Getting to know Louise Rivington By Bill Jeffries

The eldest of eight children, growing up in Ottawa, Ontario Canada presented Louise with different life experiences than she faces today in sunny south Florida. The most obvious difference is her age. Louise was born in the early 50s. The second difference must be the weather, but Louise compensates for that by being a "Snowbird" only spending half a year in Ottawa and half a year in Deerfield Beach.



When Louise was growing up her father worked as a bus driver for the city of Ottawa. Her mother was a homemaker and a part-time seamstress, working at night when everyone else slept. Louise had four younger brothers and three younger sisters. She remembers playing outside as a child, but mostly she remembers helping her mother take care of her younger siblings.

Until the age of five the family, only numbering six, lived in a two-bedroom apartment. When she was five her parents purchased their first house. Louise recalled, "It was a little house, with only two bedrooms, but I thought it was a Castle." Her parents quickly converted the dining room into a bedroom and soon added another bedroom.

Her experience from taking care of her siblings began to pay off around age eleven when Louise started getting hired by neighboring families to baby sit their children. "I got paid a quarter an hour." she said with a smile.

In school, Louise remembers doing well in languages and history. "Math was not my favorite subject" she recalled. Her schooling through eighth grade was at an all-girls school. Grades nine and ten were at a convent taught by nuns. The last two years were in a regular high school with boys and girls mixed. Louise recalls liking that arrangement the best.

Right out of high school Louise went to work at a local credit union. She started as a receptionist and when she moved on five years later, she was part of the administrative staff. More importantly, during those five years she met three "lifelong friends" she still sees regularly. Over 50 years later and she is still close friends with Perry, Micheline, and Gise'le. After the credit union job, Louise had a career as an administrator for the Federal Government in Ottawa from 1974 until 1989.

Louise married Brian Rivington in 1979. They had two sons, Brock and Brandon. Brock presented Louise with two grandsons and two great-grandsons. Brandon also provided two grandsons for Louise to spoil. Both sons and all grandsons and great-grandsons live in the Ottawa area. After 36 years of marriage Louise and Brian ended their marriage in 2007.

In 1989 Louise began another career in the printing industry. For 20 years until 2009 she worked in sales in the publishing industry. "It was going great until computers and the internet took over printing." she said. Being resourceful Louise got her real estate license in 2009 and worked with her partner Michel Circe on real estate ventures in Ottawa until December 2013 when Louise retired from the business world.

When asked what brought her and Michel to Florida, Louise said she and Michel were visiting Perry, her friend of 50 years, in Century Village in 2012. "We loved the area" said Louise. At first, they bought a place in Century Village, but Michel wanted a house with a garage. While searching for a home they discovered the Meadows. While touring the Meadows pool area Louise and Michel met Lucie Parent and Daniel Langlois in the hot tub. "After meeting them, we knew we wanted to live in the Meadows. We just had to find the right house" said Louise.



When asked for words of wisdom, Louise said, "Stay active, stay positive, and enjoy life."

House painting contractor hired.

At the March 20th, 2023, HOA Board of Directors Meeting, the house painting contract was discussed. The Board voted to accept the proposal from Smart Coat Painting Company. Painting is due to start in the fall. The weather, supplies, and staffing may affect the start date in October.

In anticipation of this project beginning in October, the homeowners need to be attentive to the needs of their home. This should include maintenance of wood, trim around the gutters, and most importantly pruning overgrown foliage. Foliage needs to be trimmed 12 inches away from the house. They will not paint if your overgrown foliage prevents them from rolling or spraying the paint onto the house. They will not be responsible for the harm or damage to any overgrown shrubs that have not been taken care of ahead of time. Be alert, some of you have objects up against the walkways, the painters will not be moving anything. All houses will be painted.

We will have more to say about this MAJOR project in the next few months. Yes, attend the HOA monthly meetings, read your newsletter, Meadow's website, and homeowner's Facebook page for updates. Before this project begins the contractors will do a walk through the community to examine each house and determine what, if anything, needs to be done prior to painting.


