

Some things won't ever change. In Earn a Bike and Junior Earn a Bike, students learn the basics of bike mechanics and safety, while spending time with adult mentors. And as always, it's the connections with each individual student that make the impact.

"I've learned how to change a tire, how to do almost everything on a bike, and I didn't think I would ever learn that," said East Allentown student Wajiha, 12. "I've also learned how to stay safe. The people who work here are so, so nice. They teach you to be good in school, and why. I love Community Bike Works."

This report covers 2016-17 and 2017-18, the two program years in which we've been in East Allentown. We are grateful to all of our volunteers and supporters who make bike mentoring a reality, and we look forward to continuing to grow with you.

Community Bike Works youth programs:

Earn a Bike

Students ages 9 and older are paired with adult mentors to learn the basics of bike safety and mechanics, while also practicing life skills including teamwork and perseverance. After 24 hours of instruction, students earn their refurbished bike and a new helmet!

Junior Earn a Bike

Junior Earn a Bike allows younger students to experience the benefits of bikes. For 2018-19, we have rewritten JrEAB to have a social and emotional learning (SEL) foundation, to help students improve social and emotional skills. Just as building a bike requires tools and parts, building a healthy emotional life requires social and emotional tools!

Earn a Bike and JrEAB are offered at Madison Street, in East Allentown, and in United Way community schools in Allentown and Bethlehem.

Earn a Book

Students and tutors read novels together, work on homework, and play brain games. At the end of the semester, students visit a local bookstore to choose books of their own.

Drop-in

Each weekday, students attend Drop-in at Madison Street and in East Allentown to participate in bike work, healthy living, and STEAM activities. Students have a fresh fruit snack each day, and healthy plantbased lunches when school's out. A focus of Drop-in is building relationships with mentors, including Muhlenberg College students.

Special Projects

We regularly offer special projects to engage students in new ways. Recent projects have included Girls' Club, to support our girl teens, and Poetry Club, in which students published their own book of poems!

Youth Leadership

Teens participate in semester-long leadership sessions: summer book club, a fall session on college and careers, and a spring session on citizenship and community engagement.

Youth Volunteer | Youth Apprentice

Students 12 and older have the opportunity to volunteer as peer mentors. Students 14 and older can apply to be paid youth apprentices.

Scholarship | Student Support | Emergency Fund for Families

We offer a scholarship to students pursuing post-secondary education, to ensure they are not discouraged from their studies because of a small shortfall of funds. We also provide modest support for students interested in pursuing cycling or whose families need emergency funds.

Cycling

Riders at any level can participate in our recreational rides on Lehigh Valley trails. Teens can develop healthy living and other life skills in track, mountain, and road riding programs.



In July 2016, Community Bike Works opened our second bike shop, in East Allentown. In addition to Earn a Bike, Junior Earn a Bike, and afterschool and summer Drop-in, special East Allentown projects include:

Mountain bike trail. With support from the City of Allentown and Valley Mountain Bikers, East Allentown students and staff created a mountain bike trail through Keck Park that can be enjoyed by all!

Girls' Night Earn a Bike. Following a trip to the Youth Bike Summit, lead mechanic Hana Cannon instituted Girls' Night Earn a Bike class, with all women instructors, to help young women thrive as mechanics.

Da Vinci Science Center Inventors' Lab. East Allentown students have the opportunity to participate in Da Vinci's popular Inventors' Lab right at Bike Works!

Student Garden. With start-up support from UGI, students maintain a garden that provides fresh vegetables for snacks.

Cycling helps students develop life-long healthy living habits, while offering time with adult mentors. Plus, it's fun! Over the past two years, we have expanded the cycling opportunities available to students of all ages and skill levels. In the words of new cyclist Nasheera, 15: **"Riding makes me feel free, like I can do anything."**

Recreational Rides. On Saturdays and weekday afternoons during the spring, summer, and fall, students of all ages and adults take to the Lehigh Valley trails, from Ironton Rail Trail to Jacobsburg Trail.

Road Riding. Teens challenge themselves to complete weekly long-distance road rides of 20 miles or more, thanks to a partnership that began in 2017 with the Lehigh Wheelmen Association and Cohen, Feeley, Altemose & Rambo.

Track Cycling. In the fall and spring semesters, students train on indoor bikes through the Lehigh Valley Health Network's Gear Up program. Then in the summer, students can train at the Velodrome. Luis, 16, was invited to train with Sprinter's Edge track cycling team and was able to ride in the 2018 Junior Track National Championships!

Mountain Biking. Students worked with Valley Mountain Bikers to build their own mountain bike trail in Keck Park. Now, we'll join with the Lehigh Valley Composite MTB Team to allow our mountain bikers to compete statewide!

Youth Leadership

Each semester, students 12 and older are invited to join a youth leadership seminar, to tackle a topic in-depth while learning with peer and adult mentors. While each session is unique, we follow broad topics: fall is for themes related to college & careers, spring is citizenship and community engagement, and the summer is a book club.

"Youth Leadership opened my eyes up. I never really thought about these things before," said East Allentown student Erin, 14, following a semester on sustainability. Highlights from the past two years include:

Spring 2017. Students partnered with Allentown's Episcopal Church of the Mediator's Refugee Community Center to learn about and support refugee and immigrant families living in Allentown.

Fall 2017. Students explored college options with trips ranging from LCCC to West Chester University.

Spring 2018. Students participated in hands-on research to measure our environmental footprint and make recommendations for a CBW sustainability plan.

Summer 2018. Students read the novel Same Sun Here, which explores themes of environmental justice, and attended the Youth Climate March in New York City.

Youth Bike Summit

In October 2017, nine teens and seven staff headed to Washington, DC, for our first multi-day trip, to the Youth Bike Summit!


Over three days, students attended workshops from starting their own bike businesses to bikes and the criminal justice system. Mobile workshops on bikes allowed students to learn about steps Arlington has taken to make cyclists safer and their community more environmentally friendly.

"It felt so good to see people with a passion similar to mine," youth leader Eilie, 14, said. "I learned that the decriminalization of youth on bikes can help with social and career opportunities."

Junior Earn a Bike. After four years of bringing reading, riding, and wrenching to our youngest students, Junior Earn a Bike got a makeover this year, to include a foundation of social and emotional learning for students. "Without hesitation, I can affirm that this program is one of the best we have to offer our students," program partner Kristina Schwarz said. "In just 12 weeks, for two hours each week, Junior Earn a Bike has returned some of the best results I've seen in terms of improved academic, attendance, and behavior outcomes."

Earn a Book. In recent semesters, tutors from **Cedar Crest College** have read novels aloud to students including *Charlotte's Web and Number the Stars.* There's then time for homework help and brain games. A highlight of each semester is heading to Let's Play Books in Emmaus, where students choose books of their own for their home libraries.

Student Support. More than a dozen students have benefitted from direct support through our emergency fund for families. And thanks to Fox & Roach Charities, students headed back to school with a new backpack and supplies!

Connecting with partners

Connecting with organizations who share our passion for education, outdoor adventure, and alternative transportation allows us to offer meaningful experiences to youth.

Lehigh Valley Greenways/Color of Nature. Thanks to support from a Lehigh Valley Greenways grant, our students connected with Lehigh Gap Nature Center's Color of Nature program, which prepares students of color for careers in outdoor education. Color of Nature led three conservationfocused bike rides for Bike Works students and helped lead a trail work day.

Lehigh Valley Planning Commission/Lehigh Valley Transportation Study. LVPC/LVTS is a major funder of our bike safety and education work, and we are grateful for opportunities to partner. In 2018, Youth Leaders began participating in LVPC's forthcoming Walk/RollLV plan.

Strengthening our team

As Community Bike Works continues to serve more students, more deeply, we have taken several steps to develop our culture of nonprofit effectiveness.

Cultural Competency Training. Community Bike Works board and staff participated in 12 hours of cultural competency training with Faces International, thanks to support from the United Way of the Greater Lehigh Valley. We are now developing an organizational equity plan.

Sustainability. Winning the Lehigh Valley Community Foundation's Spark grant for environmental sustainability provided us with resources to develop a sustainability plan. We'll address bike and food waste, continue to focus on healthy, plant-based meals—and, of course, keep riding!

In 2017, Community Bike Works won **Colonial Association** of **Reading Educators' Celebrate Literacy Award**. Kim Schaffer received **RCDC's Urban Angel Award**.

Youth volunteers who turn 14 are eligible to apply for a paid position as youth apprentices. Eric is one of three students currently on staff.



Statement on Finances

Community Bike Works is a growing organization in good financial health. For the first time in 2017-18, our income exceeded \$500,000. This increasing budget allows us to support more students in more programs. As a high-quality mentoring organization, our highest budget cost is program salaries. In 2016-17, we fully staffed our East Allentown operations. 2017-18, we added a position, Cycling Specialist, to help us better connect students to riding opportunities.

Like many nonprofits, our income varies from year to year. In 2015-16, we recorded a surplus of \$50,000 as we planned to expand to East Allentown. In 2016-17, we recorded a deficit of \$100,000 as we began our first year in East Allentown. In 2017-18, we recorded a surplus of \$14,000 as we begin to replenish our reserves.
