## *From the President Fred Trusty*

From what I can tell, everyone received the August Sidelight on time. In the past the mailing service dropped off the issue in a mailing container along with other mailing order containers. Even though our Sidelight is 1<sup>st</sup> class mail the Post Office considered it bulk because it was dropped off with other bulk mail which means it could sit there for days or even a week before they processed it. This time, Pat Palmer-Ball picked up the Sidelight at USA Printing, drove to the main Post Office on Gardner Lane, and individually inserted all 100 plus Sidelights into the mail slot inside the building. From what the Post Office has told us, any mail that arrives at the main office by 6:00 PM has to be processed before midnight the same day. We will continue this process just to see if it arrives on time.

The NSRA Swap Meet, managed by Kyswap Inc., was a huge success. I think this is the first time it has ever been sold out. As each vendor checked in at the registration table, they were given a NSRA packet, a Kyana Swap Meet flyer and an AACA membership flyer. To make sure they wouldn't forget their space number we cleverly wrote the number on the Kyana flyer. We had vendor after vendor thank us for a job well done. One local vendor was so impressed that he wants to join Kyana and a couple more have asked questions about how to join. Thanks to the 20 plus members that volunteered to work. We couldn't have done it without you.

A few Kyana members have asked why we are involved with the Street Rod Association Swap Meet. If you have ever been to the Street Rod Nationals, you know that in addition to street rods and modified cars there are also a lot of original antique cars there, some being driven around and some in the swap meet area. There was a beautiful all original unmolested low mileage '69 Chevelle SS 396 for sale in the swap meet. No big surprise that it sold on the first day. Also, consider one of the rules for swap meet vendors: no new or reproduction parts are allowed. Street rodders pull all kinds of original parts off their cars so they can replace them with newer technology parts. That means that there are all kinds of original parts for sale that antique owners like us need. And last, but certainly not least, all the different genres of old cars fit under the big umbrella of the old car hobby. Sticking together gives the entire hobby more political muscle. Some of you might not realize it, but there are people in this country that think any vehicle that is older than about 25 years should be taken off the road and crushed. That is happening in some European countries today. Barcelona, Spain passed a law this year that any car built before 1997 and any truck built before 1994 will not be allowed to operate in the city limits. More than 9 European countries and a dozen cities will ban internal combustion engines by 2040.

Does the success of the NSRA swap meet this year mean we will do it again next year? Not necessarily. I think it's a great opportunity to spread the Kyana AACA region name, promote the Kyana Swap meet, and recruit new members but if the majority of the Kyana membership feels we don't belong there then we will politely bow out.

The fall season is always full of old car events. A lot of us will be travelling to Hershey for the AACA swap meet and national show in October. Hershey is something that you need to experience at least once. A square mile of swap meet and car corral, plus over 1200 cars in the AACA show on Saturday. Let's have fun with our cars.

## KYANA at Bowman Field October 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>

**UPDATE:** On both days (Saturday and Sunday) the game plan is to have cars arrive around 9 a.m. There will be a separate entrance for the old cars so that should make things much smoother. We will put together a tentative list of cars that will be there, and to match them up with planes a week or so before the event. The problem is that planes don't really commit until about a week or two before the event, so there's not a true plane count until then.

The event starts at 10 a.m. both days and ends at 5 p.m. Saturday might have a concert at the end of the day (after 5) but that has not been firmed up yet. On Saturday there will be a run around Bowman at 8 a.m. called the 5K on the Runway. Please visit the Bowman Fest website for more information if you are interested in running.

We will do our best to match cars with planes. Any other cars will be set up on a 'car show' area on the runway. We **will** have a tent so please bring chairs in case you need to sit in some shade. There will be entertainment throughout the day. The air show is set for Saturday afternoon and should last about an hour. The cars will not have to be moved for the show.

Cars will participate on October 5th and 6th. Friday, October 4th is mainly for veterans, and they will be taking them on plane flights, etc. that day. Saturday and Sunday will have cars and planes on display. Lots of improvements are being made from last year. Parking will be moved from Taylorsville Road and will now be on Dutchmans Lane (by the DMV), with separate access for older cars which will be displayed. Again, we will be matching cars with planes, and there will be a separate area (probably on or near one of the runways) for other cars to be displayed. Like last year, there will probably be a couple car clubs represented and I will try to get an area reserved for KYANA members. I'm working on the layout details, where the cars can be parked overnight on Saturday.

## Louisville's Urban Electric Tractor

There were a number of different vehicles made by Louisville's Kentucky Wagon Manufacturing Company. They included a variety of electric ones.

In February 1914, they added an electric tractor to their lineup, designed to tow a lumber buggy. Its body had four wheels in a short wheel base that allowed it to turn in a complete tight circle, the turning radius was about 15 feet. Reportedly, it was very easy to maneuver, at very tight corners and even in congested factory environments. The driver enjoyed a leather-back seat, mounted up high to see everything.

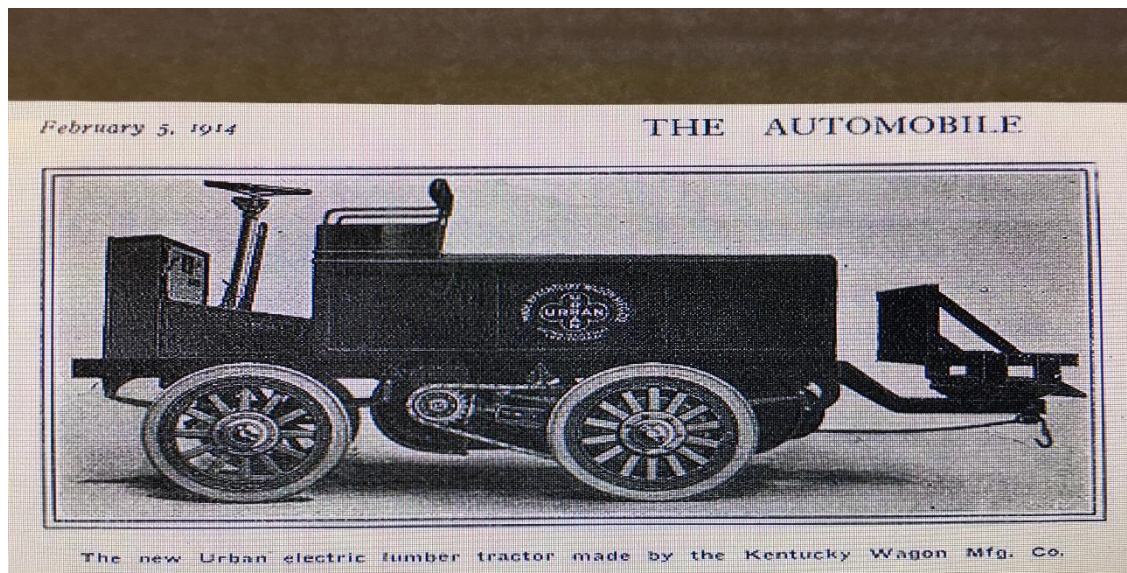
The motor was made by General Electric Company. The 44-cell battery (85 volts /40 amperes) could last a work-shift per recharge. Battery options were either lead or nickel-iron and they were suspended, under the frame, easily accessible. Artillery wheels with solid rubber tires on the rear were powered by roller side-chains. There were semi-elliptic springs and pedal-operated brake. It featured a bell, also foot operated. The continuous torque controller allowed four forward speeds and two in reverse. The cargo carriage was supported on an extension out of the frame with a cast iron swivel, preserving mobility. It weighted about 2.5 tons at a length of 154 inches and width of 71 inches. The wheel base was close to 58 inches. It could pull up to about 6,000 pounds at 9 miles per hour, but empty was said to speed up to 12. By special application it allowed both two-wheel and four-wheel lumber buggies.

Someone I know had grandparents with possession of an Urban Electric tractor. The photo is taken from a publication, THE AUTOMOBILE, of February 5, 1914.

The tractor's relative, the Urban Electric truck also had a General Electric motor, similar to that used in streetcars. The truck had contracting breaks operated by a pedal, while the emergency brake was in was an expanding type, active only on the rear wheels.
