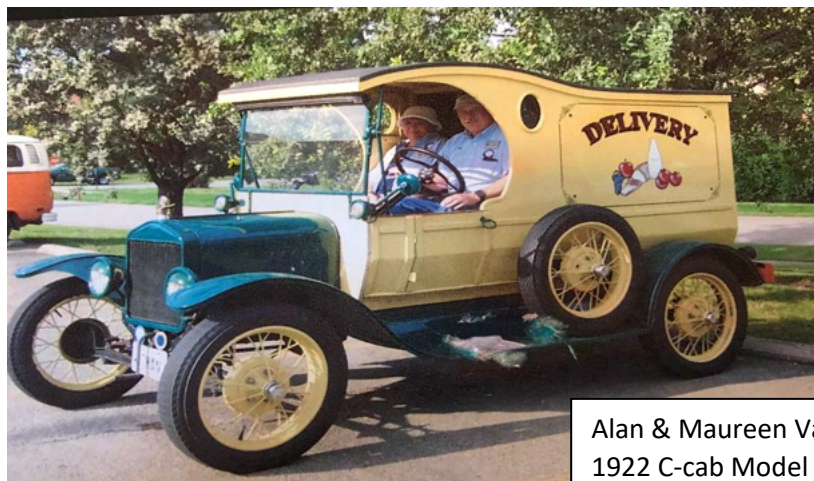

Proposed Bylaw Changes Approved

I. Proposed change in bylaws.

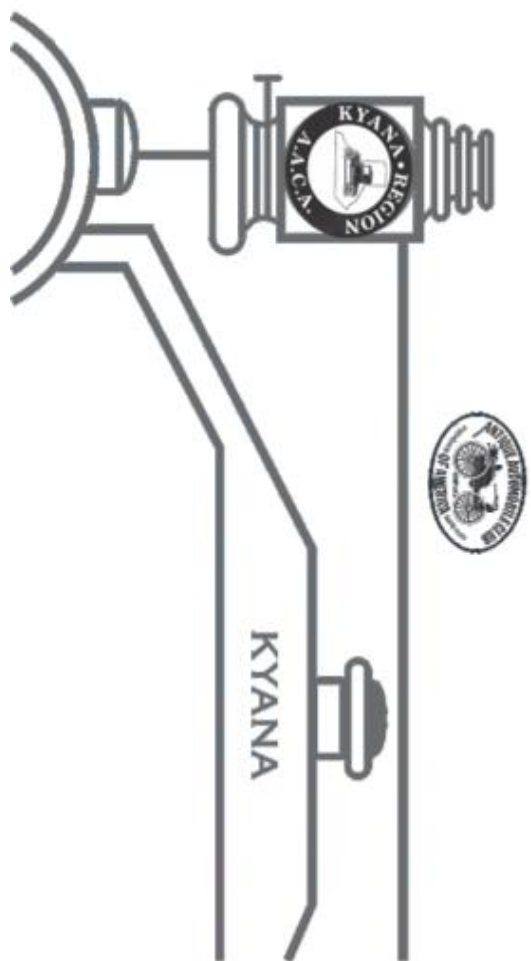
