

Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
 of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
 motorcycle safety and awareness.
- ▶ We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees;
 this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

PRESIDENT'S ARTICLE

I'll tell you what, for all the hard work we put in, I'm glad we finally got our safety and awareness money back after eight years of being without it. Maybe you didn't know this, but upon registration of a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, or moped, in addition to the regular fees, there is an additional \$2.50 fee that is paid for motorcycle safety education. This extra fee had been going to the DHSMV (Division of Safety and Motor Vehicles) but as of October 1, 2023, this fee, that can be more than \$1,500,000 per year, will now be going to a group of three non-for-profits, that consist of ABATE of Florida, LAMA, and American Legion Riders. There are more than 650,000 motorcyclists in Florida. We believe that this collaboration within the motorcycle communities will result in safer roads, fewer crashes, and fewer motorcycle deaths and injuries.

It sure is nice for us to have safety and awareness products to give away at our Safety Booths again. Maybe now we can get more people in the cages to notice us again. I remember years ago, when everywhere you looked, you would see a Watch Out for Motorcycles or Look Twice for Motorcycles sticker on car bumpers. Heck, we even had them on the billboards going down the Turnpike and I-95. Believe it or not, it made a big difference, motorcycle deaths and injuries were down.

I feel like ABATE is on a roll again, there is new energy. We recently got our Vulnerable Road Users Bill passed almost unanimously through the Florida House of Representatives and the Florida Senate. All we need now is for Governor DeSantis to sign it into law, and we expect that to happen soon. There will be some repercussions out there for people running us down. And it isn't just motorcyclists, vulnerable road users are also scooters, bicyclists, pedestrians, runners, construction workers, even people riding horses, which we see all the time in Davie.

It is about time we got this passed. Just sayin,' you know.

And with gas prices on the rise and cars and trucks becoming so expensive to buy, I expect more and more people will be starting to ride motorcycles and scooters. And besides the



expense, it is the best feeling, being in the wind, free!! So, the Safety Money and the Vulnerable Road Users bill will be helping even more bikers.

If you are reading this newsletter and are not a member of ABATE, we need you to join and help us make it safer to ride. Remember that everything is voluntary with ABATE. If you would like to help us, come to our next Chapter meeting, and we have a Memorial Day Event at the end of May. I always say, "it is a numbers game," that for every member we get, the politicians feel that you have three or four friends that think alike and that could be 5 votes for them. And with these two bills passing recently, you can see the power of those numbers. You don't have to own a motorcycle to join us. We have a lot of active members who don't ride, but who share the same heart for our cause. So, let's keep on keeping on, how we are going, and all pull together and make ABATE a stronger and louder voice in Tallahassee. Join us in helping make it safer for our two and three wheeled community.

Please support all your American Legions and VFWs. God Bless America, the military, and the veterans who have helped keep this Country free.

And to the younger people out there, you have the chance to inherit an organization that stands up and fights for biker rights and safety. Help us



make a difference, now, and for the future!

Vice President – Throw-back July 2022 MOTORCYCLIST PROFILING

Although profiling and stereotyping are technically different by definition, they really are quite similar. Bottom line is you're viewed guilty before being proved innocent by just the way you look or dress. Have you been pulled over by the law or not allowed into a bar or eating establishment because your wearing Colors or biker paraphernalia? It still happens all the time, if you don't believe me just go down Main Street during Daytona Bikeweek and see how many places you can walk into with Colors on. I've been rejected entrance in establishments before for just even wearing my ABATE patch!

ABATE has successfully introduced and lobbied Bills that have become laws against profiling. There are two in Florida currently on the books, FL Statute 943.1758 and FL Statute 166.0493. Although these were huge wins for ABATE and all Florida motorcyclists, during the process they became watered down. So now we want to try to strengthen them by introducing new Profiling legislation geared towards anyone wearing specifically motorcycle paraphernalia, a Patch, or just looking like a Biker. It's going to be a tough road ahead and may even take years to accomplish through the legal system, but that is what ABATE is all about, fighting for motorcyclist rights. How can you help? After mowing their lawns, many homeowners simply blow or sweep grass clippings into the street or onto the roadside without considering the potential consequences. While this may seem like a harmless act, grass clippings can create hazardous conditions for motorcyclists.

From Your Safety Director

It's been a pretty mild winter this year and we've had the opportunity this year to ride in some amazing weather this past dry season. The bad news is that the rainy season is right around the corner. That means that we all have to brush up on our wet weather skills. Riding in the rain in Florida is just a thing that we must deal with, even the most carefully planned out day trip could be hit with an unexpected storm. One of the worst rainstorms I've ever ridden in was on a day where the weather was perfect until about 4 o'clock, after that it was the apocalypse. Just another summer day in the sunshine state.

There are a few ways to make those rainy days a little easier and safer. One big difference maker is a full-face helmet. Theres nothing more important when riding than being able to see. The shield on a helmet protects your eyes and face from the falling rain and helps with visibility. They don't fog as easily as goggles or glasses, and you can clear the water while you're moving by simply turning your head. I've read in a couple of places that there are gloves that have a finger squeegee built into them as well, but I haven't seen any myself. Even if you don't usually use a full helmet most of the time, it might be a good idea to keep one around in the summer just in case.

Gloves are also important in my opinion, since they improve your grip on the handlebars, and that's almost as important as being able to see. Raingear and waterproof boots are helpful in the sense that you will be more comfortable if you are able to stay somewhat dry. If you use rain gear, try to get a type that is either brightly colored or has reflective material to help others see you. In my experience, waterproof boots only stay dry if you have rainsuit pants on, otherwise the water goes through your pants and down into the boots. I've dumped gallons of water out my shoes over the years because of this. I've been caught in the rain with my reeboks on and while

the water doesn't accumulate in them as quickly, my feet were definitely the same amount of wet. It's not unsafe to have wet feet, but it still sucks all the same.

Another important thing is not to panic when the rain starts. If a person is nervous or stiff They tend to make more mistakes. Just stay calm and use common sense, you know that your traction isn't going to be great so slow down, don't make sudden stops or turns and try to stay in a good lane position so that its easier for the cagers to see you (not that they do in the best conditions, but it's worth a try). Try not to take unnecessary chances be on the lookout for standing water, which combined with speed and worn tires could cause you to hydroplane.

I should add that you should never go out in any weather that exceeds your ability. Theres no shame in waiting for the storm to pass if it means we get to see you tomorrow.

You also have that person who thinks the person in front of them is going to slow so they decide to change positions in the middle of the ride. Don't be that person! Riding in a group just by itself has enough of its own dangers and at the beginning of the ride a person was chosen to lead so deal with it.


Yes, there may be a little shorter route or the Road Captain, God forbid, may miss a turn, just deal with it. Just stay in your position and continue to follow, for it may be a situation where your Road Captain knows something you don't! Or another example, you're in your correct position of the lane riding staggered, cruising, enjoying the ride and the person behind you zips by you! WTF. Stay in your lane and stay in your position. Park your ego, let the Road Captain of the ride lead it. If you feel you can do a better job, guess what, you lead next time or ride with a different group of friends or better yet just meet them at the destination. Trust me, the other riders will applaud you for not only are you

distracting to the rest of the group, you're making it an extremely dangerous ride for everyone else. Bottom line, choose who is going to lead the ride and deal with it and above all else stay in your place and position throughout the whole ride and Never Road Captain from Behind!

About International Female Ride Day - Origin, History and Now!

International Female Ride Day® (IFRD) is celebrated annually worldwide on the first Saturday of May. The day celebrates women motorcycle riders and is not country, group or organisationally specific – it is a globally synchronised "JUST"

RIDE!"© day, for women. Vicki Gray created IFRD for all women individually, in groups and collectively – everywhere!

Women make International Female Ride Day® their day to "JUST RIDE!"© doing what they can to promote and highlight women riders while making a positive difference for women in motorcycling and powersports everywhere.

Every woman riding on IFRD is a role model for the diverse, unique and common passion women share for motorcycling and powersports.

The day has occurred for well over a decade and a half, with the first IFRD actions in 2007. It is an all brands and all styles motorcycling happening, and extends across all borders and cultures the world over.

Marked annually on the first Saturday in May, International Female Ride Day (IFRD) is one of the most important ride days of the year to:

Highlight the number of women who ride;

Encourage other women to take up the activity; Raise awareness about women's equality in motorsports;

Celebrate women's advancements in motorsports and powersports;

Ride for accelerated gender parity.

What Is International Female Ride Day? International Female Ride Day® (IFRD) occurring on the first Saturday in May, is a global day celebrating the cultural, social and active lifestyles of women who ride and enjoy motorcycling and powersports. The day also marks a call to action for fast-tracking gender equality, awareness, and respect for women in motorcycling or motorsport.

IFRD is created and owned by Vicki Gray. It is exclusively driven by Gray through her business platform MOTORESS®, the woman rider and motorcycle enthusiast online magazine and resource. Gray is an avid motorcyclist currently residing in Canada where MOTORESS® relocated to from Amsterdam, The Netherlands. IFRD is all about riding in celebration, unity, and support – whatever that looks like globally at a local level. But one thing is for sure, IFRD has been occurring

for nearly two decades and continues to grow in strength and power, from ride to ride. IFRD promotes all women (those who identify as a woman) in motorcycling and encourages other women to take up the activity. The numbers of women motorcycle riders steadily increases, and certainly more so in recent decades (women's social values have changed, advanced, etc.) with the prominence of the IFRD occurrence. IFRD underlines this growth and the numbers.

History: International Female Ride Day International Female Ride Day® (IFRD) has been observed since 2007. It is the sole brain child of motorcyclist Vicki Gray, globally recognised motorcycling instructor, road racer, motorcycling advocate and owner of MOTORESS® the motorcycling lifestyle online magazine. The idea had been in the works since 2006 but came to reality on Friday 4 May, 2007 — the very first "JUST RIDE!"© day launched in Toronto, Ontario Canada!

IFRD initially began as a national event and took its leap in May, 2007. It was launched fully intending to be International, and so it did! IFRD instantly became participated globally right from its inaugural year. Vicki's "JUST RIDE!©" theme, the action of IFRD, caught fire and went across the border. Women motorcycle riders in Canada, across the United States, The Netherlands and Australia joined in. Embraced by thousands of women riders, IFRD made its introduction and international success. Its achievements continue to drive it forward today, now over a decade and a half later is permanently etched into every woman rider's agenda – the first Saturday in May.

In 2008 International Female Ride Day observed women riders and activities in Australia, Greece; the further reaches of North America, England and The Netherlands, France and 12 other countries including locations in Russia. Within one year IFRD became embraced, decidedly by women riders themselves – its momentum continues to this day.

Each year "the movement" continues to expand

and grow to such an extent that has truly given it a unique global status. It is the largest all inclusive, borderless campaign for female motorcyclists of its kind, and in the world.

IFRD PHOTO CONTEST & SWEEPSTAKES

Since the very first IFRD, photo sharing on IFRD has been a key and fun part of the day. Originally, a free official IFRD souvenir or memento of the day was sent to the first 100 women riders who sent in a picture of themselves by email. This had to include their motorcycle and further depicting their "JUST RIDE!" aspect of the day. The response was overwhelming!

Within the years which followed, this eventually became too costly for Vicki to afford so she designed a photo contest where sponsors and partners donate valuable items to each winner of the photo contest.


In 2018 the number of global entries caused the MOTORESS®, where the photo contest is hosted, website to crash with over 17,000 photo entries within a few hours.

The photo submissions, shares and posts on social media including the use of #IFRD hashtags, have evolved to become a treasured component of the day, photo contest or not. IFRD has accumulated an extensive image archive of women riders though the years sharing their "JUST RIDE!©" day happenings!






