

Names like John James Maloney, Terry Long, Tearlach Dunsford Maca'phearsoin and Hayden Lake, Idaho hearken back to the 1920s when, aided by the Orange Order, KKK organizers promoted white supremacy and fostered racial and religious discrimination against Catholics, the French, and European immigrants in Alberta. Churches, too, supported the movement, which by 1933 had eventually collapsed although the ideas behind it still linger on the fringe.
