Dear Amanda,

The Home page of my website poisonousprescriptions.com will show you that I stated on Prime News TV in Canberra, Australia in 1994, that antibiotics cause asthma and diabetes. The papers attached which I wrote recently, should convince you, Professor Powis and Julian Kelly that I am correct.

On my 'Asthma and Diabetes' page the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) can be seen to confirm that Occupational Asthma is the same asthma that asthmatics in the general public suffer from. The symptoms and treatment are the same. Occupational asthma can be caused by antibiotics such penicillins (eg. amoxicillin) and cephalosporins and compensation in the UK is from £5,000 to £65,000.

We have had epidemics of asthma around the world for decades, following the introduction of penicillin which became available in 1946. Asthma existed before then but early antibiotics such as sulphonamides can cause asthma. Amoxicillin the most frequently prescribed antibiotic in many countries such as the UK which has been available since 1972 in the UK, reaches concentrations about 2-3 times higher a concentration than the earlier antibiotic ampicillin.

Unfortunately, the dose of amoxicillin in the UK was doubled in 2015 and for children of certain ages it had already been doubled in 2010. As shown on my website, I call this the BNF fiasco (the British National Formulary is used by doctors and dentists in the UK to prescribe). I have been corresponding with Karen Baxter and Kate Towers for weeks and sent them my papers and they agree with me that the dose is too high.

Unfortunately, the BNF states that there is no reason for doctors not to prescribe amoxicillin during pregnancy, and I believe that drugs such as amoxicillin may be responsible for birth defects which must cost the NHS a lot of money as premature babies often need intensive care. The graphs on my 'Birth Defects' page, one taken from a government report, show that birth defects can affect many parts of the body.

My 'Medical Associations' page shows that I have just recently escalated my concerns to Regulatory Authorities internationally, as asthmatics die every day and diabetics are in pain every time they have to stab themselves to inject insulin. This costs the NHS a lot of money as do asthmatics.

Diabetics also tend to suffer from eye, kidney and heart problems and sometimes need amputations. They have to avoid sugar and the artificial sweeteners such as sucralose and aspartame that are commonly used today are toxic, and unfortunately they are now used in many drinks and some food products that non-diabetics consume.

I have read that your budget for 2023/24 is £168.8 billion and we all know that the NHS is under strain. If the public are informed about antibiotics causing asthma and diabetes, I am certain that the NHS will make tremendous cost savings as these diseases are costing the NHS billions.

Antibiotics also cause hay fever and food allergies...as I'm sure you know, allergy warnings are now ubiquitous. And in the last two years approximately, the NHS no longer allows doctors to prescribe drugs for hay fever, presumably because it's costing too much as there are so many afflicted.

My reason for contacting you, is that I have been communicating with Professor Sir Chris Whitty (Chief Medical Officer, England) and Professor Sir Gregor Smith (CMO Scotland) for many weeks and it seemed as though they wanted to help me to inform the public.

However, hours away from a planned and paid for trip to meet in London today with Chris, I discover that yet again he does not seem to want to meet to discuss a Press Conference at the RSM in February, so that doctors and the public can learn about the amoxicillin dosing fiasco and the toxic effects of antibiotics and thereafter make informed decisions. Doctors are legally required to dose according to the BNF, and in my brief paper I list 11 reasons why the dose is too high.

The Australian government and others are aware that I have been communicating with both Chris and Gregor and that Chris has been planning to meet with me. I have all the emails that I have sent to Chris and Gregor. Each time I spend hours travelling down from Scotland and staying at hostels at my own expense to meet with Chris (I have been self-funded for years self-publishing my book in 1994 and 2006) so I am not impressed.

So I thought that I should escalate my concerns to you the Head of the NHS, perhaps a woman will show more empathy for those who suffer from diseases. I would like to meet with you and any of your colleagues anywhere in the UK as soon as possible.
