Coffee Fellowship – A "Joyful Service" at FCC By Daryle Coleman

First Christian has a cadre of volunteers who graciously supply coffee and treats after church each Sunday. Would you like to be one of them?! For those who love hospitality, it's a pretty simple ministry, but a vital one; because during that $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, connections are made, friendships are cultivated and the church is strengthened.

If you were to volunteer, you would be a part of a team who rotates hosting coffee fellowship by providing snacks, setting them up and then cleaning up. Coffee is taken care of each week by our custodian, Rick Coulter (thank you, Rick!), and the office makes sure there is always ½ and ½, flavored creamer, juice and milk provided in the refrigerator. Coffee fellowship isn't a contest, nor does it need to be a full meal—what refreshments you choose to provide are simply an important way to bring people together in fellowship. And to make sure cost isn't prohibitive, any coffee fellowship items can be reimbursed up to \$40/week—simply turn your receipts into the office, if you like.

Additionally, all silverware and serving tools are provided by the church. So, as host, you get to decide if you would prefer to use disposable items—many of which are compostable and/or recyclable. Or if you prefer to help us in our ministry to care for God's Creation, we have reusable mugs, plates and silverware that are easy to clean up in the dishwasher (we also have extra pairs of hands who can help with this too!).

The host list is posted on the freezer in the kitchen, to help accommodate your schedule. Everyone on the list agrees that they would welcome an extra pair of hands for this ministry. We would love your help and your hospitality. If you are willing to help lead this ministry, please consider volunteering by reaching out to the office and we'll get you all set up!



LIVING LEGACY - Phase 2

Your Finance Committee announced on February 19th, 2023, at the worship service its intention to advocate and emphasize the Living Legacy Program in 2023. It was basically a year to educate our congregation about our Living Legacy Fund and how people can become a Living Legacy Partner through a planned gift to the Canton First Christian Church. Numerous newsletters and other methods of communication were used throughout the year to explain opportunities available. We finalized Phase 1 with Rev. Matt Rosine, President of the National Christian Church Foundation, preaching at our worship service on November 19,2023. He also presented a planned giving seminar during coffee fellowship that day.

Then there was a scheduled hiatus over the busy Advent and Lentin seasons before proceeding with Phase 2 of the Living Legacy Program efforts.

The second phase will be announced in worship on April 7, 2024. We will be working on this phase reminding the congregation about the Living Legacy Program and its purpose throughout this year. Some new information will be provided as well as some of the financial information concerning our current Living Legacy Fund. The goal of this phase is to create a list of congregates who have made a commitment to the Living Legacy Program and have become Partners in the effort. Those supporters will become Chartered Members.

The effort in this phase will be completed in 2024 preparing us to move into Phase 3 in 2025.
