From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Church.

As you stroll through the local stores, you'll see an abundance of bunnies, baskets, and candy for sale, and those may be the only signs of Easter you'll find outside of church. Unlike its Christmas counterpart, Easter is mostly uncommercialized, which is pretty remarkable: the day that we celebrate the glory of Christ's resurrection remains untainted by retailers.

However, just because we're not receiving Easter ad upon Easter ad in our newspapers and inboxes doesn't mean we should pigeonhole the holiday as a minor celebration. Easter is perhaps the most crucial holiday on the Christian calendar—even the word crucial has its roots in Christianity, stemming from the term for crucify.

And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on him. Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the Good News of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the Good News."—Mark 1:12-15 The season we call Lent, the forty days before Easter, represents the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness, continually tempted by Satan.

When He emerged from the wilderness, He knew it was time for the prophesy of His death and resurrection to be fulfilled.

As believers, we remember this. We look to this time of Lent as a way to go into our own 'wilderness' of sorts; we pray, we fast, we meditate, we worship, we focus on God. We ready ourselves for the grief of Christ's death, and we take joy in the gospel of His rising again. We are granted eternal life through Christ; the Messiah lifted up.

I invite you to join us as we take a closer look at the life of Christ these next few weeks as we recall what this season is all about. Blessings in Christ,

2021 Food Pantry/ Inter-Church Council News

The Roanoke Food Pantry housed at Seminary is a joint effort. We assist local residents in time of need.

In 2021 monetary donations were received from Carolyn Hartley - Johns, Pastor Keith & Kay Schreffler, Pleasant Chapel Church-Roanoke, Roanoke Lion's Club, St Joseph Catholic Church-Roanoke, and Women of Faith-Seminary Church- Roanoke.

We also have an anonymous donor from the Roanoke Community who donated quarterly, and has done so for several years.

Large food donations in 2021 were received from the American Legion Post 160-Roanoke, Faith Lutheran Day Care- Roanoke, Roanoke Elementary School Food Drive, and from numerous individuals in the community.

In October, members of the council distributed food to 75 families living in the 2 mobile home parks in Roanoke.

At Thanksgiving, 5 whole turkeys were donated by a local family and distributed to needy families. At Christmas, 4 ham dinners were given to needy families. What a blessing this was to these families who otherwise would not have celebrated the holidays.

A family of 9 was adopted at Christmas and gifted food and gifts. We would like to continue with minifood collections at each of the churches during the current year:

Jan-Mar - personal care items: (example = toothpaste, hand soap)
April-June - condiments: (example = salad dressing, mustard, catsup)
July-Sept - cleaning supplies: (example = laundry detergent, dish soap)
Oct-Dec: cereal, baking supplies

The council members would like to thank all who support our efforts to help those in need in the Roanoke Community.

I am excited to announce the Leadership Council made the decision to hire Chelsea Dourson in the parttime position of Worship Leader! Due to this role being new for Seminary, the initial commitment period is for six months and the church is able to afford this financially. As part of her responsibilities she will coordinate a variety of musicians to join our worship services. We are enjoying her incredible talent and the introduction of a variety of music styles. I've already received positive feedback from congregation members! Please pray for our church and for Chelsea in this growth opportunity.
