


Title goes to Village People

St. Anthony Village High School Baseball

After a successful trip to the Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Florida to begin the 2013 baseball season. the Huskies returned to Minnesota and faced a formidable opponent: the weather. With unusual amounts of April snow, the SAVHS squad had a difficult schedule, playing nearly every day in the month of May. However, the results produced a memorable season, with the team placing second in a very strong Tri-Metro Conference and runner-up in the Section 4AA playoffs. Led by seniors Mike Studer (captain), Ryan Rush (captain), Nick Kampa (captain), Mike Hankner, Leo Skillings, and Billy Johnson, the Huskies went 18-8 last season, outscoring opponents 129-64.

Zach Siggelkow was named the team's MVP and most outstanding pitcher, Nick



Kampa earned Gold Glove honors for his play in the outfield, and Chris Schieffer was recognized as the team's most improved player. The final team award given in 2013 is the Palmer Award, named for long-time St. Anthony teacher and athletic director Gary Palm (who still serves as an

assistant for the Huskies). This award is given to a player who embodies what it means to be a team player and the plays the game the way it is meant to be played. In 2013 Ryan Rush was voted by his peers to receive the honor of being a Palmer Award winner.

letterwinners this spring and hope to have another great season, led by a strong group of seniors including a number of players who plan to continue their baseball careers into college. In 2013, the St. Anthony Hogs made their third Class A State Baseball Tournament appearance since 2010. However, the appearance was again short-lived as the Hogs fell to the Bloomington Bandits in single elimination play for the second consecutive year.

The Hogs played their most competitive schedule to date and enjoyed some ups and downs, finishing with an overall record of 19-12. 2013 was a transitional year for the Hogs after losing four key starters from 2012. An influx of young players allowed the Hogs to continue their consistent level of play. After starting 6-0 in the Skyline League, the Hogs finished 12-4 and secured the #2 seed in the Skyline playoffs, including a first round bye. In the second round, the Hogs took advantage of great pitching, timely hitting, and solid defense to defeat the Stillwater Loggers 11-2 and 10-1 to complete the two game sweep, advancing to the 2013 Class A State Tournament.

The Hogs' success was recognized by Skyline League peers as 3 Hogs were named to the Skyline League All-Star team. Hogs representatives included: infielder, Jeff Ostrom; outfielder, Stephen Couillard; and manager, Michael Dunn. In continuing with St. Anthony's strong baseball tradition, seventy-five percent of the players on the 2013 roster graduated from St. Anthony Village High School, played Legion Baseball for Tri-City Blue, or currently live in the St. Anthony area.



The End of the Roller Coaster Ride by Dan Kaczrowski

In my last four articles I've written for this newsletter, you've probably noticed that I've used the term "roller coaster" a lot due to the many ups and downs of professional baseball. A comparable analogy is that the good players you see on TV seem to be on an enjoyable train ride leaving beautiful Grand Central Station while sometimes throughout my career I felt like I was sitting in the front seat of the Wild Thing at Valleyfair. But don't get me wrong, I am extremely proud of what I accomplished in the passed five seasons. I made it to Triple-A (one step from the big leagues), played in a Major League Spring Training game, won three Minor League championships, and played a full professional season in St. Paul in front of my friends and family - all of which were a crazy dream to a tiny, no-named kid growing up in St. Anthony.

After winning our second straight championship with the Mobile BayBears in 2012, I was determined to come into Spring Training in February in the best shape of my life to prove that I was worthy of a roster spot in the organization. I was unclear of what was going to happen in 2013 so I tried not to think about it and work my tail off. I went through Spring Training with the Arizona Diamondbacks and played extremely well. I made it through all of the major cuts that generally happen on Monday's during camp. When the final rosters were up, I was happy to see that I made the team back in Mobile. I was ecstatic to continue to put on that jersey. I was very close with the manager and coaches of that team, and I know they probably pulled a few strings to keep me there. I didn't care. I was on the team and one of the older guvs with lots of experience at that level. We had a few team practices and media days before opening the season in Jackson, Mississippi, about a

3 hour bus ride from Mobile. Immediately after the game in the visiting clubhouse, I heard first the words that nobody ever wants to hear. Our pitching coach walked over to my locker and said "Kacz, Greenie (Manager Andy Greene) wants to see you in his office." I walked into his office where all three coaches were already in tears and I knew what I was about to hear wasn't going to be good. Long story short, they let me know I had been released because another organization was sending back a player they obtained from the Rule 5 draft earlier in the year and he's taking your spot. It's a confusing part of pro baseball and one that I learned about the hard way.

A crazy dream to a tiny, no-named kid in St. Anthony.

Releasing someone who's given everything they've got and never complained no matter what can't be fun to do. I don't blame them, because I know they wanted to keep me around, but the organization had different plans. So after driving down to AZ from MN, making the team out of camp, driving to Mobile, settling in, then driving to Mississippi for the start of the season, I was told I had a flight leaving early the next morning back to Mobile. I then had to try to get out of my apartment lease which I had just signed the day before, pack my stuff, and drive back to MN. Wild Thing.

Surprisingly, I took the bad news better than I thought I would. If anything, I was just very surprised (and a little angry),

but never sad. While I was on the plane the following morning the manager of the St. Paul Saints, George Tsamis, texted me asking if I wanted to play everyday for them. My contract was signed and faxed in that night. I was excited to come home and play for the team that I grew up watching and began my professional career with. I struggled early on and never really got my numbers up to where I thought they'd be at but I had a good second half of the season. The adjustment back to Independent baseball from affiliated baseball in which I wasn't prepared for were how terrible the bus trips, hotels and pre and post-game food was. We did have a few fun road trips out east into New York and up into Quebec but generally the travel was brutal. Unfortunately, I wasn't having as much fun as I expected to. I was ready to be done for good after the season. I had most of my family and some friends at my last game and they were able to see my last professional hit, a deep homer to left field. Great way to go out.

I couldn't be more proud of the success I had playing the game of baseball, not only at the professional level, but ever since I was a young kid playing travel ball with my friends in St. Anthony and onto the high school and collegiate level. It is something that I'll cherish for the rest of my life. I am very excited to move on with my life and see what the future holds. Although there will be parts of playing that I'll miss, that is far over-shadowed by the fact that I won't be missing anymore weddings, family and friend functions, and most importantly, I'm going to be able to spend my summers catching walleye (or trying to) on Lake Vermilion for the first time in a long time.

Norsemen Update

The Norsemen started the 2013 strong, beating some excellent teams early in May and June. However, a career-ending knee injury to Norse RBI machine Steve Green, and a season-ending hernia for .400 hitting centerfielder Nick Martindale, caused

the Norsemen offense to sputter. Run production was severely hampered for the remainder of the season, with the Norse scraping out just eight victories behind fourteen losses.

On the up side, the squad added veteran catcher Jeff Schmitz (Bloomington, MN) to the roster this season. Schmitz, formerly of the TC Mets, split catching duties with Paul Morita and added some pop to the line-up, including a home run against Rosetown in July. Phil Ebner also joined the Norse pitching roster in 2013, and is ex-

pected to get more innings on the hill next season. The Norsemen ended the season with nice wins over South St. Paul and St. Michael during the playoffs in southern Minnesota on a blistering August weekend.

Expected roster changes for the Norse in 2014 include the addition of Jon Medlo (Arden Hills) at third base. The team is always in need of more pitching. Any potential hurlers can contact Norse Manager, Paul Melchior, at 763.350.9311 to schedule a try-out.



The 2013 Tri City Blue team under the direction of first year coach Todd Nicklaus, started the season 4-0 with wins over Totino Grace, Andover, Centennial and Blaine. The team finished the regular season 6-7, a record that allowed them to enter the substate playoffs as the 6 seed. After a close game with the eventual sub-state playoff champion, Forest Lake, Tric City advanced with a win over Chisago Lakes and then were eliminated by Stillwater. Tri City Blue also competed in two very strong tournaments during the year, playing in the largest Legion tournament in the USA, the Gopher Classic with over 90 teams.

Overall, Tri City Blue had a very good season and competed well against teams that draw from a much larger pool of players. Tri City will have more pitching depth in 2014, which should allow them to build on their success in 2013.
