In addition to making award presentations to the 1981 Mo. State Skeet Team Members, some special people will be honored for their contributions to the promotion of skeet shooting in Missouri in the past. They have helped by giving of their time, support and participation not only in shooting, but putting together shoots and making them work. They have played an important part in making Missouri Shooting what it is today. After the Banquet on Friday Nite, March 5th, what could be more appropriate than the first 4 gun registered shoot in Missouri for 1982??? Bridgeton is the place, and John and Hal announced they will throw \$14.00 targets (plus daily fees) and offer options of 50's, Oklahoma, and class purse. Because the people of the Bridgeton Club are joining with all State Clubs in trying to stimulate skeet shooting this year, they are going to give a free fish fry for this shoot. It will be Saturday afternoon, so now is the chance to shoot cheap targets and get a free feast on the Bridgeton Gun Club.

Our beloved State Director and Shoot writer upper and my two man team partner, Bruce Moreland, has this information for shooters. If you shoot new 410 skeet loads in registered shoots, don't shoot AA shells. They have 14 to 17 less shot than is allowed for a 1/2 oz load. Other new loads are closer to the maximum limits, thus giving you a better chance atbreaking targets. Bruce averaged .8644 on 2750 410 targets during 1981 so his theory is notable. I put this in print for all those toes that were stepped on in Bruce's 1981 shoot reports. HA HA.

STATE SHOOT PROCRAM



STATE SHOOT HOA DETERMINATIONS

It has been decided that the HOA Classification be determined by the current HOA average of each shooter for the State Shoot in 1982. You must have shot initial strings during this year or prior year in all guns to have a HOA class. Your skeet card must be current and accurate. Classes are as follows:

"NOTICE"--The Skeet Teams for 1981 are based on minimum targets shot of 800 12 ga, 600 20 ga, 500 28 ga, & 500 .410. These were voted for and approved during the Directors Meeting of Jan. 1981 and appeared as record in the minutes. Even though most shooters and directors understood the minimums were not changed, the minutes read lower target requirements as noted above. The Newsletter of April 1981 showed 1000-700-600-600, but the permanent record of the meeting showed 800-600-500-500 and that shall take preference. Please note that the 1982 requirements were moved back up to 1000-700-600-600.



MINIMUM TARGET REQUIREMENTS FOR 1982 SKEET TEAMS


1000 - 12 GA 600 - 28 GA 700 - 20 GA 600 - 410




