Local shooters win trophies at championship match

The home team, paced by high overall champion Bob French, carried home many of the honors Sunday at the conclusion of the Missouri Eastern Zone Open skeet: shoot at the Mississippi County Gun Club.

French shot a composite score of 385 in the 12, 20, 28 and 410 gauge events to bring home the championship trophy. The runnerup was Karla Roberts of St. Louis with a 383.

Al Moreton of Wyatt was the senior champion with a 94; Charlie Smith with a 99 was sub-senior champion and Bob DeLaney of Charleston was runnerup with a 93. Mrs Roberts was the ladies' champion and Sallie Durbin of St. Louis was the runnerup with a 95. Kevin Hess was the tournament's junior champion with the first perfect score. 100, in his shooting career. David Mitchell was runnerup in the junior division.

A total of 65 shooters from four states took part in the local matches, making it the largest shoot in the state, according to Marty Williams of the local club.
