From the President – Mark Kubancik

Happy New Year! It's mid-December as I draft this January 2023 message and our local weather is predicted to become winter-like almost perfectly timed to the day winter officially begins. Cold weather I can take, lots of snow not so much. Pat and I grew up in northeast Ohio and I shoveled enough snow in those 32 years to last me the rest of my life! Here's hoping for a strong dose of global warming this winter!

With winter setting in it is time to turn our thoughts to our annual swap meet in mid-March. You will read in this month's Sidelight that it is not too early to contact one of our many swap meet chairpersons and add your name to their worker list. The expectation is that all able-bodied KYANA members work at least one 4-hour shift at the swap meet. Work shifts begin on Thursday prior to the official start of the swap meet and continue until the last vendor has "left the building" on Sunday afternoon. This time of year allows us the opportunity to perform some needed maintenance and improvements on our antique vehicles. Some of you may recall that my DeSoto needed a jump at the Norton Commons July 4 parade. Shortly thereafter, I purchased a new battery as the one that failed was somewhere between 5 and 10 years old. After installing the new battery, I noticed my amp gauge was sitting at dead center most times and not showing any charging activity. I suspected something was not right and a local electric shop on Chenoweth Run suggested polarizing the regulator. I did as they instructed but still no charging. They offered to troubleshoot, so I drove to the shop located only a mile from home. Sure enough, the generator is no longer charging. It's a rebuilt unit that has been on my car since at least 1981 when I bought the car. Removing the generator and taking it to the local shop for rehab is on the agenda. The only challenge with this era MoPar is the power steering pump fits to the back of the generator and the pump is driven by the generator. So, some extra care needs to be exercised removing the generator and not spilling power steering fluid over the engine. I contacted a DeSoto club buddy for guidance since this is the first time removing the pump. It's reassuring to belong to a club where your fellow members can guide you through such a process, similar to what belonging to KYANA provides.

The two functions with the most need are for admission sales at entry doors and security monitoring at the remaining entrance and exit doors at the KEC. We again will be seeking volunteers to work both admission sales and door security at the Swap Meet.

Admission sales have a variety of shifts available Friday afternoon, Saturday, and Sunday. Joanna Miller will again be scheduling volunteers for admission sales.
