PTSD

What is it? It could be another souvenir of 'Nam you brought home and didn't know about, like Agent Orange contact. All of us on the Freedom Bird thought we were leaving Vietnam behind. It turns out that many of us brought Vietnam home with us. We brought it home in the way we form our relationships with wives, husbans, lovers and friends. We brought it home in nightmares and flashbacks, substance abuse problems, attacks of depression, anxiety and rage, feelings of alienation and isolation, and survival guilt. Most of these things are common in varying degrees, to Vietnam vets, even 15 or more years later.

PTSD -- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder is the result of your way of dealing with the stress in Vietnam. You numbed yourself to feelings when your buddies were wounded or killed. When you got home, it was difficult to form close relationships with others. The constant threat of possible rocket or mortar attack is still present in feelings of depression and lonliness. These are just some of the symptoms of PTSD. We probably all have it in some degree or another. We probably always

will have it to some extent, but we can learn to cope.

The best overall way of dealing with PTSD seems to be contact with other vets. Rap groups, group therapy sessions, or just plain BS sessions with other veterans can help defuse the vet with PTSD. You will find out you're not alone in the way you act or react.
