Letter from the President

I hope that 2012 was a good year for you! The baseball program had a really good year with improvements funded from the Hennepin County Youth Sports Grant Program. This year we received funding to redevelop the baseball /softball field at Wilshire Park Elementary School. The field was relocated from the southeast corner of the school to the northwest corner. The new field has irrigation, fencing, and the playing field is now level! By relocating the baseball / softball field, a full size soccer field was also created at Wilshire Park. Our hope is that the new soccer field might provide some relief for the multi-purpose fields in Central Park.

The varsity baseball team had a good year in 2012 and they are returning eight starters for the 2013 season. The VFW team had a great run at the State Tournament, making the District 7 semifinals before losing to Champlin Park 3-2 and then losing to Totino Grace in the double-elimination game by the same score. In the championship game Champlin Park beat Totino-Grace 2-1.

Season Review

St. Anthony Village High School Baseball

Most casual observers would have thought going into the 2012 baseball season that it would be a rebuilding year for the Huskies. Who could argue with that point of view? The Huskies were coming off back-to-back State Tournament runs and were graduating 16 players off the 17 man roster from 2011. However, the players and coaches had a different view. We strive to reload rather than rebuild. The expectations were the same, play the game the right

way, and come to the ball park believing the team can win. The Huskies started off a daunting schedule with a tough loss against Irondale, but quickly got on the winning track and took home the Black and Blue Trophy from DeLaSalle. The Huskies would sweep the two game series

this year against the Islanders and finish the season with a record of 15 and 7. The Huskies were led by strong pitching and very tough defense this year. Mike Hanker, Jordan Wiggins, and Zach Siggelkow had a combined 1.84 ERA in 2012 and earned All-Conference recognition. Catcher Noah Bluth, shortstop Mike Studer, and centerfielder Nick Kampa were strong up-the-middle and the defense matched the pitching inning for inning. The coaches feel the future

looks bright for the 2013 Huskies who will return eight of nine starters from the 2012 squad. The team will get an opportunity to jump-start the season by taking a spring training trip to the Disney Wide World of Sports complex in late March this spring.

Kaczrowski and BayBears Repeat in Championship

After winning the Double A Southern League Championship in 2011 with the Mobile BayBears, I was excited coming into the Arizona Diamondbacks' Spring Training this past season. Since professional baseball is all about winning, the front office loves seeing one of its affiliates take home the trophy. It gives the organization bright hopes for the future. All of my teammates from the '11 squad and I were handed rings at a ceremony toward the end of Spring Training. It was an honor being recognized in front of the entire organization. There is no doubt I will always remember this past spring, not only for the ring ceremony, but also for the opportunity to play in a Major League Spring Training game against the Giants and be on the roster for another 10 games. I went in late in the game to play second base and had one at-bat with a good swing, flying out to deep left. I learned a lot hanging out in the dugout with some of the big leaguers. Jason Kubel, who was traded to the D-Backs from the Twins last year, was my favorite to talk to. He's a very humble and quiet guy, but extremely nice and full of baseball knowledge.

The regular season started like 2011 did, in good ol' Mobile, Alabama. When people ask me how I like playing there, I tell them I don't. The climate is similar to a sauna, obviously not ideal for baseball. In late April, I got a call up to the AAA squad, the Reno Aces in Reno, Nevada, to fill in at the utility role for a week. Playing one week with the Aces and then going back to Mobile shortly after keeps me working hard because I got a taste of what AAA is like and I want to get back there as soon as I can.

Back in Mobile, I assumed the same role as the past season coming off the bench for key pinch hit at-bats and playing defense anywhere and everywhere the manager says to (even on the pitching mound). I went through a tough stretch early in the season offensively, but came around to finish stronger late in the year. I have always strived to keep my defense consistent, and I am happy with how solid it was this last year. With the number of prospects and talent we had on this 2012 BayBear team, we ended up winning the Southern League Championship again, back-to-back.

Like I've mentioned in previous newsletters, a professional season is full of ups and downs. At times, I feel like there are more downs than ups, but then I remind myself I am playing baseball for a living. Not too shabby coming from a guy coached by Troy Urdahl.

VFW Post #230 Places 3rd in District 7

The VFW Post #230 baseball team, made up of freshmen and sophomores in high school, had a very successful season this past summer. The sophomore-laden team earned a season record of 24 wins and 16 losses. The young men made huge improvements over the course of the season ultimately proving that they could compete with the top schools in the state's VFW program.

Early in the season, Post #230 traveled to Cold Spring to take on very tough competition in the annual Cold Spring VFW Invitational. Post #230 had impressive performances to get wins over top schools Champlin Park and Chaska in order to reach the championship game against Saint Cloud Tech. The Huskies fell short in the final, but took home a rewarding second place trophy in a very competitive tournament.

Post #230 competes in a difficult 7th District VFW League. The young men quickly prepared themselves for a challenging league schedule and fought their way to 12-9 record in the district and a 5-7 record in their division. Their performance in the league placed them in a three game series with VFW baseball powerhouse Maple



Grove. In their best outings of the season, the young men overcame Maple Grove's home field advantage and took the three game series 2-1, which placed them in the 7th District doubleelimination playoff tournament. After strong wins against division foes Totino-Grace and Fridley, Post #230 had a rematch with Champlin Park in the quarterfinal game. Although the team played well and gave themselves opportunities to win, the Huskies could not overcome the Rebel's potent offense. Saint Anthony Post #230 finished their playoff run and capped the 2012 season with an impressive third place finish.

The 2013 season will start in early June. Coaches Troy Urdahl, Ryan Ferkinhoff, and Zak Armstrong were all pleased with the team's performance this past summer. With only a few freshmen returning from last year's third place team, the Huskies hope to have their young players continue to improve their abilities over the offseason in preparation for making another strong run in 2013.

Special thanks are in order to Coach Ferkinhoff and Coach Armstrong for all the time and effort this past season serving as volunteer coaches. Both coaches did a great job and gained valuable coaching experience.

Hogs Update

In 2012, the Hogs returned to the Class A State Tournament for the second time in three years. However, the appearance was short-lived as the Hogs fell to the Bloomington Bandits in single elimination play, 8-2.


The Hogs finished the season with an overall record of 17-15 and third place in the Skyline League at 10-6. Season highlights included a victory over the eventual 2012 state champion (and perennial Class A power) Minnetonka Millers and defeating the Coon Rapids Redbirds for the first time in five meetings.
