The Metropolitan Baltimore Alliance of Black School Educators (MBABSE) an affiliate of the National Alliance of Black School Educators (NABSE) is an organization of Educators of African descent in the Metropolitan Baltimore area that promotes and facilitates the education of all students, black students in particular.

The organization is formed to:

- 1. Establish a coalition of black educators and others directly or indirectly involved in the education process.
- 2. Create a forum for the exchange of ideas and strategies to improve education opportunities for blacks.
- 3. Identify and develop black professionals who will assume leadership positions in education.
- 4. Influence public policy concerning the education of black people.

One of the programs of MBABSE is the establishment and administration of the **Dr. Rebecca Carroll Scholarship Program** for two students who plan to enter the field of education as a career. Our local alliance awards two (2) scholarships each year to graduating seniors from Baltimore City High Schools who have applied for and have been accepted by an accredited Institution of Higher Education as an Education major. The scholarships are awarded to male and female students based on their academic records and the satisfactory completion of the application process. The scholarship is for one year of continuous studies.

The application process will include a review of an official report of your academic record from your school which contains a report of your 11th and first semester of your 12th grade, participation in extra-curricular activities including community service and two letters of recommendation. You must also include your college entrance test scores (SAT, PSAT, or ACT). You must also include a 250 word essay explaining why you want to major in education. Applications are to be submitted at the end of the third quarter marking period for the 12th grade, but no later than April 13th of this year. Awards will be announced by May 5th of this year or as required by the school system so that names of awardees may be printed in Commencement Programs. Currently, the value of the Scholarship will b \$1,000.00 each (\$500.00 for the first semester, and \$500.00 for the second semester upon proof of matriculation).
