FROM THE PRESIDENT MARK KUBANCIK



Summer has arrived albeit a bit early if you consider June 21 the official start of summer. As I write this President's Message in mid-June, we are about to experience some record-breaking heat in greater Louisville a week before the official arrival of summer. The car show and cruise-in season is in full swing, typically with several options to choose from on any given weekend. One such example is the Cops for Kids car show at Huber's in Starlight, IN held June 11 where several KYANA members attended and displayed their cars for a great cause. You'll find photos of this show and our members later in this issue of The Sidelight.

A recent constant in the month of July is the annual celebration of Collector Car Appreciation Day (CCAD). Sponsored by SEMA (Specialty Equipment Market Assn.) and its SEMA Action Network (SAN), this year's observance of CCAD is Friday, July 8. The date marks the thirteenth consecutive commemoration of what is now an annual holiday to raise awareness of the vital role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society.

Intended since 2010 to celebrate the classics of the past and the future, the U.S. Congress has helped launch CCAD by introducing resolutions each year at the SAN's request. Last year, the U.S. Senate passed Senate Resolution 292 (S. Res. 292) and a similar resolution was also introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives (H. Res. 491). Each resolution was sponsored by co-chairs of the SEMA-supported Congressional Automotive Performance and Motorsports Caucus. These Congressional leaders have been strong advocates for the automotive hobby in Washington, D.C., and recognize the integral role collector cars have played in fostering our nation's appreciation for the automobile's unique historical place in our history.

Despite Kentucky's vital importance to the automotive industry – think LAP, KTP, Corvette in Bowling Green, Toyota in Georgetown, Ford's forthcoming battery site near E-town – there are no Kentucky Senators and only one Congressman – Andy Barr out of Lexington – on the Congressional Automotive Performance and Motorsports Caucus. Indiana, on the other hand, is well-represented as both its Senators and several Congressmen participate.

Regardless of whether your elected officials are supportive, the idea of CCAD is to drive your collector car on the appointed day. So this Friday, July 8, dust off the old buggy and show it off. At this time, we do not have any KYANA-sponsored events on July 8, nor are there a lot of local shows or cruise-ins appearing on the local Wilder Than Most show tracker. That means Friday July 8 might be a good day for drive-your-old-car-to-work day, or take a drive to a local restaurant for lunch or dinner, or an ice cream treat later in the day. People love to see our old cars out and about so go ahead, show off! You'll get an ego lift and help the hobby in the process. Any KYANA member who sends me a photo of their collector car out and about on July 8 will have their photo published in the August Sidelight with the details of their travels on CCAD. PHOTO WALL TILES

Many of our members and pre-members have asked about having a tile of their car put up on the photo wall at the front of the clubhouse, and we have answered your calls. We are excited to announce that we are restarting this service after several years of inactivity.

If you would like a photo of your car preserved on the front wall of the clubhouse – or perhaps just for display at home – we can have it printed on 8" x 10" ceramic tiles, including a couple of lines of text. It is easiest to start with a digital photo file, but we can also work with an existing print or negative. The prices cover the cost of the printing services, which are subject to change:

- Digital photo file - \$43
- Photo negative - \$48
- Existing print up to 5" x 7"- \$53
- Existing print up to 12" x 18" - \$77

The extra cost associated with starting from a photo negative or existing print is with the scanning service needed to transfer the photo into a digital format. If you are interested in having a photo tile made, please contact Alex Wilkins at 615-430-8027.

On the third weekend of July, the annual Keeneland Concours d'Elegance will again be held on the beautiful grounds of Kentucky's renowned Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, Kentucky. The Concours will be showcasing the finest collector vehicles in the country from antiques to future classics. Automobiles and other unique types of vehicles will be judged for their historical accuracy, presentation, and cleanliness. This 2022 Concours will feature Porsche as the featured marque and will include four classes, Air Cooled, Water Cooled, "356" and Race Car.

In addition to the Concours vehicles, the Car Club Paddock has become an important element of the Concours, as each club proudly displays their cars for spectators to enjoy. Last year's Paddock boasted over 14 different car clubs and approximately 425 vehicles.

THE LANE MOTOR MUSEUM



In 2002, Jeff Lane established Lane Motor Museum. Jeff has been an automotive enthusiast since an early age. He began restoring his first car—a 1955 MG TF—when he was a teen. His personal collection was the donation that began the foundation. Lane Motor Museum unveiled its collection to the public in October of 2003. As director, Jeff Lane continues to search out cars for the collection that are technically significant or uniquely different. The goal of Lane Motor Museum is to share in the mission of collection and preserving automotive history for future generations.

Lane Motor Museum is one of the few museums in the U.S. to specialize in European cars. It is a working museum with the goal of maintaining all vehicles in running order. Some cars are in showroom condition, while others represent typical aging. Efforts are made to restore each vehicle to near-original specifications.

The Museum has been developed in a well-known Nashville landmark, the former Sunbeam Bakery at 702 Murfreesboro Pike. Home to the bread company beginning in 1951, the 132,000 square-foot facility was the largest and most modern bakery in the area at the time of its opening.



The bakery building, outfitted for the museum's needs but left with many of its original characteristics, has a high ceiling, natural light, and hand-crafted brick and maple wood flooring. The architectural style complements the age of the cars represented. The main floor has approximately 40,000 square feet of open space, ideal for displaying the collection.

Lane Motor Museum is excited to offer Vehicle Demonstrations and guided Vault Tours on the **weekends!**

Vault Tours are held on *most* **Saturdays** and **Sundays** at 11:30 am and again at 2:00 pm. Vault tour schedules may change weekly so please check the schedule below to verify that a Vault Tour is scheduled for the specific day you wish to visit. Tours are currently offered on **weekends only**. Only guided tours of the vault area are available so guests are not able to visit the vault unattended.

Although the museum has over 580 cars and motorcycles in our collection, we only have space to display about 150 cars at any given time. This tour is approximately 45 minutes long and gives an opportunity to view many of the other cars in our collection that are stored downstairs. Groups for vault tours will gather inside the museum exhibit area, near the brochure display. Tours will begin promptly at their scheduled time so please arrive about 5 minutes before the start time. Guests are asked to stay inside the yellow lines at all times because there are many slippery spots from oil and grease spills so it is dangerous to walk between the cars. Photography is allowed.

To access the vault from the main exhibit level, you will have to travel down a long, steep flight of stairs. If you are unable to use the stairs, please let a member of the museum staff know and we can help make arrangements to meet you at the back door of the vault. You will have to drive or walk to the back of the building to access this door.



Come join Carol and me as we lead you on an adventure to visit the Lane Motor Museum on Friday, September 16 and Saturday, September 17, 2022. We will be leaving Louisville on Friday afternoon for the short three hour trip down I-65 to Nashville Tennessee.



Enjoy a Dinner show At the Nashville Nightlife Dinner Theatre. Eat a delicious buffet dinner then experience a celebration of Country Music from both past and

present. Hear songs from many of the great artists in country music history along with today's hottest superstars. Enjoy the music of everyone from Hank Williams Sr. and Patsy Cline to the superstars of today like Sara Evans and Toby Keith! Throughout the season we have many guest stars appear at our theater including: (Grand Ole Opry Star) Jeannie Seely, "The Fiddle Man" Tim Watson, "Rising Star" Zach Janson, Diana Murrell, "Nashville's favorite" Brenda Best, Paula Poe Murrell (from the Tammy Wynette show) and many other celebrities.

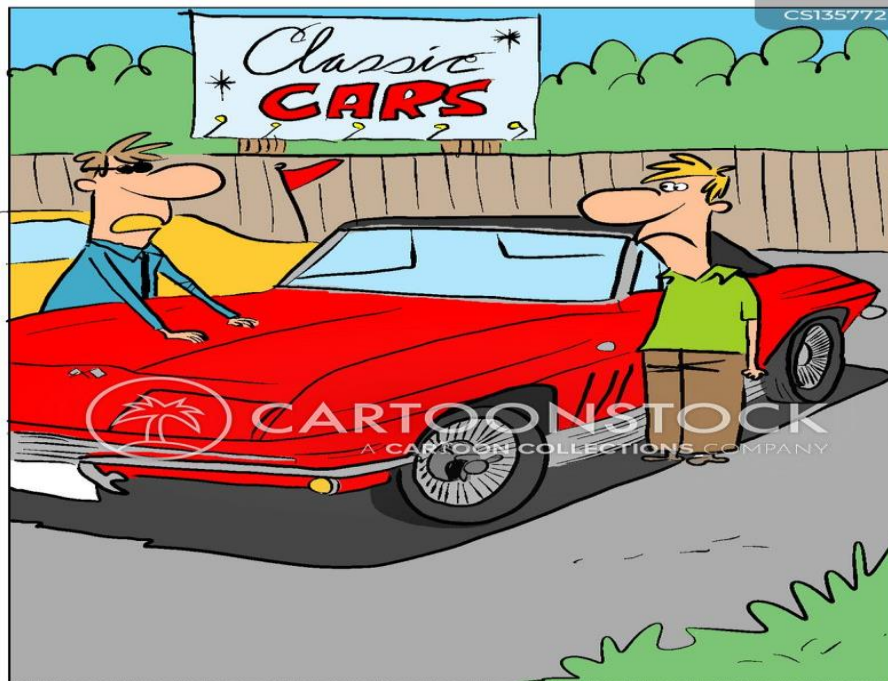


A NOTE TO ALL PRE-MEMBERS
