

A "Town Hall" meeting was held Wednesday May 12 @7pm in the Seminary Church Sanctuary to discuss the possible property sale of the current parsonage and the possible purchase of the church's adjacent property currently owned by Dr Jean Ann Tribolet. Discussion was lead by Advisory Chair Jon Perkins accompanied by members Lynn Swaidner and Steve Eisenhut. Much research and detail was completed by the committee following a District checklist.
