

Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- ▶ We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees;
 this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

I would like to start out by thanking everyone who took the time to call all the Senators and the House Representatives about the Violations Against Vulnerable Road Users bill. We were able to get House Bill 1133 and Senate Bill 1528 passed. The basic text is "Violations Against Vulnerable Road Users; Requires person who commits infraction that causes serious bodily injury to, or causes death of, vulnerable road user to pay specified civil penalty; requires person's driver license to be suspended for specified period; requires person to attend specified driver improvement course." Now it will be on the desk for the Governor DeSantis to sign into law. Good job, everyone!! We make a difference!! I'm not sure when the Governor will get a chance to look at this bill, but it surely wouldn't hurt for everyone to call up the Governor and ask him to support this bill. When he does, I will let everybody know. Keep your fingers crossed!!

This month, April, we will start nominations to elect all the positions for our Chapter. This is the Board and the Trustees who will steer our Chapter in the coming year. If you are interested in stepping up, we sure would appreciate the help. Only members in good standing can run for a position. And if you can't commit to a position, come to our meetings and help, just by being there, and voicing your opinion, and joining in the conversations.

Our Chapter meetings are on the third Sunday of each month, and the next one is April 21st. We meet at the American Legion 142, 171 SW 2nd St, Pompano Beach, FL 33060. The meeting starts at ten o'clock and usually runs until about twelve. If you get there early, they have a really good breakfast for a reasonable price. Many of us get there around nine so we can eat and then do the meeting. There is also usually a group of friends that go on a ride after the meet-

VULNERABLE ROAD USER'S BILL 2024

ABATE of Florida, Inc. had made numerous efforts in years past to pass a vulnerable road users (VRU) bill in an effort to get justice for those who were hurt or killed by someone who committed a traffic infraction. Previous efforts each got stopped in committee because we had Jail time included in the bill.

This year we removed the Jail time and got the bill passed. Granted it is not everything I would have liked and it still has the attorneys upset because it has mandatory minimums for causing serious injury or killing a VRU. The defense attorneys have said that mandatory minimums take the discretion out of the hands of the judge. Frankly if you run a red light or violate the right of way and turn left in front of a biker, I don't flipping care why you did it, there is no mitigating the injury that your bad act caused.

There are specific provisions related to traffic infractions in school zones or construction sites but the main dist of the bill otherwise is as follows. If you commit an infraction and it is proven in court and that infraction causes serious injury to a VRU you will get a fine of \$1500, be required to attend a driving school regarding the rights of VRU's and surrender your license for 3 months. If you commit a traffic infraction and kill a VRU, your fine is \$5000, you still have to attend a VRU rights traffic class and have your driver's license suspended for a year. If you ask anyone who's been hurt and kept out of work as the result of the carelessness of some bone head that caused the accident, they would resoundingly agree that jail time should be part of the deal. I AGREE..

The victory of this law's passage is a good start in my view because we lost too many from our community as a result carelessness of cage drivers and laws that have no teeth to make sure they think about what they did. Maybe the SOB's walking or having to take a ride-share everywhere they go for a period of time might make them think a little and look out for motorcycles. The Florida House and Senate versions of the bill passed WITHOUT A SINGLE NO VOTE in either the house or the senate which suggests to me that we have some friends in Tallahassee. The Bill goes into effect on July 1, 2024.

Our heart felt thanks to all of you that took the time and picked up the phone to call your legislators.

3. REFRESH YOUR SKILLS

There was also a large concrete ramp used for moving bikes from one level to another.

The band started their first song, which was our

cue to find a few unoccupied seats. That was a problem; there weren't many left. In fact, as the evening progressed, they had to add more chairs. I mentioned people of all ages were worshipping; I saw grandmothers like me, adults, youth, moms with kids, and literally people from every walk of life. We had one thing in common though... we all came to worship Jesus. The room was full, and so was the music. Everyone was on their feet for almost the entire time we were gathered.

The worship leaders encouraged us throughout the night, but one of the highlights was when I spoke to Mark, the owner of these dealerships. I learned he was from a long line of Harley lovers. Mark learned the business from his father, who, in turn, learned from his father. The love for motorcycles obviously runs thick in the family blood; what a legacy!





Johnny and I were sitting watching a program on a new 2024 Harley Davidson. The one showing on the screen shows the dash of the new ones, when Johnny looked at me and said you know I don't like the way they look and it doesn't look like a motorcycle. He said it's just too much on the dash I mean it just something I wouldn't want to ride. I just looked at him and said we are both getting old.

On the screen, granted it had a lot of indicators a lot of lights a lot of bells and whistles and also on the steering handlebars there was a lot of buttons and levers and all kind of things that you wouldn't find on a on an old basic bike. I just told him now we are just getting set in our ways and increase technology just kind of improves as time goes on. My how things have changed in many ways.

I remember back in the old days, when Harley you parked them there was an oil slick on the ground every so often and sometimes quite often you'd have to stop and tighten up all the screws. Also back then freaking license plate would fall off and you end up using bailing wire to put it back on

Back then we also had vehicle inspections which seemed like it was an excuse for the police to pull you over. It was always hard to find a place to put it where they could easily see your sticker and reason to be stopped by the law and checked out... my how things have changed!

Now we have all these fancy bikes with multiple displays all kind of button to do all kind of weird thing on them and of course it brings the cost and complexity of repairs up.

I wrote an hour ago a few years back for the magazine stating how when anything was adding they wondered if it would be distraction from driving a car, like windshield wipers and radios. They looked into anything even though we all know that there was a few incidences of accidents, when someone was just looking down, trying to find a station on the radio and not keeping an eye on

the road.

There's one thing that I've always wondered about especially when it comes to the price of motorcycles. I was looking at the new Harley and I was thinking of cost. Granted my bike at one time had a retail price almost \$40,000, sure its 935 LB bike but it's still was \$38,000 for that bike. It had all the bells and whistles heated grips, heated seats, cruise control and upgrade sound system and with addition Chrome and custom paint.

This all got to me to think, so I did a little comparison especially with the new models. I took a look at a new base Road Glide at \$25,000. Bare minimum you know it didn't come with all the bells and whistles, but you know everything is modernized you know you got more sensors on your engine you gotta nice stereo system plus nice paint. It isn't a bare bones like the old bikes and but it's still \$25,000 and it only has two wheels and no windshield wipers.

So I decided to do a comparison. I looked up a price of a new 2024 Chevy trailblazer, it goes for about \$25,000 base price and it comes in with 4 wheel, airbags, Anti-lock brakes, nice sound system, automatic transmission and seats 4 comfortably whereas my motorcycle only seats 2. I figured out that that unit with its base price and its weight of 3029 LB was actually costing per pound price of \$8.25 a pound. Now on the other hand that 2024 road glide that I looked in it weighs in a little over nine 900 lbs which cost round the same price and cost of \$28.00 a pound, isn't that interesting The Harley costs almost four times as much per pound as a Chevy, makes you think why am I paying so much more for so much less and I know paint job on it doesn't increase it that much.



Highly respected members of the South Florida biker community along with his fellow bikers and their ladies were on hand at both occasions to honor and say goodbye to their brother and dear friend.

I'm not going to mention where the Celebration of life was, but the place was packed so many bikers, I'm pretty sure we pushed the occupancy rules hard for this location. The place stayed packed inside until it was announced that fireworks were getting set off outside in Oogie's honor.

Oogie was a decorated military veteran that served in Afghanistan during the gulf war. He was awarded numerous medals for his actions in service of his country. Like many war veterans, he did not talk about his time in the service.

His close friends said that Oogie was direct in his words with fellow bikers but once you got to know him, you could not have a better friend. You knew he considered you his friend if you got a Oogie headbutt. He liked to make people laugh and would literally give you the shirt of his back to help if you needed it. One of his close brothers recounted that he almost made one of his biker brother's wives piss her pants because he made her laugh so hard. All that I spoke to said if they were in a fix and they needed help, Oogie was the first one they'd call for help. He was widely known for being a man of his word.

Oogie was a complicated guy that sometimes kept to himself. His brothers and sisters said that he was good hearted soul as evidenced by outpouring of love on social media from those he helped that were both inside and outside the biker community. He will be sorely missed by his close brothers and sisters and his godson. All felt we lost someone that was



truly one of a kind.

Oogie's dog Redneck was really important to him. His biker brothers will care for his pup for the rest of his days.

He was a genuine dear person that once you got to know him you had to love him. Many did not know this about Oogie but he wrote poetry about his life experiences that made him the man he was. If you are wondering about the title, Oogie's thing was Norse mythology.

I hope and pray that we can find a way to safely share the road with cages so all of us don't have to go through what those close to Oogie are feeling right now. PLEASE BE SAFE OUT THERE.



9. PLAN YOUR ROUTES

Before heading out on your motorcycle, plan your routes carefully, especially if you're exploring unfamiliar areas. Use GPS navigation or maps to familiarize yourself with the roads and potential hazards along the way. Be prepared for unexpected detours or road closures, and always have a backup plan in case you need to change your route.

10. PRACTICE DEFENSIVE RIDING

Defensive riding is crucial for staying safe on Florida's roads, where traffic can be heavy and unpredictable. Stay alert, anticipate potential hazards, and maintain a safe distance from other vehicles. Be prepared to react quickly to changing conditions, and always prioritize your safety and the safety of those around you.

What to Do if You're In a Motorcycle Accident If you're involved in any type of motorcycle accident, you can follow these steps to protect yourself and your legal rights:

- 1. Check for injuries: Assess yourself and others involved for any injuries and seek medical attention if necessary.
- 2.Secure the scene: If possible, move to a safe location to prevent further accidents.
- 3.Contact emergency services: Call 911 to report the accident and request medical assistance and law enforcement to document the incident.

*Educate, don't legislate" stuff we thought you might like to know

We were sitting around the other day, talking about an upcoming ride on May 19, 2024, that one of our members, Tony, was talking about. Sheila's daughter, Alyse, also participated in this ride last year. It sounded like a fun and definitely different kind of ride, and of course, as many rides are, it is for charity. So, we wanted to write our article this month, about this upcoming ride. Most of this was taken directly from their website https://www.gentlemansride.com

The Distinguished Gentleman's Ride is a global charity that unites hundreds of thousands of classic and vintage styled motorcycle riders from all over the world to raise funds and awareness for prostate cancer research and men's mental health. The Ride was founded in Sydney, Australia, by Mark Hawwa. It was inspired by a photo of TV Show Mad Men's Don Draper astride a classic motorcycle and wearing his finest suit. Mark decided a themed ride would be a great way of connecting niche motorcycle enthusiasts and communities while raising funds to support the men in our lives. The Ride has raised over \$45 Million since 2012 and has had more than 500,000 riders from 121 countries around the world.

Founded in 2012 with 3,000 riders from 24 cities, the inaugural event, in Sydney, Australia, quickly made its way around the world with thousands of

dapper folks riding in solidarity to positively represent the global motorcycling community. By 2013, the Ride was up to 11,000 riders across 145 cities and raised over \$200,000. That year, the DGR began supporting prostate cancer research and partnered with the Prostate Cancer Foundation Australia. Then, in 2014, with now 20,000 riders, 257 cities across 58 countries, and raising \$1,500,000, the DGR began partnerships with Prostate Cancer Foundations in the United States of America, the United Kingdom, Canada, and New Zealand. That year was also when the DGR partnered with Triumph Motorcycles. In 2016, the DGR began partnering with Movember, which is a men's mental health and suicide prevention foundation. Now we skip to just last year, 2023, with 106,000 riders, \$7,450, raised, in 893 cities across 107 countries. The DGR is the world's largest on-road charity motorcycling event. That is an amazing advancement for just over 10 years




That goes to show how important, and how needed, DGR is, to help with men's prostate cancer and mental health. Prostate Cancer is the second most common cancer in men. Over 10 million men around the world are living with, or beyond, a prostate cancer diagnosis. Globally, on average, we lose one man to suicide every minute of every day. That's half a million men every year. The issue of suicide is incredibly complex. But we know this: improving overall mental health and helping men establish better social connections can re-

duce the risk of suicide.

Men's health is in crisis. Men are dying on average 4.5 years earlier than women, and for largely preventable reasons. A growing number of men – around 10.8M globally – are facing life with a prostate cancer diagnosis. Globally, testicular cancer is the most common cancer among young men. And across the world, one man dies by suicide every minute of every day, with males accounting for 69% of all suicides. Movember is uniquely placed to address this crisis on a global scale. We fund groundbreaking projects all over the world, engaging men where they are to understand what works best and accelerate change.



We're doing what others can't. We unite experts from around the world to collaborate on projects that will fundamentally change the way men in need are treated and supported. To ensure our impact is significant, far-reaching and long-lasting, we prioritize funding for the three biggest health issues facing men: mental health and suicide pre-

vention, prostate cancer and testicular cancer. Our fathers, partners, brothers and friends are facing a health crisis, yet it's rarely talked about. Men are dying too young. We can't afford to stay silent. We are the leading charity changing the face of men's health. We know what works for men – and what doesn't. The Distinguished Gentleman's Ride looks to connect all riders around the world who own and ride classic and custom style motorcycles and scooters, to dress dapper and unite in a parade through the heart of their city to raise funds and awareness for men's health. Each ride is organized by volunteer ride hosts, and each city is limited to one ride. Even if you don't do the ride, you can also sponsor a participant or donate to the event, which will contribute towards our charitable goals and benefit all men around the world. The DGR is open to all genders. Riders are to dress up in a classic, clean and simple suit. This is a themed ride, remember, you need to look like a "distinguished gentleman".

There is a lot more that you can find out if you go to the websites, and we did, just don't have enough space to put it all here. The Movember one was especially educational to us. We were happy to learn more, and really surprised at all we did not know. This Ride, in and of itself, we are sure, helps with some mental health for the participants, just by like-minded people getting together for a good cause. We all feel better when we



hang out and ride with our friends, it helps us, and this even more, since it is for a great cause. If you want to know more about the local ride, come to our April meeting, and we'll introduce you to Tony, and he will be happy to talk to you.




