President's Perspective

Hello Friends and Neighbors,

Whenever I start to write the President's Perspective, I ask myself if anyone reads or cares about what I have to say. This month's perspective is a bit reflective after being out with knee replacement surgery and some of the perspective is clearly aimed at the future.

To begin I want to thank MaryAnne, Terry, and our maintenance staff for continuing to do the heavy lifting while the world around the Meadows continues to spin faster and faster. Each of them continues to step up and do that something extra that make each of our residents feel special.

Another group I need to thank for stepping up when needed is your Board of Directors. As a group of seven each has met the challenge when called on during my absence. Paul Davies moved seamlessly from Vice President to acting President and the rest of the board each responded when called. Maybe I've had too much time to watch "breaking news", but how can there be any place where people can relax by a pool, play bingo, or simply ride around the streets on bicycles in the evening. Oh yeah at the Meadows. It is because these people, the staff and the Board of Directors, work hard everyday to make the Meadows the Meadows.

I have said all of that, so I can say this. Several months ago, I asked everyone to let Jimmy Giasullo Sr. rest in peace. Yet today, I bring his name up again. He was a Treasure. Whether you liked him or not, he was, in my opinion the heart and soul of our community. In addition, he was like a force of nature. Things around here worked because he made sure they worked. I am not here to argue how he got it done, the fact is, he got it done. He dedicated up to 50 hours a week for 22 years to make the Meadows of Crystal Lake the place we choose to live.

Remember, at the beginning I said I would talk about the future. The Meadows needs a manager or a management company. Like it or not that is the function that Jimmy G. provided for the Meadows. He wasn't given the title or paid the salary, but he got the job done. Because he did the heavy lifting, the other board members could sit back take credit when things went well and blame Jimmy when things went sideways. The board was happy, the residents were happy (didn't have to pay for Jimmy's management services) and life was good at the Meadows.

Right now, we have seven hard working board members, each with their own ideas on how to solve each and every problem facing the Meadows. Without bringing up each individual problem, the problem-solving process generally follows this series of events. Problem is identified. Board member volunteers to investigate. The investigation involves vendors that sometimes show larger problems than expected. Then communication between board members is by e-mail or text or phone call because if we meet in person the Sunshine Law gets involved. After reading the initial results from the investigation, a few board members ask questions, suggest other vendors, or question the accuracy of the information provided by the initial board member that volunteered. If a solution is agreed on then the original volunteer is usually asked to go and get three bids for the job. The process takes forever. We have an issue that started in October of 2020 and still has not come to a vote. With our once-a-month meeting and seven directors each "knowing the best way" to do something, we push items off until the next month.

Those are just the issues that keep the amenities working. Now, add in the constant battle with residents over Architectural Change Requests and residents not following the Blue Book guidelines. The new way of doing things in the Meadows seems to be, **just do what you want and see if you get caught.**

When looking into a manager, we can take small steps. A part time professional equipped to get our repairs moving smoothly would be a start. If not, we will continue to spin our wheels going no where. Big things need to be done and no one is stepping forward to volunteer to spend 50 hours of their time weekly to get it done. Meadow's residents, you were spoiled by Jimmy Giasullo Sr. I also know that talking about a Manager or Management Company is the Third Rail of Board membership here in the Meadows, but someone had to say it.

Q. Why is the office asking for my driver's license. I am Not comfortable giving out my information.

A. This is the same information you gave the office at the time of purchase. This is just an update of the Identification we have on file. Fair Housing Act (HUD) qualifies and verifies our population in order for us to keep our over 55 Exemption. We must provide HUD that at least one (1) person living fulltime in the home is 55 or older. Please stop by the office and we will copy your driver's license or you may send a copy by mail or email. (themeadows2300@gmail.com)

Q. My neighbor has a Pitbull dog. Very scary how do I keep him away from me and my yard?

A. Pitbull owners know they have a dog that is considered Dangerous. The owner should NOT approach anyone without asking permission. Pitbull's are not specifically banned in Broward County, but according to [section 4-2 of Broward County, Florida, Code of Ordinances](#) ownership of any "dangerous dog" carries with it specific responsibilities under the law. The dog must Always be on a leash. Always under owner's control. Plus, many more and in our community any dog must be registered as an **Emotional Support Animal**.

Q. I see my neighbors are putting out their blue trash containers on Friday again. Are we recycling again in Deerfield Beach?

A. NO. Although your blue containers will be picked up on Friday if out by the road, all the trash goes in one truck. There is NO need to separate items for trash at this time. Everything goes in the Brown container now. **Reminder: DO NOT** put your trash cans next to your mail box. Both the city and the mail person can not do their job when they are too close!!!

Q. When will the lights at the Shuffle Board area be working again?

A. New LED lights have been ordered and will be installed as soon as they arrive. As well as a new Timer switch located for easy access. It should also be known that the Bocci Court lights, fans, and courts are slated for updating in the near future. Also, the POOL HALL lights are operational and new covers have been ordered. Lastly new griper pads have been ordered for the Pool and Spa ladders and rails. Enjoy our many amenities.

Q. Over by the Tennis Courts there is a pile of branches and trimmings. Is that where we should but all our trimmings?

A. No. Bulk Pick-up is on Tuesdays for household items and clippings. You should stack them in your own yard the night before pick-up day. Any sooner than that will kill the grass and then we will need to spend money for sod. The pile you are referring to started from a midweek tree collapse and was piled there in error. Unfortunately, other residents added to the pile. That is NOT allowed and Fines could follow.

Q. Is there any way we can stop the speeding and reckless driving on our streets?

A. Your board may investigate and review solutions. At this point any complaint should be in writing and verified by a second resident. Letters could be sent with the option for fines to be accessed.

Q. Why are some front yard post lights not on?

A. Good question. It is a safety issue. Our By-laws state those light posts in our yards need to be on Dusk to Dawn. The community installed light sensors on every post to that end. Either the homeowner does not have the light post switch (in their home) on or the Bulb is burnt out. The bulb is the homeowner's responsibility. If you cannot get your front yard lamp post on at night, please call the office and they will send out maintenance to investigate.

Getting to Know Elvira (Vera) Antinoro

After a lovely Easter week with family, I sat down with Elvira (Vera) Antinoro. Vera was born in Bayonne, NJ, in 1927, the youngest of five and the only living sibling going strong at 94!

A ‘change of life baby,’ Vera wanted to take dance lessons, but her mother insisted she take piano. Determined, Vera taught herself how to dance and by ten she was choreographing. At 13, she was teaching the other kids in school how to dance while she was enjoying cheerleading as well. Then in ninth grade, Vera exhibited her competitive spirit winning the Jitterbug Contest. Extracurriculars aside, she was overall a very good student, excelling in Business Subjects especially Shorthand.



Upon graduation, the young Vera landed a job in NYC at Chase Bank on 42nd and Lexington. While working at Chase, she also was a hat model and began to work at Arthur Murray to learn Ballroom Dancing. “I left the house at 7:30 a.m. and most nights did not get home until 11 p.m.”

In 1946, Vera married Salvatore Antinoro and the couple had three daughters. The dancing stopped for 14 years while the girls were growing up and she was very involved during those important formative years. When it was time for Vera to return to work, her husband bought her a ballroom and they made a family affair of the business venture known as the Apollo Dance Academy in Union City, NJ, which operated for 16 years. After an unfortunate incident on the Jersey Shore, the family moved to Fort Lauderdale in 1985 where Vera danced at Luigi’s Ballroom. Then in 1998, the Gold Coast Ballroom was opened in Coconut Creek which is still operating.

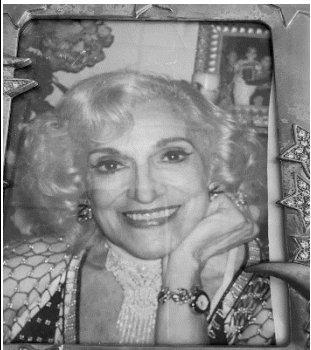
Sadly, Vera lost her husband, Sal, soon after 9/11. As in any family, there are happy and sad times and as a family they help to steady the course. The couple has both grandchildren and great-grandchildren. The circle of life perpetuates itself. Vera kept on going and doing what she knew Sal had encouraged and supported his wife to do, and that was her innate talent and love of all forms of dance.

Not slowing down, Vera worked on cruise ships for 14 years where she danced her way through 48 cruises around the world with Paul Akkaway. She was even spotted on a dance floor by a movie producer and was cast in a movie called Dance with Me. Aside from the movie, Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, and John Travolta are names we all know, but Vera has the distinction of meeting each one in person on different occasions along her well-traveled life.

Encouraged by Paul’s brother who lived at The Meadows and liked the place very much, Vera moved here in 2003. Vera says that life is very comfortable with the pool right across the street from where she lives. Vera reflected that not too long ago there were many social events at The Meadows where couples would dance, and everyone enjoyed the occasions sponsored by The Meadows Social Club at the holidays and throughout the year.

In closing, this vivacious lady keeps very busy playing cards, Bingo, etc. and other Meadows’s activities ‘four nights a week and is looking for something to do the other three nights.’

Vera’s spirit is contagious. Her optimism, determination, courage, are evidence of yet another energetic Meadows Resident who enjoys the community amenities offered here and whose life story is full of surprises for everyone but our Dancing Queen. Applause! Applause!

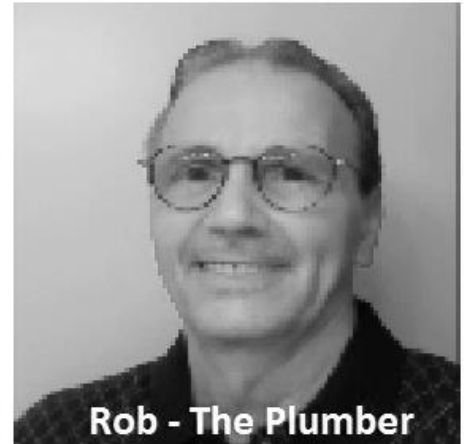
