


Sermon Series: Steadfast Love

The Season of Lent

Lent, the 40-day season leading up to Easter, is a sacred time in the Christian calendar dedicated to reflection, repentance, and renewal. Traditionally, many Christians observe Lent through fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. While giving something up, such as sweets or social media, is a common Lenten practice, another powerful way to engage with this season is by taking on a new spiritual discipline.

Embracing a new discipline during Lent can deepen one's faith and relationship with God. This might include committing to daily Scripture reading, setting aside extra time for prayer, or engaging in acts of service. One particularly enriching practice is Lectio Divina, a meditative way of reading Scripture that allows God's Word to speak personally to the heart. Others might choose to keep a gratitude journal, intentionally recognizing God's blessings each day.

Another meaningful discipline is practicing silence and solitude. In today's fast-paced world, moments of stillness can be rare, yet they provide a sacred space to listen for God's voice. Setting aside time each day to be still before God fosters spiritual awareness and inner peace.

Service and acts of kindness are also powerful Lenten disciplines. Volunteering, reaching out to someone in need, or making a commitment to speak words of encouragement can be transformative, not just for others but for one's own spiritual growth.

Lent is an opportunity for renewal, and taking on a new spiritual discipline can make the journey even more meaningful. By drawing closer to God through prayer, Scripture, service, or stillness, believers prepare their hearts to fully embrace the joy of Easter. What new practice might God be calling you to this Lent?

Intentional Faith Development

Growing Young

Seminary Church is pleased to partner with the Fuller Youth Institute's (FYI) Growing Young project, which is a research-based initiative to help churches engage and retain young people. On February 10th & 11th Pastor Ashley attended the first Summit and gained insight into how Seminary can strengthen our relationships with young people in our church and community.

Here are 6 core commitments we can make to help young people discover and love our church.

Unlock keychain leadership: Instead of centralizing authority, empower others—especially young people.

Empathize with today's young people: Instead of judging or criticizing, step into the shoes of this generation.

Take Jesus' message seriously: Instead of asserting formulaic gospel claims, welcome young people into a Jesus-centered way of life.

Fuel a warm community: Instead of focusing on cool worship or programs, aim for warm peer and intergenerational friendships.

Prioritize young people (and families) everywhere: Instead of giving lip service to how much young people matter, look for creative ways to tangibly support, resource, and involve them in all facets of your congregation.

Be the best neighbors: Instead of condemning the world outside your walls, enable young people to neighbor well locally and globally.



Our team will work together to identify ways we can live out these commitments and strengthen our relationships. If you would like to read the book, Growing Young, which explains the research and strategies we will utilize in our work, you may pick one up in the church office.

You will also be asked to participate in a survey in the future, so keep an eye out for that in a couple of months.


Roanoke Food Pantry
