Habitat for Humanity receives many more requests than it can fill. The resources listed below may also be helpful to you:

Somerset Housing Authority provides subsidized housing through Section 8 Federal Housing Resources. Get on the waiting list as soon as possible to increase your options. **Phone: 606-679-1332**. If searching for the website online, be sure to include the word "Kentucky" in your search.

Lake Cumberland Housing Agency also provides Section 8 Federal Housing Resources, covering a seven-county region that includes Pulaski County. Also get on this waiting list as soon as possible to increase your options. Phone: 270-343-4740 or 800-648-6056. Include "Kentucky" when searching on the web.

The **USDA Section 502 Guaranteed Rural Housing Loan program** is designed to serve rural residents who have a steady, low or modest income, and yet are unable to obtain adequate housing through conventional **financing**. Additionally, during the pandemic KHC has CARES Act funds available for rental and utility assistance.
