President's Perspective

Hello Friends and Neighbors, Welcome Back!

I know many of you recognize the song when you hear the Applebee's' commercial. I smile, at least in my mind, and think of <u>Welcome Back Kotter</u> the sitcom that ran from 1975 until 1979. A high school teacher returns to teach at the high school he attended. Remember Vinnie Barbarino? Who would have thought he'd grow up to be John Travolta?

Nothing that "amazing" happened at the Meadows of Crystal Lake while everyone was gone for the summer. We did, however, manage to overhaul the Bocci Courts, improve the Veterans Memorial Park, replace the lighting on the shuffle board courts, begin repairs of the plumbing under the Clubhouse, make repairs to the pool pump house, replace pool and spa pumps, hire a new lawyer, and continue complicated negotiations for a new cable TV contract.

Each of these tasks took time to plan, organize, and execute. Most involved a couple of Board members determining a need and developing a plan to meet the need. From there those Board members would bring the plan to the entire Board of Directors for discussion and a vote to move forward. Most plans moving forward, involved finding qualified contractors, interviewing perspective contractors, and finally hiring the best contractor for the job. From there the Board members had to supervise the work being done. (I am reminded of a phrase we used in the Navy when dealing with contractors) "You get what you inspect, not what you expect." Sometimes the inspections are done by the city or county that issued a permit, but usually the inspections are done by Board members.

Your Board of Directors is a group of hard-working volunteers. We work with the Office and Maintenance Staff, contractors, and government officials to help make The Meadows of Crystal Lake a great place to call home. Welcome Home!

Q. I heard the cable TV contract is ending soon. Is that true? What are we going to do about TV?

A. Yes, our current contract with Comcast ends in November 2022. Your board has hired a professional negotiator to weed through all the companies and present what they found to the board. Although some information was presented at the last board meeting all the details were not presented before the discussion was tabled.

Q. I heard that our quarterly maintenance may go up \$90 is that true?

A. The board is negotiating a new cable contract that <u>may include internet service</u>. That is the maximum increase IF the board chooses to add Bulk Internet. If signed, yes, the maintenance will go up but the amount of increase will be a Board decision. BUT if approved your Comcast monthly payment you now pay for internet will go away. The Cable TV portion at this time looks like it may decrease.

Q. I currently pay \$60 dollars a month for my internet. Why would I want to pay \$90 a month?

A. This is one of those items that the facts are not correct. There has <u>not</u> been a vote by the board to go with bulk internet. But if the board does go for internet the MOST it could cost would be \$30 a month. \$90 a quarter. So, you would save \$30 a month. Your Comcast monthly bill would go away!

Q. I heard that the board has no authority to sign a Bulk Internet contract.

A. Our documents were ratified in 2018. Since then, State Statues over ride our documents. State statutes, among other items, added "Bulk Internet" to the boards responsibility and obligation to negotiate bulk internet.

Q. We are an over 55 plus community. I question how many residents use the internet.

A. 71% of our residents have internet through Comcast. Several others have ATT. Because that 71% is well over the "majority" of the community the board must look at bulk internet. Those numbers were proven by the questionnaire sent out in August. With that in mind, there was a rate card sent with your August bill from Comcast. Internet rates from Comcast go from \$45 a month to over \$160 a month depending on speed. (Not including a small percentage of special deals that have been grandfathered in, but not guaranteed going forward.)

Q. Do we have to pay this Professional Negotiator?

A. Yes. The Door Fee is 25% for the negotiator and 75% for the Meadows. The negotiator gets paid 25% of any <u>savings only</u> over our present contract. Nothing for the internet if that is approved.

GETTING TO KNOW DOROTHY DEVORE

Back in the day when airplane daredevilry was common, Dorothy, Dottie Devore, dated an Air Force test pilot and found herself a passenger in an AT6 that was doing aerial loops!! Her father said he was too old for his eighteen-year-old daughter. Later Dottie left her hometown, Cincinnati, OH, and went to visit a friend in Miami Beach, FL, and liked it so much she decided to stay. She enjoyed the many natural amenities of her new home state traveling their extensive waterways. Throughout her

life, Dottie set out to explore various parts of the US including the Western states and climbed her share of rugged terrain, etc.

Dottie finished high school but wished her parents had put more emphasis on higher education. She knew that the goal for young women was to marry and have a family. Dottie took a bookkeeping class and after the move to Miami did general office work for Homer DeVore, CPA. They became a couple and married and had two sons.

"When I arrived in Miami in the early 50's, everything and I mean everything was different. There were still many signs of racial inequality in restaurants, etc. There was no work for young men, no jobs." Dress Codes were common. Often you

were offered a sport coat or other attire if you arrived in casual wear. Women 'wore' fur coats but they rarely put them on. With little or no air conditioning in most places, furs were mostly for show.

The Miami and Fort Lauderdale skylines didn't exist. No condominiums. No lineup of hotels and motels along the beach. That was all about to change. Miami was first to emerge into the booming metropolis it is today. Fort Lauderdale was to follow Miami's lead years later.

In the meantime, Homer's work took the family to New Jersey for a few years but knew Florida was where they wanted to settle. Dottie proudly recalls that the boys reached the rank of Eagle Scouts and pursued careers as First Responders. Two spouses, nine grandchildren and 23 great grandchildren later make up this loving family. The forward-thinking young wife and mother had a taste of the world of work but when asked what she really wanted to be, her response was "to be a mother" "Best thing I ever did!"

Dottie's husband passed in 1990. Once the boys were grown and on their own, Dottie downsized to the Meadows where she has lived for 20 years. Here she became active in committee work and served as president of the Social Club for two years. "Parties were put together at the 'drop of a hat'! Party planning was done in earnest and it better be done quickly! Table reservations filled up FAST! Gather the checks for your group and get reservations or you could find you and your party shut out!" Dinner was sometimes catered; there was always dance music, coffee and dessert, and more dancing into the wee hours! In addition, there was a full round of activities that our now most senior population enjoyed.

As Dottie and I shared cake and coffee, I asked who she would like to have at her dining room

table. She named Meadows' residents Janice, Sybil, and Lillian. Dottie's parting remarks, "I have lived through four dining room tables of Meadows friends. Let's set that table and invite the "girls"! The gift of friendship is simply your presence."

May the same resilience and vision Miami Beach exhibited years ago create an atmosphere of healing and growth now and in the aftermath of the July catastrophe in Surfside. May the victims rest in peace and may the families find some solace. **Thank you, First Responders!** Thank you, Dottie, for your timely reflections.


