From the Desk of the Pastor:

Friends:

During Holy Week, we observed Maundy Thursday. Maundy is the Latin word for 'mandate'. In the Gospel of John, the writer shared the story about Jesus sharing a Passover meal with his disciples. After the meal, Jesus wrapped a towel around himself and then picked up a basin full of water. With great care and attention, he then moved from disciple to disciple washing their feet. Afterwards he reminded them of the importance of his actions by giving them a new (mandate) commandment. He said, "Love one another as I have loved you."

The late M. Scott Peck defined love this way in his classic book, The Road Less Traveled – "Love is attention." Love is not based on sentiment, gushy feelings, or the alignment of the stars. Love is actually the giving of oneself to another

person. Jesus showed the world God's love by his actions toward others. His life, death, and resurrection demonstrated God's love not through power and control but through humility and service.

In March, we celebrated Easter. We were again reminded that God follows the cruelty of the Cross with the life-giving proclamation of the Resurrection. The good news is that love wins over hate, compassion defeats cruelty and life reigns over death. It would be this Resurrection faith that would turn a frightened and confused band of followers into bold witnesses of God's love. By their witness, they would literally turn the world up-side-down. They would demonstrate God's word by being attentive to others' concerns and needs and most importantly by making sure they remained attentive to God's gift of grace and love.

In the musical, **My Fair Lady**, Eliza responds to Professor Higgins' on-going words of rapture and delight as he expresses his love for her. She responds:

Words! Words! Words!
I am so sick of words!...
Don't talk of stars burning above;
If you're in love, show me!
Tell me no dreams filled with desire.
If you're on fire, show me!...
Sing me no song! Read me no rhyme!
Don't waste my time, show me!
Don't talk of June, Don't talk of fall!
Don't talk at all! Show me!

Authentic faith is more than knowing the right words. Greater growth necessitates a greater attentiveness. Love itself is more than just knowing. True attentiveness is when we demonstrate our love in concrete ways. As Jesus said to his disciples and to all who follow the path of service, "Love one another as I have loved you."



Honor Your Graduate


Graduation always seems to sneak up on us each year! We would like to honor your graduate on **May 19th** at our 11:00 am worship service.

Wesley Food Pantry Needs



Appointment Announcement

The staff parish relations committee is responsible for personnel concerns within the congregation. It is my joy to share with you today that Bishop LaTrelle Easterling has appointed Rev. Dr. Melissa Rudolph, Rev. John Rudolph, and Rev. Jerry Gautcher as the new pastors of the North Carroll Cooperative Parish as it is extended from Grace, Greenmount, St. John's, Emory, Millers, Bixlers, Mt. Zion, and Pleasant Grove to include Wesley UMC.

The pastoral team will begin their new responsibilities on July 1 of this year.

As a United Methodist Church we are a part of an appointment system. Our congregation's staff parish relations committee has met with the district superintendent to identify our congregation's needs and the needed skills in a pastor. We have also met with Pastor Melissa to get to know her and to ask questions.

Pastor Melissa continues as the lead pastor and is responsible for administrative concerns and worship planning. Pastor John will continue to oversee the Youth and Kids teams, NCCP sports, and missional strategy. Pastor Jerry is responsible for the Caring Parish team and will organize and equip pastoral care and outreach programs. All three will be available for spiritual needs. Our new pastors will work with us and the conference so that we continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

We are excited for Wesley to become part of NCCP!



Questions and answers from Pastor Melissa Rudolph at the Town Hall Meeting.

- 1. What Sunday does the NCCP ministry start in July? Will you be our pastor every week or how will it work? What time would be our Sunday service?
 - Lay speakers are in a rotation. Pastor John Rudolf takes care of the kids and youth ministries, Pastor Jerry oversees the Care and Visitation Team. Worship Service times are currently a work in progress. Beginning the first week in July, Wesley will have Pastor Melissa two Sundays a month, and Pastor John or Pastor Jerry a third Sunday with lay supply as well for a 4th week until resolution of the lawsuit.
- 2. We need help with keeping our church website up to date and current. Would the NCCP be able to help us with this? What would that look like?
 - We do not have individual websites for churches we have a central one for NCCP with a page for each church to share any events happening in their own churches.
- 3. Can we share choir members from NCCP churches to help us out with church cantatas? The church choir remains at each individual church but may invite others from other churches to join us. Hymn sings or music share with for everyone. Combined event.
- 4. Please explain the church bulletins and the journal, and how that gets done and by who? Please explain how the administrative duties would be handled once we are part of the NCCP? Do committees within our church send information such as upcoming events, reports from committees, etc. to the centralized Admin. person and they would be responsible for entering our church information into our bulletins and journals for our church?
 - There is a centralized church administrator. Information to post in Wesley bulletins would be sent to the NCCP administrator who generates all church bulletins. Some churches do maintain their own administrator for 2 days a week.
- 5. Is there any money involved with joining this NCCP, other than the annual pastor's salary? $_{\text{NO}}$
- 6. Will any of our committees be affected by this change in regard to: Worship Committee, United Women in Faith, United Methodist Men, Christian Education, Administrative Council and Outreach Committees?
 - Yes, United Methodist Men and United Women Faith groups as well as all groups will stay the same at each church. Perhaps a joint lunch, tea, etc. can occur between churches to get to know others in the NCCP Carroll group.
- 7. Will our church special services remain the same such as Maundy Thursday, Stations of the Cross, Christmas Pageant, Live Nativity, Cantata's etc.
 - Yes, there is no competition. We can invite the other NCCP churches to join our special services.
- 8. What will our current Staff-Parrish Relations Committee roles and responsibilities be when we are under the NCCP?
 - The committee will function as it currently does and send representatives to the parish wide SPRC meeting where evaluations and salary are handled.
- 9. With the addition of Wesley there would be 9 churches in the North Carroll Parish. Nine churches and 3 ministers is the equivalent of being in a 3-point charge. There has been some indication that 3 of the churches might be in the process of leaving. If this happened, 6 churches and 3 ministers, the Parish would be similar to a 2-point charge. Wesley's budget for this year assumed that after July first we would be in a 2-point charge.

What is the status of the other churches and is there a timeline for Wesley to get into an equivalent 2-point charge situation?

There will be 8 because Mt. Zion is being removed from the parish. Three other churches are in the disaffiliation lawsuit, so we will potentially have three clergy for five churches. The budget implications for the parish and a two-point charge are no different—Wesley pays the same amount. But the conference is moving toward having all of the churches in hubs (not existing cooperatives because we already function that way). The cooperative parish arrangement also solves a conference-wide shortage of clergy.

- **10. Do we have a business obligation to NCCP other than paying agreed to 'pastor salary?**Yes, the church administrator, there is a fee for this staff member. There is a once-a-month fee from all the NCCP churches to pay for NCCP staff.
- 11. What oversight will NCCP have over Wesley church?

Only with the Pastor, staff sermons weekly. Wesley's Administrative Committee still governs over Wesley Church.

- **12. Is Wesley obligated to share financial or other records with NCCP?**Wesley will pay monthly into a fund for salaries, pensions, etc.
- 13. If Wesley were able to support a full-time pastor at some point in the future, would there be any obligation associated with disengagement from NCCP?

 Wesley can disengage, no penalty.
- **14. Are there shared resources other than admin and pastoral services?** Yes, Clerical, printing, shared website, etc.
- 15. Are there other non-labor shared resources?

Streaming service, for example. Online scheduler for appointments, Centralized phone, etc.

- 16. How much do the individual churches in the NCCP interact? Share activities?

 Yes, choral programs, Youth ministries, Confirmation classes, summer camp (Bible school), Saturday night youth get togethers/Yak meets for 3rd to 6th graders, church picnics, etc.
- 17. Does NCCP have any oversight or responsibility associated with Wesley property including the church building, the parsonage, and the cemetery?

 No, Parrish can help in any way needed but responsibility is Wesley's.
- 18. The church branding NCCP @ feels like a business. How do we not feel like part of a business and feel like just old Wesley church?

Branding only matters when you want to reach new people. Honestly, folks who want "just old Wesley Church" will have just that. Those who want to reach out into the community and welcome newcomers will find it beneficial to be part of an organization that is recognized for our ministries. I was actually at a merchants' association networking event, and a business owner was asking one of the town council members about what organizations were doing work in Hampstead that they could support. I overheard the council member telling him about our parish. She didn't realize I was there listening. Those are the times that it matters to be part of the parish. On Sunday morning, much will feel the same.

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes

April 23, 2024

<u>Attendance:</u> Brenda Kennedy, Jan Kurtz, Brenda Hess, Connie Weigel, Dave and Michelle Hudgins, Jon and Linda Yost, Linda Hollman, Janet Martin, John Seis, Vicky Wilmer

Jan Kurtz opened the meeting in prayer at 7:01pm.

Finance Committee

Our financial position is still strong. But I believe we need to continue with caution. Financial reports through March 2024 are attached.

Per balance sheet, unrestricted checking account sits at \$69,326.59. Very strong and should keep us in a good position throughout the year, barring any unforeseen large expenses.

<u>Income</u>: Looking at profit and loss against budget, note that income is \$9220 ahead of budget, with all significant giving categories doing well. Compared with last year's giving, we are ahead by \$7,562.25, again with all significant giving categories doing well and with an extra boost from parsonage income.

<u>Expenses:</u> With salaries and compensation down, expenses are in line with budget (\$2,305.45) and certainly much lower than the same period in 2023 (\$21,037.81). There are some recent issues with the church water conditioning system that will show up as an unplanned expense. But I don't expect the overall cost will be significant.

Overall, my recommendation is to continue to monitor.

FMC bank signature transition is complete.

When the finance committee meets next, we will discuss possible impacts associated with the transition to NCCP.

Christian Education

Class sizes in pre-k/k are upwards of 6 students per class. Grades 4/5 is 3. Last Sunday we met to discuss our "Spring Fling" lesson and Kids Take Over Church Day. A goal is to do an inventory of current Sunday school materials. VBS is on hold and so is planning for 2024-2025 Sunday school year until we meet with John from NCCP to gather more information about how we can work collaboratively with NCCP to help our Sunday School program to grow, especially the later elementary and middle school grades. We are excited that they provide curriculum materials that match the sermon.

Unfinished Business:

- Tim Alisea looked at the thermostat for the HVAC in the Sanctuary and made some fan adjustments which have taken care of the temperature issues. He recommended that he return and inspect our system in the fall.
- Spring Clean-up scheduled for Wednesday, May 1, 2024, beginning at 9:00 a.m. We will be cleaning inside the church, and the gardens and lawn outside. All church members will be invited to assist. Should bring tools and cleaning equipment. Linda will ask Sarah to put a short article in the Journal re: clean-up day.

New Business:

- Dean suggested that we consider legally separating the cemetery from the church. Discussion ensued. This will be brought up at the Town Hall meeting this month.
- The open spots in the Trustee Assignment Sheet have been filled.

- Our church insurance company, Brethren Mutual, is dropping Workers' Compensation coverage in September. Tom Little, Insurance Representative, will attempt to find another insurance company to carry our Workers' Comp. Laura has advised Dave Hudgins, Church Treasurer, of this situation. Mr. Little will contact the church with any information on this issue.
