st. Anthony goes pro Dan Kaczrowski Gets Drafted

St. Anthony Village High School Alumnus, Dan Kaczrowski completed his senior year at Hamline University this spring before being signed by the St. Paul Saints and drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks. The following is an account of the past summer through Kaczrowski's eyes after being asked to talk about his experiences following one season of proball.

After completing my senior year at Hamline, I was signed by the St. Paul Saints. June 11, 2009 started off like any other playing for the Saints. I woke up around 11:30 AM, met some of my fellow rookie teammates for lunch around 1pm, and arrived to Midway Stadium for early work at 2pm. After doing some early work I decided to take a break in the clubhouse and check my phone while relaxing before team batting practice began. When I first looked at my phone, it said I had 38 unread text messages and five missed calls. Scrolling through a few text messages from friends, I realized that I was just picked by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 26th round of the Major League Baseball Draft.

Post #230, composed of 15 and 16 year old SAVHS students, finished 34-5 on the season, playing in a very strong 7th District. More than 30 teams compete in the 7th District,

composed of an area covering much of the north and northwest Metro. In very well-played, closely fought games St. Anthony topped Centennial (2-1), Robbinsdale Cooper (9-5), Champlin Park (4-3) and Maple Grove (4-3) to earn a berth in the 55th annual state tournament. In the District 7 championship game Ryan Ferkinhoff stole home in dramatic fashion for what proved to be the winning run.

Post #230 VFW finished 34-5 on the season.

Nicho Roessler threw a gem to limit a very talented and physically impressive Maple Grove team to three runs. In state tourney play, Post #230 went 3-2 for a fourth place finish and end to a great season. The SAVHS baseball team ended a Cinderella run in the section finals dropping two games to DeLaSalle. After the state championship team from 2008 graduated eight starters, the Huskies fielded an entirely new lineup for the 2009 campaign. With a new face to the team, the outlook in 2009 was difficult to predict. The Huskies quickly proved they were a formidable team once again, going on to a fantastic 17-7 mark prior to the section finals. St. Anthony – New Brighton Schools Submits Grant for Field Lights

Big news – the St. Anthony-New Brighton School Board has requested \$345,000 for Central Park field improvements from Hennepin County. As part of the Twins Stadium financing, annual grant monies have been made available by the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners specifically for athletic field improvements. The St. Anthony – New Brighton School Board requested funds to light the JV and varsity baseball fields in addition to adding environmental enhancements to the park and covered bleacher areas on the varsity softball and baseball fields. An important criterion of this grant request was matching monies. The St. Anthony Baseball Association is responsible for upward of \$10,000 in matching money. Sports Boosters Recap



My dream has always been to play professional baseball, and signing a contract with the Saints was more than I could have asked for, especially in my hometown. I had the time of my life playing pro ball in front of friends and family everyday, but playing affiliated ball was something too good to pass up.


I was to report to camp in Tucson, Arizona on the 13th of June at noon. When I arrived in Tucson, I had to go through an in-depth physical and take a few different tests. The next day was the beginning of minicamp which consisted of a meeting at 7am, a full defensive practice lasting until around 10am, batting practice

after that, followed by conditioning/base running. We had a 45 minute break and then began a 9 inning game, finishing around 4pm. Minicamp lasted for three days, and was not the most fun I have ever had playing baseball due to the extremely long days in the scorching Arizona heat. Everyone who was in minicamp were players who were drafted in this year's draft.

On my birthday (June 17th), the 50-or-so players that were down in Tucson for minicamp were split up into two teams, one headed for Rookie league ball in Missoula, Montana, and another group that headed to Yakima, Washington for Short-Season A league, of which I was a part. We had two days of practice and then the season began on the road in Spokane, Washington.

Looking presentable was a requirement

in the Diamondbacks' organization. The coaches and our manager kept a close eye on us at all times to make sure we always wore a collared shirt and were cleanly shaven. If not, there would be a small fine that the offending player was due to pay. In Yakima, I lived in a rented house with three other teammates. The



Even though our stadium wasn't the nicest, I was still able to play in some very cool parks, in front of some very large crowds. The grind of 76 games in 79 days was very tiring, requiring proper nutrition, adequate sleep, and frequent trips to the team trainer and conditioning coaches who were very helpful in keeping the players healthy.

It was a very exciting summer for me and I hope to continue playing as long as there is a jersey hanging up in my locker. After my experiences over the past few years, when I am able to give advice to young players, I tell them to hold their dreams high, play hard, but more importantly, play with your whole heart, and you will have success.





St. Anthony Alumni Playing 2009 College Baseball

Tim Duffy Sophomore Pitcher Augustana College (Sioux Falls, SD)

Tim appeared in 12 games and logged 15 innings in a relief role. He was 1-0 and tallied 14 strikeouts.

Jarron Farah Freshman Pitcher Augsburg College (Mpls, MN)

Jarron made 4 appearances all in relief, with 3 strikeouts and no decisions in 6 innings of work.

Dan Halstensgard Junior Catcher/1B/DH Northwestern College (Roseville, MN)

Dan started all 42 games and finished the year with 7 doubles, 2 home runs, 37 RBI, and a .408 batting average. With his 64 hits, he also broke the Eagles single-season hits record that was set in 1998.

Dan Kaczrowski Senior SS Hamline University (St. Paul, MN)

Dan capped-off a great college career with an outstanding senior season. He was named to the D-III All-Midwest Region 1st Team after batting .393 with 10 doubles, 4 home runs, and 26 RBI. He led the MIAC conference with 23 stolen bases in 23 attempts, and had an amazing season total of only 5 strikeouts in 150 at-bats.

Chad Peterson Sophomore 2B College of St. Scholastica (Duluth, MN)

After missing a third of the season to a knee injury, Chad finished the year strong, batting .391 in 92 at-bats with 9 doubles, 1 triple, 1 grand slam, and 32 RBI in his 29 games.

Chris Peterson Freshman Pitcher Concordia College (St. Paul, MN)

Chris made 5 appearances, including one start, and was 1-0. He threw 8 innings and logged 8 strikeouts for the Division II Golden Bears.

Joe Stark Junior 1B UW Superior (Superior, WI)

Joe appeared in 18 games while starting 9 times. In 31 at-bats he had 4 RBI to go along with 3 walks, and 1 sacrifice fly.

Dan Zurbey Freshman 3B Hamline University (St. Paul, MN)

Dan played in 17 games and started 1. He compiled a .292 batting average on 7 hits in 24 at-bats, with 6 RBI, 2 walks, and 2 runs scored.


Legion Recap



Despite a 6-18 record, the St. Anthony Norsemen made significant progress in 2009. In their third season, the Norse Nine were competitive in nearly every match-up, losing ten games by two runs or fewer. The team's pitching improved this season with the addition of 35-year old rookie Steve Jahnke. The lanky right-hander added a fresh arm to the rotation, giving journeyman Steve Peterson and southpaw Chris Nogosek much needed rest between starts. Fire-baller Doug Zezulka also joined the staff in '09, and looks to be an impact player in the future.

Norsemen bats improved in 2009, as well, with the team average jumping to .298. Catcher Paul Morita was among league leaders with a blistering .490 average and 25 hits. The 2009 season was the most successful to date for the St. Anthony Hogs, who finished with an overall record of 16-14. The team benefited from the addition of several new players, including a group of recent SAVHS graduates. This is a trend the Hogs hope to see continue – keeping the talent of St. Anthony baseball within the city, and helping the Hogs continue to improve into a Skyline League championship contender.

The highlight of the year was a mid-season nine game winning streak that saw the Hogs take down perennial state tournament combined for three homers, and Steve Green topped the team RBI board with fourteen. Defensively, the Norsemen continued their solid play. Outfielders Mezzenga, Austin, Nogosek and Bloom provided reliable coverage, with center-fielder Tim Nichols emerging as an outstanding leader of the corps. Randy Stille was an impenetrable wall at first base, and middle infielders Phil Schenkenberg and Paul Melchior allowed few balls through the middle, while turning a team record twelve double plays.

Undoubtedly, the highlight of the year came during the first round of the Federal League playoffs, when Chris Nogosek pitched a near-perfect, no-hit shutout against the powerful Richfield Rockets. The left-hander was brilliant, allowing only one batter to reach first base on a seventh-inning walk. Several sterling defensive plays sealed the game, and the Norse won 7-0.
