Hello Church!

I want to share some exciting news with you!

Starting on Sunday, July 31, we will be starting an 8:15 AM Traditional service in addition to the regularly scheduled Modern service at 10:00 AM.

This five-week experiment of a second service will provide additional options to longtime members, as well as provide a new way for attenders in our community to connect to Seminary.

Pastor Heather and Pastor Chris began a prayer group that has been meeting for over 15 weeks at the church on Wednesday at 2pm, praying for God to show us how to connect our church to our community. The idea for a second service resulted from this time of prayer.

While we are unsure if the second service is here to stay, we are confident God will guide our entire church during this 5-week experiment, allowing us to move forward more confidently towards our future. After the 5-week experiment is over, the Leadership Council will evaluate the results of our experiment, deciding what our church should do in the future.

A Message from Our Leadership Council

The Leadership Council met on Monday, July 25th at their regular meeting time of the 4th Monday of the month at 6:30 p.m. After opening the meeting in prayer and a few icebreakers, the business of the church was discussed. The Council voted to extend the Worship Leader role for Chelsea Dourson for an additional six months, recognizing the enriching contribution she has provided to our worship services.

Pastor Chris read a letter to the Council from Jon Perkins where Jon praised Seminary Church for how special it is and indicated he and Sara have felt led by God to make some changes in their worship lives so he resigned from his role as Leadership Council Chair. Jon stated he and Sara will still support Seminary and value the friendships they have made over the past six years.

The Council approved the quarterly bonuses for the childcare staff. Tom Gross reported on behalf of the Vision Committee about the upcoming events, starting with the “stuffing party” on August 14th between the two Sunday morning services. The Saturate USA bags will be stuffed during that time. Seminary will again be hosting a “Kids Zone” at the Farmers Market on August 26th. This includes opportunities for kids to play with sidewalk chalk, bubbles, and coloring. Tom continued with upcoming events especially focusing on the Fall Festival. On September 7th a church service will be held at the park, coordinated by Seminary and with participation of a few local churches.

The Huntington North Varsity Singers will be performing again also. Seminary will be providing free snow cones, will have a “Kids Zone” and is working on coordinating a sporting event for that evening too. Tom and Jenny Gross will once again coordinate the float building for the Fall Festival parade on September 10th. The Council discussed Seminary continuing to host Family Nights at the church and will start those on the first Friday of each month starting October 7th. Unfortunately the JAM (Jesus and Me) weekly children’s program will not be held this year primarily due to transportation issues. Discussion was held on the upcoming two services trial period and how to evaluate its success.

Pastor Chris challenged us to start thinking about how we see Seminary Church in five years. The next Leadership Council meeting is scheduled for August 22, 2022. Anyone can attend these meetings unless we have special SPRC (Staff Parish Relations Committee) meetings within the Council meetings since those are confidential discussions related to the personnel of the church. Only Leadership Council members can vote. Contact Pastor Chris if you have interest in serving on the Council or in any volunteer leadership roles.



Hello August,




