Father Gregory Boyle, Founder and Executive Director of Homeboy Industries

ACJS President and Alpha Phi Sigma Chapter Advisor, Heather Pfeifer, is excited to share with attendees of the ACJS and APS Annual Meeting an important keynote speaker who embodies the ACJS meeting theme, *Avenues of Change: Integrating Research, Advocacy, and Education.* Please don't miss Gregory Boyle, Founder and Executive Director of Homeboy Industries, the largest gang intervention, rehabilitation, and re-entry program in the world.

A Jesuit priest, from 1986 to 1992 Father Boyle served as pastor of Dolores Mission Church, then the poorest Catholic parish in Los Angeles that also had the highest concentration of gang activity in the city. Father Boyle witnessed the devastating impact of gang violence on his community during the so-called "decade of death" that began in the late 1980s and peaked at 1,000 gang-related killings in 1992.

Father Boyle and parish and community members decided to take a radical approach at the time - treat gang members as human beings – instead of supporting criminal justice policies of suppression and mass incarceration as the means to end gang violence. In 1988 they started what would eventually become Homeboy Industries, which employs and trains former gang members in a range of social enterprises, as well as provides critical services to thousands of men and women who walk through its doors every year seeking a better life.



Chapter Advocacy Grants \$250

There are many organizations that work within or with the Criminal Justice System to help individuals.

When a Chapter engages with an organization in their community that provides a service or services within the Criminal Justice System helping adults or juveniles, Alpha Phi Sigma will donate \$250 to the organization.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Locate an agency in your area that provides a service within the Criminal Justice System: Adult or Juvenile.
- 2. The Chapter must engage in an activity with the agency.
- 3. Send Headquarters a brief write-up about the organization, full name and address of the organization, name of a contact person, and a photograph of Chapter members engaging in an activity with the organization.
- 4. Submit all of the above by email to <u>Headquarters@alphaphisigma.org</u>. Please type <u>ADVOCACY GRANT</u> in the subject line.
- 5. Once the information is approved, the Chapter Advisor will receive from Headquarters an Alpha Phi Sigma check for \$250 payable to the Advocacy Organization.
- 6. Alpha Phi Sigma members must return to the organization and present the check on behalf of Alpha Phi Sigma through their Chapter.
- 7. The original story and photographs of the activity along with the photograph of the funds presentation submitted to Headquarters will be featured in the Docket.
- 9. Only one check per Chapter will be issued per calendar year. Chapters petitioning for a second advocacy grant the following year must choose a different advocacy group from the previous year.

- + The Advocacy Grant <u>cannot</u> be used as the Theme of the Year or a Chapter Goal.

Alpha Phi Sigma Chapter Advisor and members at Lewis University offers Peer Mediation Training at Bolingbrook High School

Bolingbrook High School students and teachers recently received Peer Mediation Training August 10-12 from four Lewis University students enrolled in Mediation I and Mediation II courses taught by Dr. Stephen Sherwin, Alpha Phi Sigma Chapter Advisor and assistant professor of Justice, Law and Public Safety Studies.

Alpha Phi Sigma members, Adriane Distor, Katelynn Dunleavy, and Monica Mihes, along with Batool Jafferi, conducted the training to 15 faculty and 20 students at Bolingbrook High School for eight hours each day over a three-day period.

The in-depth presentations and role-playing training provided the Bolingbrook High School students, faculty, and community an exceptional tool for restorative justice practices within the school and community. The training will continue into the upcoming school year. The Lewis University students plan to make regularlyscheduled assessments for oversight as well.

"Teaching is a special honor," said Sherwin. "It enables opportuni-

ties to share information, knowledge, and guidance that develop skills, confidence, and wisdom for students to take their place on the world stage. However, the most gratifying honor is witnessing students confidently applying what they learned by teaching others. This honor was made manifest in the peer mediation training course conducted by four Lewis University students."

The Mediation class reinforces a variety of techniques, theories, and frameworks for analyzing and resolving conflict. Students will understand the procedure from conflict analysis to exploring techniques. process models, and third-party roles to constructively intervene in conflict.
