



The Marshal

Each officer in a chapter is important. All officers are charged with specific duties at the time of installation. Each officer should strive to perform these duties in a manner becoming the solemnity of our Order. To make our Ritualistic work as impressive as possible, all officers should memorize their work.

The Marshal stands at the left of her/his chair.

Exception: At the Installation of Officers where chairs are placed next to the Marshal and Chaplain stations, the Installation Chaplain and Marshal sit on the outside chairs, and the Chaplain and Marshal stand directly

in front of their chairs.

It is the duty of the Marshal to escort the visitor to meet the Committee at the Preparation Room door. The Salutation Sign need NOT be given when leaving through the Preparation Room door.

When needed the Marshal assists the Conductress or Associate Conductress with presentations.

In some chapters, the Marshal presents the flag.

It is important that the Marshal stays alert as the Worthy Matron may give an instruction at any time to the Marshal.

Also, the Marshal should watch the Conductresses as often the Marshal assists one of them.
