STATE SHOOT

MISSOURI STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS'

Jack Moreland repeated as State Champion by breaking his State Cver-All record busting 499 x 500. After being perfect in the three small guns, it was the big 12GA and the second 100 at that, that he lost a target "high 4". Jack's outstanding gunning won him the 410 championship, 28 and 20GA, too, along with high over-all title. He also wants it known he carried his aged, sub-senior partner (Charlie Wilson) to the two-man high over-all title.

Newcomer Rob Gyngard was high over-all champion runner-up, along with a surprise 12GA victory with the only perfect 200. The class winners in the 12GA-AA, Gary Goodpaster with a 199; A, Bill Crockett; B, Mike Burgar with 197; C, Ken Lorton with a 193; D, Lindell Baker with a 190; E, Al Wagner with a 183 was the only man to take his title without a shoof-off.

The Boot-Heel Championship saw Archie Alexander emerge eventual winner, while Rob Gyngard took the Ozark crown, showing on Sunday or any day he was going to miss nothing with the 12GA.

Although Jack Moreland was 20GA champion, Al Ventuci, shooting with a borrowed gun, showed he could break 100, too. Other class winners: AA, Lenard Willie 99; A, Dug Fuller with a 99; B, Rob Gyngard 99; C, Bud Wicolar 96; D, John Spurgeon 97.

28GA championship saw Jack Moreland again, and Rob Gyngard runner-up with a 99. AA, Carl Schwarz with a 99; A, Ed Roberts with a 98; B, Eldin Arnold with a 97; C, Glen Bilderback with a 97; D, John Spurgeon with a 95.

410 GA. Runner up to champion Jack Moreland was Carl Schwarz, 99. Low 2, first bird dead, proof doubles. (Editorial comment--YOU IDIOT). Other people who broke their double shots were Archie Alexander 96; A, Randy Barth 97; B, Glen Bilderback 96; D, Bill Spurgeon 93; and D, John Spurgeon 90.

We had a whole new list of concurrent winners and champions. Notable scores were: 5-man team High over-all was 2427; BORTH, BORTH, GYNGARD, HARTGE, ALEXANDER. Many people hope they can match return champion's 472 shot by Ray RUCKER from United Sportsman.

"Dirty Old Man" Charlie Smith won the high over-all with senior 483, after having some tough luck with the 12GA. Sub-senior champion was Glen Bilderback with a 486. All American junior Randy Borth was again the state champion with a 484. Karla Roberts repeated as Lady Champion with a 481.

It should also be mentioned that Randy and Larry Borth, shooting in the parent and child 410 team event, tied a world record.

We would also like to welcome sub-junior Billy Snow to our ranks.

The rookie of the year was Mike Burgan with an excellent 197.

MID AMERICA

The 1979 Mid-America is now history. If you were there you saw the most exciting shoot in the history of Missouri skeet. If you missed it, you may have to wait a long time to see what we saw. There were 7 high-over-all scores of 397 or better, with two shooters, Robert Paxton and Barry Eschete, tied with 399's! Robert, the long time All-American from Dallas, Texas, won the shootoff and added another championship to his collection. Eschete (pronounced esh tay), a junior shooter from Houma, Louisianna, set a new HOA record with his 399. Barry missed a high six in the .410 and ran the rest. A terrific performance under considerable pressure. Congratulations to both Robert and Barry; the best shooters at the 1979 Mid-America.

The weather was beautiful for all three days and the scores were terrific! Six shooters who managed 99's with the .410 had to take a back seat to Maxie Wright (Ohio) who had a lone 100 straight. Among the 99's were Paxton, Charlie Parks (former world champion) and Eschete. It was obvious, right from the beginning, that it would take a tremendous score to win the HOA.

The 28 gauge was split between Friday and Saturday making it difficult to tell how things were going until late in the day. Eventually a dozen shooters went out to shoot off the 100's. After two rounds of doubles only two Texans remained. All-American Ralph Petley and Junior All-American Bartley Jones, III. Bartley prevailed and become another in the long line of junior shooters to win major events in recent years.

Late Saturday afternoon was also the setting for the 20 gauge shootoff. It was beginning to be difficult to watch the shootoffs unless you could watch four or five fields at once. As darkness approached the lights were turned on and the shoot narrowed to All-American Al Magyar (Michigan) and Tom Schmitz (St. Paul, Minn.). Schmitz proved to have the best night vision and won at station 5.

After viewing the perfect weather conditions Sunday morning, one shooter commented "It's going to rain 100's". It turned out to be a downpour. When it was all over, 39 shooters had shot 100 straights. How often do you get to see an eight field shootoff? Even more astounding was the fact that two five many teams shot perfect 500 x 500's. I don't believe that has ever happened before. Just imagine being on a 500 x 500 team and coming in second! After two rounds of doubles, miss and out, the field was narrowed to 11 shooters. Then things got serious. Doubles at stations 3, 4 and 5 only, miss and out! One round reduced the field to four. The final four were Sam Soloff (Tenn.), Jack Mills (Kentucky), All-America captain Wayne Mayes (Tenn.) and Todd Bender. Todd (listed as a Texan, but will tell you he is merely going to college there and is really from California) won when Mayes finally missed at station 5.

As I mentioned, the Mid-America was a terrific shoot. The fine people who worked so diligently at the tables and the scoreboard all deserve medals. The chief referee, Frank Copenhaver (Wisc.) and his staff did a terrific job. A fine job of promotion was done by Willis Corbett (NRA). Obviously the contributions by Anheuser-Busch were enjoyed by all: And of course, the efforts of Karla Roberts made the whole thing possible. All in all there were over 825 total entries. Eighty-two shooters from Missouri participated and won 21 awards. The following is an attempt to list as many Missouri shooters and what they won as is possible. Congratulations to you all!


