and Paul Grewe reminded everyone that council is authorized to spend up to \$10,000 to provide continued serves of the church without calling a congregational meeting for approval
  - c. Kartika also reminded those present: this is a need that needs a TEAM of people for success; we cannot rely on one person to operate the cameras [and we especially cannot rely upon the person who is supposed to be playing the organ 😊]. *Please strongly consider sharing your technological talents, as we TRULY need a team of people to help advance our technology presence and grow this congregation!*
2. Josh Stumpner updated those gathered on two items from previous town hall meetings:
  - a. Transitional Support from Synod – Council had voted to decline this paid service for the immediate future
  - b. Employee Retention Program funds – federal program we qualify for keeping our business open through the pandemic; forms have been submitted and signed and we qualify for \$35,000! These funds have not been added to the budget as we do not know when this money will be received from the US government.

## NEW BUSINESS

1. Endowment Fund emergency access –tabled as it was not relevant to the current situation
2. Home Visitation Ministry – is in need of volunteers!
3. Pre-School Restricted Funds – Question “what are we doing with these funds?” The money is being kept to finish the Damgaard room updates

## FINAL BUDGET APPROVAL

Motion made to **approve the final budget**: 1. Paul Grewe 2. Stephanie Martel/PASSED

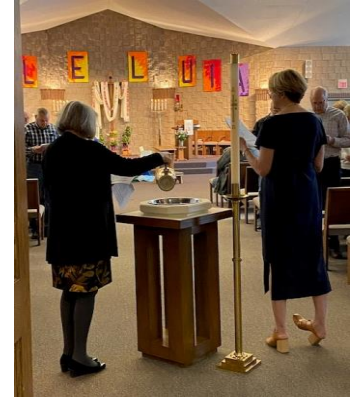
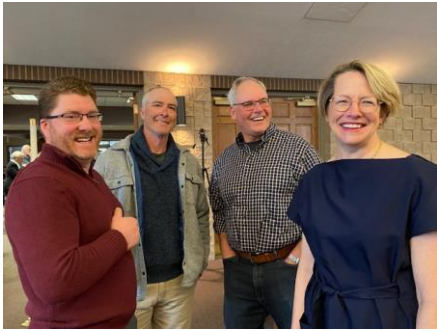
