



Getting to know Russ Papy By Pat Smith

Russ is a new member of our community from the Conch Republic. Yes, he is a 7th generation Floridian and a 5th generation inhabitant of Key West, who is now settled in Deerfield Beach and boy does he have some stories to tell.

To go back to the beginning, Russ's family history in the America's starts when his Turkish ancestor, Gaspard Papy, sailed from Menorca to St Augustine in the late 1700's. One of his many offspring decided to make the boat trip down to the Eastern tip of North America, landing in Key West. The Papys have been there ever since. Russ's father was born there in 1898, the second of 13 children, and according to Russ he was a scallywag. He trained as a Master Cigar Maker before Prohibition hit in 1920's, and then his father and some fisherman pals saw the opportunity for smuggling in Rum from the Bahamas. Prohibition was good to daddy Papy, and he went on to open, first the Cabana bar on Duval Street, then later a 3-story establishment right opposite the police station called Whitney's Place. Lou Gerig was seen buying 3 nightly beers, while on the 3rd floor, Charlie, and Oona Chaplin and frequently Ernest Hemingway, arrived at a hush-hush casino to gamble. Ernest, who Russ met, was not a good gambler apparently but Russ's dad would often float him since he was good for business.

Russ was born in Key West in 1945, the second of 5 children, and he was good at sports. By the time he had finished high school he was offered a football scholarship. He was a few days away from signing when he heard about 2 of his dearest friends who had just been killed in Vietnam, and that decided him to enlist instead. He joined the Air Force as a photographic specialist and served 2 tours in 1967 and 1968. He was stationed at a lonely base near Pleiku, close to the front line and Ho Chi Min's birthplace which made it a target. Pleiku was a support base for Australian, U.S. and Korean forces, including a hospital triaging the wounded being unloaded from incoming helicopters and planes providing air support. When the weather was good, Russ's job was to fly out and take aerial intelligence photos of trails and truck paths, monitoring activity in areas of interest. At intervals, he would be flown to Saigon with a briefcase handcuffed to his wrist which he would deliver to the intelligence officials and answer their questions, then be allowed a few days R & R in the city. In 1968, just before the end of his rotation, he was told to go home and see his mother who had had a massive heart attack. He was flown to the Philippines, then Hawaii, then L.A. and then told the rest was up to him. Luckily, he met up with a Navy guy looking to get to Key West for a posting, and they found John Wayne Airport and hitched a Military flight to Miami. Sadly, his mother had passed, and he was only in time for her funeral. Shortly after, he was discharged from Shaw Airfield Base in South Carolina and went home to Key West.

Sad to say his homecoming was not what he might have expected. At that time Vietnam vets were not welcomed but rather insulted, and Russ was having a hard time finding a job. Luckily, his old Little League Baseball Coach was now Deputy Chief of Police in Key West, and he offered Russ a job as a policeman. Russ's first response was that he no longer wanted to wear a uniform and carry a gun, but he needed a job. After working as a cop for a year, he realized that he liked it and that you could do some good in law enforcement, but he felt he needed more education in Criminal Justice.

So, he left Key West and used the GI Bill to attend Florida State in Tallahassee; and in 1972 got his degree. His next job was working again as a police officer in Delray Beach, from where he could carry on studying at FAU for a degree in Public Administration. His goal was to become a Federal Officer, working for DEA, FBI, U.S. Customs or Treasury, and he was recruited, with top secret clearance from Vietnam. But he had recently married his wife Linda in 1972 and started a family and he was told that the Federal postings would be to some terrible spots, and involve moving frequently, so he decided to stay within Florida State with some family stability. He was to stay in Florida policing for 30 years.

In 1973, Billy Freeman, Sheriff of Monroe County, called Russ in Delray and invited him to come home to the Keys and once again work as a Sheriff's deputy in C.I.D. During his time in this position, he was approached by someone in his men's softball league and asked to come and work in the Florida State Attorney's office for the 16th Judicial Circuit. He worked as a Florida State officer for 16 years, dealing with cases from the Keys, Everglades, and lower Miami that sound like Miami Vice TV scripts. While the Keys were great for fishing, diving, local theatre and family interactions, there was a whole lot more going on in those 300 miles of coastline, and when you run a multi disciplined drug unit, and handle high profile serious cases in Tallahassee, you feel like you are always watching your back. So, when he finally retired in 1997, Russ and Linda found a hideout south of Branson in Yellville, Arkansas for 2 years, to let the heat die out. Russ lived at the top of a mountain with a long gravel drive that he guarded with a .38 and a shotgun if he heard unexpected visitors.

Russ next settled in Okeechobee where he found lots of Vets with whom he felt comfortable, and for the next 20 years he worked hard with the local VFW as Commander to build an All-State Post, 600 strong. They won many awards in the community for helping Vets, supporting the troops, creating scholarships, and rescuing community members in trouble. He loved the camaraderie and working with the group, but eventually he and Linda decided at 70 they needed some time for themselves. So, they bought an RV and toured the U.S., visiting daughters and their families in Portland, Oregon, Alberta, Canada, and Boca in Florida, as well as a son in Washington. But it was during this time that Russ noticed Linda was having trouble walking and talking, and this started a long trail of testing in California and the Mayo clinic.

So, they bought a big house in Punta Gorda, near doctors, and expecting visits from his 4 children, 10 grandchildren and 1 great grandchild. Then COVID hit and the diagnosis of Parkinsons was made for Linda. For 4 years, Russ was her sole caretaker as her condition deteriorated. Finally, his daughter



Nicole in Boca convinced them to move near her in the Meadows; but one month after they arrived, Linda sadly passed. Russ has had a very hard time dealing with this loss of his wife of 51 years. As he said, he "crashed and burned"; but both daughters are urging him to get out and take part in life again and let's hope the Meadows folk can help with that.

Russ's life has shown him many of the evils in society, and he has spent many years fighting those in various ways. He is a remarkable man to have in our community, whether it is telling us about the background on the "Bubba Busts", sharing his acquired wisdom, reminding us of what we owe to veterans, or just joining a park foursome on the greens. When you run into him, be sure to get him telling some of those stories.




