From the SABA President

The St. Anthony Baseball Association (SABA) had a very good year! We started the year with a great season by the varsity baseball team - which culminated in another trip to the State Baseball Tournament. In addition, the Norsemen, Hogs, Legion, VFW, and Sports Boosters teams all had very good seasons.

Our concession stand, managed by volunteers Amy Kraus and Jessica Kelly had **a fantastic** year, generating \$1260 for the Dugout Club, \$820 for the Softball Diamond Club and \$2312 for SABA. Thanks to Jessica and Amy for all your hard work!

For the second consecutive year, we received funding from the Twins Stadium sales tax, this time coming from Hennepin County and the Twins Community Fund. Two grants totaling \$80,000 were received to install drainage in the varsity softball and baseball fields — it was installed in August and will make a significant improvement to both fields for the 2012 season.

We had another successful field day – with over 20 volunteers working on baseball field improvements on a beautiful day in October. Shortly after the field day, we were presented with the Field of the Year award from the Minnesota High School Baseball Coaches

after the field day, we were presented a Field of the Year award from the sta High School Baseball Coaches Association, the second year that Palm Field has received prestigious recognition.

Lastly, thanks to the SABA Board, who work on fund raising activities throughout the year and commit many hours to our baseball programs. We lost two founding board members, Jeff Ferkinhoff and Tim Peterson. Tim was head of the fundraising efforts and his energy and work ethic. Jeff served as President the last few years and led our field work day efforts. They will both be sorely missed.




PALM FIELD RECEIVES ADDITIONAL ACCOLADES

HUSKIES RETURN TO STATE

After losing the first game of the finals to Minnehaha, St. Anthony pitcher Nicho Roessler led the Huskies to a convincing 15 to 1 win, capturing the 4AA baseball crown and a berth in the Class AA State Tournament.

In the state tournament, the Huskies matched up against the eventual state champions, St. Cloud Cathedral High School in the first round. The Huskies had played Cathedral earlier in the season, winning 6 to 4, but were unable to duplicate this feat losing to Cathedral (and one of the best pitchers in the state, the Class AA Player of the Year, Andrew Thome). In a great baseball game, Cathedral took the lead in the fifth inning and never lost hold of the game, winning 3 to 1. The St. Anthony squad never recovered from the loss

and finished the season the next day losing to the Proctor Rails. This was the fifth trip to state tournament for the Huskies in the past nine years; St. Anthony won state titles in 2006 and 2008.

For the year, the Huskies took second place in the Tri-Metro Conference and after their state tournament appearance finished with a 19 and 8 record. Many career records were broken in 2011, including two players, Stephen Couillard and Nicho Roessler, eclipsing the 100 hit mark.

The Huskies lost 13 great players to graduation. A sincere thank you goes to this great group for playing the game right.



Coaching Changes for St. Anthony High School Baseball

The Huskies will have some new coaching faces in the dugout this spring. Assistant varsity coach Brian McCarthy took a sabbatical from the Huskies program to teach in Germany. His influence on the program has been immense and Coach McCarthy's presence will be missed this year. In addition, there will be a new JV coach; Coach Blansette will lead the Park Center High School Pirates as their varsity head coach in 2012. The Huskies baseball program has been very fortunate to have great coaches and has begun the difficult task of replacing these positions for this spring.

Norsemen Update

The St. Anthony Norsemen broke through in 2011, tallying fourteen wins against only eight losses for their first winning season since their 2007 inception. The Norse combined solid starting pitching by Steve 'Goose' Jahnke, southpaw Chris Nogosek, and control specialist Steve Peterson with a trademark stingy defense to secure a third place overall finish in the sixteen-team Federal League. Team hitting was more consistent up and down the lineup card this year, with team batting average and OBP improving to .286 and .478, respectively.

Boosters Update

Booster Baseball had another great year. We had a total of 12 teams participate in in-house and travel leagues. Our in-house, 3rd/4th grade St Anthony Royals took first place in their league. Both the 5th/6th grade boys and the 8th/9th grade boys had teams take second place in their league.

The 11u travel team took first place at the St Francis invitational. Both the 11u and 13u teams made to the 3rd round of their leagues playoffs.

Finally, MYAS asked Boosters to host the finals for both 13u AA and 13uAAA at Central Park. We received numerous comments from coaches and parents about what a great group of people and what a nice park we have.

VFW Update

The Post #230 VFW team made dramatic improvements this past summer, finishing the season 15-12. The VFW team finished 7th District play with an impressive 12-6 record before losing to Forest Lake in the playoffs. The players and coaches thank Post #230 for their sponsorship and support. Next year about half of the team will return in new Post #230 uniforms.

Legion Update

Tri-City Blue, which consists of 17-19 year old players from the St. Anthony and Columbia Heights communities, had another successful season in 2011 finishing with a record of 9-9. The season was cut short again by the St. Anthony high school teams run to the state tournament.

The highlight of the season was finishing second in the Delano Stars and Stripes 4th of July tournament. Winning the first two games of the tournament got TCB into the championship game and playing under the lights on 4th of July in front of the Delano locals.

Tri-City Blue finished the season in 5th place out of 11 in the North Hennepin league. After beating Andover in the first round of the playoffs, Tri-City was ousted by eventual state tournament runner-up Centennial in the second round by scores of 9-3 and 3-2.

Hogs Update

Coming off the first state tournament appearance in team history, the Hogs entered the 2011 season with a lot of excitement and high expectations. The Hogs finished with their best regular season standing ever, finishing in second place in the Skyline League with a league record of 13-5 and earning a first round bye in the playoffs.

Unfortunately, the season ended a little too soon with the Hogs coming up one win short of a return trip to the state tournament -- losing the Skyline League final round playoff series two games to one to the St. Paul Rooster. The Hogs finished the season with an overall record of 20-10.

Pitching and defense were the driving forces behind the Hogs' 2011 success, allowing a league-best 45 runs in 18 league games. The Hogs' success and high level of play did not go unnoticed by league rivals as the Hogs had six players selected to represent the Skyline League in the Minnesota Class "A" All-Star Game. Hogs all-star representatives were: pitchers Chad Schnettler and Chris Peterson; infielders John Grindeland, Tory Herman, and Jeff Ostrom; and outfielder Mike Thul.

Continuing St. Anthony's baseball tradition, ninety percent of the Hogs' 2011 roster graduated from St. Anthony Village High School, played Legion Baseball for Tri-City Blue, or currently live in the St. Anthony area. As we eagerly look ahead to 2012, the Hogs continue to search for quality players to fortify their roster. Kaczrowski Helps Win Title



A season full of ups and downs finished on a high note for 2005 SAVHS graduate and current Arizona Diamondbacks Minor Leaguer Dan Kaczrowski. The roller coaster ride for Dan started in Spring Training when

the Diamondbacks Farm Director and Kaczrowski had a meeting where it was explained that the Diamondbacks see Kaczrowski as a back-up utility player after being a starter the last few years. A little disappointed, Kaczrowski knew that if he were to go back to Double A, he would still get a decent amount of at-bats and playing time in the field due to the double switches and pinch

hitting for the pitcher (pitchers begin hitting for themselves in Double A).

Once the Mobile BayBears Double A season started, Kaczrowski did not receive a lot of playing time. When he was playing, luck wasn't on his side. After a few player moves up to Triple A, the opportunities started occurring more frequently and Kaczrowski started capitalizing on the opportunities. Kaczrowski was now the go-to late inning pinch hitter after showing signs of success. He struggled with the pinch hitting early, but after learning a different

approach to his new role from the Mobile hitting coach, Kaczrowski made the necessary adjustments needed to help the team with his one at-bat per game. After accepting his role and continuing to learn how to improve, Kaczrowski

set the all-time record for the most pinch hits in a season in Mobile BayBear history with 13.


Like most players, as the season went on, Kaczrowski's stats fluctuated, but the team kept winning. Eventually, the Mobile BayBears clinched a playoff berth and won the league with Kaczrowski serving as a key role player. In the first round of playoffs, the BayBears defeated the Birmingham Barons (White

the Birmingham Barons (White Sox) in five games with Kaczrowski contributing with some key hits and defensive plays in the deciding fifth game. In the subsequent championship series, the Mobile BayBears met the Tennessee Smokies (Chicago Cubs) for the Southern League title. The BayBears won the series in four games giving them their first Championship since 2004 and Kaczrowski's first championship in any sport. A ring presentation ceremony will be held for the 2011

Championship BayBears during the 2012 Spring Training.
