J. Ralph Ingalls School: Turning over a new Leaf

On Friday, April 9, 2010, 10 maple trees, 2 flowering crab trees and an evergreen were planted on the J. Ralph Ingalls property.

Mike McKilligan provided the site, the top dirt and the evergreen. He staked out the plan and helped with digging the holes and planting the trees.

Phil Quick donated his time, talent and equipment to dig the holes, plant two maples from the edge of the school property, haul dirt and use his front-end loader to help plant the trees.

When Heath Howard came up Church Street with his huge flat bed trailer and tree planting equipment, the excitement continued. Heath and his brother Wade are partners in "Forevergreen Farms, Inc." Heath, who had volunteered to transport eight maple trees and two flowering trees from a nursery over two hours away, oversaw and assisted in the tree planting.

Thanks to the efforts of Jim Tokos, Lorrie Flannery, Jake Zuber. Corey Layton, Amanda Flannery, Zac Tokos and Kerin Flannery, the last tree went into the ground as the thunder and lightning applauded a job well done.

The community's commitment to this project continues with the efforts of those on duty for weekly watering of the trees at the rate of ten gallons a tree during the crucial rooting process.

This monumental task could never have been accomplished without the efforts of our outstanding volunteers. Thanks from the J. Ralph Ingalls Tree committee to everyone for their generosity. Thanks to the Tree Committee (Nancy Berry, Lorrie and Kerin Flannery, Gordie Gottlieb, Kim and Mike Hayden, Corey Layton, Larry Maier, Mike Mc Killigan and Jim Tokos) for their quick and efficient work getting this job put together in record time for meeting this spring's planting deadline.

In Memory of Esther Frazier from Mary Jane Sieczkos

Esther was an educator in the Maine schools for over 30 years, beginning her teaching career in Union Center in 1938 and leading as principal at J. Ralph Ingalls from 1961 until 1974 when she retired.

In Memory of Clarence and Minerva Berry, from Dale Berry

The Berry family lived next to or across from J. Ralph Ingalls for over 60 years. Clarence was a member of the Junior High Faculty when the school was dedicated in 1940. A math teacher, he also participated in the annual Arbor Day tree planting.

In Memory of Lucy Tanner from Lorrie, Linda and Karen, "the Berry Girls"

"Lucy Tanner was our first grade teacher at J. Ralph Ingalls. She also taught at Maine Memorial for many years. She was as nurturing as she was tall in stature"

In Memory of Ken Rozek from Sandy Rozek and his children.

In rooms or on a cart up and down the halls of Ingalls, just as at one time or another during his art teaching career in most of the buildings in the district, Ken peddled the excitement of creativity and community responsibility to our children, young and old.

In Memory of Carol Podest Berry and son Rickey from Dale Berry

Rickey was an elementary student at J. Ralph Ingalls. Carol was a distinguished alumna who graduated from Union Endicott as the salutatorian.

In Memory of Bill Berry, from Nancy Berry

As a student at J. Ralph Ingalls, Bill overcame a devastating bout of polio. As an adult he became an integral and intricate part of the Maine community, a compassionate friend to all.

In Memory of Clarence Ames from Lil Ames

Clarence left his mark on the Town of Maine when he replicated from a photograph the Pagoda that is located on the corner of Rte. 26 and Church St. He built the Pagoda to commemorate Maine's "125th Celebration" in 1973.

May you always cherish your "roots" in this community. As these new trees begin to flourish... may they remind us of the generations of families who have taken pride in this town.

Nanticoke Valley Historical Society to enter into agreement with Mike McKilligan for lease of the J. Ralph Ingalls School in the hamlet of Maine

At the Nanticoke Valley Historical Society Trustees' Meeting on March 21st, 2010, a motion was made, discussed and passed to enter into a year's leasing agreement with Mike McKilligan for the rental fee of \$1.00. This agreement would place the use of the school under the control of the NVHS for the purpose of bringing community activities and projects back to this historic landmark, built in 1939 and placed on the National Historic Register of Historic Places in 1998. This proposal was then presented to the general meeting of the historical society on April 22nd, where it was unanimously approved with one abstention (Mike McKilligan). The future of the school has been under discussion by a committee made up of a group of interested community members since last July when Mr. McKilligan took possession of the building. Two clean-up days are scheduled for the 15th and 22nd of May from 9:00 AM 'til noon, where inside and outside work such as raking, carting yard debris, washing windows, woodwork and floors, and various skill adjusted tasks will be started. All energetic volunteers are welcomed, with or without garden tools or cleaning supplies.

The Schoolhouse to be Painted

The One Room School House will be painted this summer. It needs it so bad, and we will all be very pleased to have it done. Boy Scout **Andrew Sellick** will organize it as part of his **Eagle Scout** preparation.

We'll be open this summer, every Sunday afternoon from 1:00 to 4:00, July, August, and September.

We have found that little groups have wonderful times. So do individual visitors. Many of them stop by just because they see the open sign. If you know you'll be having a bunch of people to Sunday Dinner, plan on bringing them to one of the buildings afterward. Or, how about a Sunday School class field trip? We always tell the school children that they can come back when they're not on the tight school schedule, and take their time to look at the things they had to leave while they were still wanting to see and hear more. Remind any you know, of that, and maybe they'd like to bring you with them this time.

We'll need about two persons for each building that is open on each day. If you have never done this volunteer assignment tell Sue Lisk. She'll see you are broken in.

Obituaries

Dane H. McGregor, 95, died in Newark Ohio on April 17, 2010. He was born in Maine, NY on May 19 of 1914 and lived most of his life here. He was predeceased by his wife Ruth (Young). He and Ruth were together for 70 years, after being wed in the bay window of what is now the Rozek living room, on October 2, 1936. He graduated from the Union Endicott High School in 1933 and spent his working life on the McGregor and Sons poultry and egg farm, along with his father and two brothers.

Dane was also predeceased by his parents Venley and Clara, his son Stanley McGregor, his brother Garth and sister in law Margaret McGregor, and brother Warren McGregor.

He is survived by his daughter Nancy Bittinger of Nova OH, daughter in law Barbara McGregor of Midland MI, sons Venley (Kathy) McGregor of Maine NY and Glenn (Diane) McGregor of Newark OH, sister in law Betty McGregor and brother in law Donald Young.

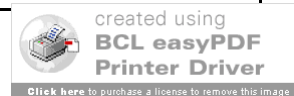
