

# Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- · We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness
  of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote
  motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.



# HUNTER'S RANT



I need a truck to pull my boat. The sad fact is when I looked at truck reliability, the toprated pickups are not made in the US which is disappointing. What ticks me off even more is that all truck prices almost doubled recently which is really aqgravating since I'm

in the market. \$70,000 out the door for a pickup, are you guys nutz I said to the salesman and the sales manager... You can buy a house in Pennsylvania for that.

Now with the UAW workers asking for a 4-day work week, increased salary and pension, I don't see truck prices for US made pickups coming down by any appreciable amount in the near future. Any used trucks out there that don't have ridiculous prices have over 100,000 miles on them which means the best years of that truck are behind them.

How did auto makers get away with jacking up pickup truck prices, Simple... American consumers kept buying them so the car makers kept raising prices. Those price increases went straight to the car company bottom lines and the CEO's got hefty bonuses as a result. With the UAW wanting their cut, it seems that truck prices may end up going even higher if US consumers keep buying them. To add insult to injury, most vehicles produced today have a shorter useful life than vehicles produced 20 years ago. The brand truck I currently own was a 2000 model year diesel 4x4. It was reasonably expected to have a trouble-free useful life of about 400K if maintained properly. That same truck model produced this year is considered by experts

to last only 250K without major engine repair. Why is that you ask... Simple... Planned obsolescence.

US manufacturers are not building things to last anymore. Everything from your home appliances like your refrigerator to your pickup truck is expected to need replacement sooner than ever in years past. Heck even your windshield wipers are now recommended to be replaced every 6-12 months. I remember getting a Die-Hard auto battery here in Florida that lasted over 8 years. Now you are lucky if you get 2-3 years on a car battery.

WE AS CONSUMERS NEED TO REQUIRE MORE from products and walk away from those that cost more and give us less. I walked out of the dealership and told them point blank, there was no way I was paying that much money for a pickup truck. I suspect many others feel the same way. We deserve more value for our hard-earned dollars and big corporate America isn't going to get the message if we keep buying the crap they are putting out. Tell vendors that you are not buying products that doesn't last. If enough people do that, the manufacturers will eventually get the message.

I feel better getting that out. Let me know what you think we should be doing about this problem in America, because it is a big problem..

## **LEGISLATIVE LIAISON - BRAD WINSTON:**

Brad spoke about the newly formed ACMA, American Council of Motorcycle Attorneys. Rich Newsome (also the ABATE Central Florida Chapter President) and a group of others recently met in Las Vegas to form this not-for-profit group, to help get national support, and will also help support MRF (Motorcycle Riders Foundation). They have just started but are looking forward to building this up. Someone asked if Gabe was a part of this new organization, but they are trying to get attorneys from all over the country. He said that Gabe Carrera is awesome, always helping. January 9th is the beginning of the legislative session in Tallahassee. There is one proposed bill, to make it so everyone who works on a roadway, will be considered a "agent of the state" and therefore, can't be sued. This takes away part of their incentive to maintain safety on the roads. Many roadway lawsuit cases look at roadway hazards, which can be caused by the company that maintains the road, the engineers who designed them, etc. As many know, even changes in the road level, when roads are being repaired, can be a hazard, especially to a motorcyclist. There is another bill looking to revamp insurance. Brad will be watching both of these closely, as they relate to motorcyclists.

Hello again everyone and thank you for taking the time to read my article. This month I'd like to talk about one of the most important pieces of safety equipment that we almost never think about, brakes and braking. It's something we all use, and don't really think about until it becomes an issue. My front brakes recently went out on me, and it brought this subject to my attention. When I spoke to a couple of people about it, I was actually surprised at how many different techniques people use to stop their bikes. I'll go over a few here.

I'm going to start off with the method that I use since it's the one I'm most familiar with. When I'm traveling at higher speeds or in the top part of my gears, I tend to engine brake more than anything, it's very effective, and I don't have to worry about the back wheel locking up. At lower speeds, and when coming to a complete stop, I use a lot more front brake than rear. I do it this way because I have antilock in the front and a drum in the back that locks up fairly easily. One of the more tense moments I've had on this bike was the first time I locked that rear brake up and the back of the bike tried to swing around to the front. I used to do this deliberately on dirt bikes when I was a kid, but these heavier cruisers aren't so forgiving.

One of the people that I spoke to had just recently switched from a racing bike to a cruiser. They told me that these days, on the cruiser they were more reliant on the front brakes than the rear. He made a great point in saying the weight of the bike has a lot to with that. I remember when I had my Kawasaki, if I used only the front brake, the back would lift off the ground a little. That doesn't seem to be of much concern with the cruisers.

A couple of the people that I spoke to very religiously use the engine brake method to slow down most of the way and then feather the front brake and press heavy on the back ones to come to a complete stop. The point here is, there is no wrong way to use your brakes as long as you effectively stop the bike before it hits something. I just found it interesting that people had so many different takes on how to do it.


I'm just sitting here thinking about my past, these holiday times seem to have a lot of us pulling out our old memories, most good, but some, just sad, missing people who should be here with us. I was remembering, 51 years ago, that I lost one of my close buddies Johnny Genther, when we were 14 and 15 years old. We weren't even old enough to drive, we used to ride our little dirt bikes up and down the country roads of upstate New York. He had a Hodaka, and I had a Honda SL 350 on and off road. We always used to ride on the rural country roads. It was great, no vehicles, and very few police. The only thing we had to worry about was the town constable and that was mostly when we skipped school. The area was very rural at time. If the police did try and chase us, we had trails everywhere.

Anyway, I wasn't with him at the time when he lost his life, thank goodness, but he was playing chicken with some other kid on their bikes, and neither one was "chicken", and needless to say, they both lost their young lives that day. I had forgotten this memory until I was looking at my bedroom wall and I have a picture of Dave Carter, God, how I miss him, you know him, from Mickey's. And Johnny Genther just popped into my head. I remember how cool he was even if he was younger than me.

So, I guess what I'm saying is, you guys gotta be super safe out there because none of us are invincible like we thought we were when we were kids. I've been cracking the throttle since I was 10 years old, and I never plan on stopping until my ride is over. I am glad that I am not a 15-year-old kid today. Nowadays there are just too many cages on the roads. I worry about all those crazy kids riding their dirt bikes in a pack on the South Florida roads. They just don't realize how easy it is to be taken out by a cage or just trying to get a thrill, and miss seeing something, and then they are down, and gone, forever.

Another friend, my best friend of more than 30 years, Frankie Battaglio, was tragically hit and killed by a cage making a turn. He raced dirt bikes, even qualifying for a professional Daytona race. He was one of the best riders I have ever seen. His death weighed heavy on me, and it ultimately led me to step up for ABATE. We have to, all of us, do everything we can to educate the cagers, to WATCH for us.

## \*Educate, don't legislate" stuff we thought you might like to know

This year is the 33rd Annual SFPC Toys in the Sun Run. Wow!! That is amazing!! Almost everyone in South Florida knows about this event, even if they don't participate. Many spectators line the run routes to wave and cheer the riders on. We were sitting around and talking about all the Toy Runs we have been on, and it got us thinking about the history of our Toys in the Sun Run, and Toy Runs, in general.

Here's what we found out...

.

Toys for Tots began in 1947 as the brainchild of Marine Corps Reserve Major Bill Hendricks. Actually, it was his wife, Diane, who was the real inspiration. She had a few handcrafted dolls and asked Bill to deliver them to an agency that supports children in need. When Bill reported back to his wife that he could not find such an organization, she instructed him to "start one!". Maj Hendricks and the Marines in his reserve unit in LA collected and distributed 5,000 toys in 1947. Seeing such successful community engagement in 1947, the Commandant directed all Marine Reserve Sites to implement a TFT campaign transforming it into a national community action program in 1948. Bill Hendrick's civilian job was Director of Public Relations at Warner Brothers Studios. He was friends with many celebrities who he asked to help support the newly created Marine Toys for Tots Program. As a personal friend and as a favor to Bill, Walt Disney designed the first Toys for Tots poster which included a miniature three-car train that was subsequently adopted as the Toys for Tots logo. Presently, the Marine Toys for Tots Program distributes an average of 18 million toys to 7 million less fortunate children annually. (www.toysfortots.org)



But when did motorcycles get involved?

1976: in Sacramento, CA, the Modified Motorcycle Association held its 1st annual Toys for Tots ride. The run benefits the largest Toys for Tots Foundation in the state.

1977: In Pueblo, CO, the Pueblo Bikers United started the Pueblo Toy Run. This Run also compliments the October Toy Bowl, generating money and gifts for children and adolescents throughout the county.

1979: in Tulsa, OK, ABATE of Tulsa held its first Toy Run with the US Marine Corps "Toys for Tots" and have helped raise thousands of toys for children in Northeast Oklahoma.

1980: in Wichita, KS, the Wichita Toy Run was initiated by members of the Kansas Modified Bike Association (KMBA), an association of local motorcycle riders.

1984: in Brighton, England, in June 1984, the first Toy Run at the International Harley-Davidson Super Rally was held. The parade was a loop from one end of Brighton Beach to the other and was attended by notables such as Willie G. Davidson (grandson of Harley-Davidson co-founder William A. Davidson) himself!

1987: in Los Angeles, CA, the annual L.A. Toy Run benefiting the Ronald McDonald House Charities began. This Toy Run benefits homeless children and is hosted by Harley Davidson of Glendale and ABATE Local #1.

We could go on and on......It's a National Biker Tradition!

Listing every toy run nationally would be nearly impossible. There are Toy Runs in every single state, usually starting in late November and running through mid-December.

Some Toy Runs are small, and others are of epic proportions. So, let's bring it local now...

In 1987, the Toy Run had its start and at that time everyone was doing a toy drive, Veterans, Police, Motorcycle Clubs, Kiwanis, etc. Bob Amchir, being President of Wings of Gold Motorcycle Club, got everyone together to have one big toy drive. The first year netted \$965 cash and a little over 500 toys. There were about 700 motorcycles participating in the first event. It has grown over the years to epic proportions, with 30+ motorcycle clubs and organizations helping. Over the years, the SFPC Toys in the Sun Run has raised over \$20 million in toys and \$10 million in cash for Joe DiMaggio's Children's Hospital Foundation. Also in the past 25 years it has not only given millions of dollars in toys to needy children and money to the Hospital, but has also donated over \$200,000 to COPS Kids (Concerns of Police Survivors), \$10,000 to Shott Memorial, \$124,00 to the Boys & Girls Clubs, and so on. Not only does this yearly Toy Run help thousands of children, but adults as well. Part of the donations also benefit Cystic Fibrosis, Juvenile Diabetes, Cancer, Pre-Natal and much more. Because of the commitment to the community it is a huge undertaking, and not only for the health and well-being of people, but also has reached wonderful and humane goals.

Then we really got to reminiscing about past Toy Runs we have attended.

#### From Little Bit:

My first Toys for Tots Run was in 1993 or 1994 in Southern Florida. It was such a beautiful, exciting feeling, riding with so many thousands of bikes. One year, I'll never forget, we were all riding, and all of a sudden, a big ole biker had to pull over to relieve himself. He had a humungous white bear on his back and all you could see was this bear running. So many beautiful memories and such a great cause for the kids to have beautiful memories.

### From Sandy:

The Annual Toy Run brings together thousands of bikers who share the same goal, through the gift of a new toy, to help bring joy to America's less fortunate children. I have had so much fun at all the Toy Runs that I have attended, but beneath that fun is also a sense of being there for something bigger, helping children

#### From Dawne:

What the Toy Run means to me, is the children waking up in the hospital with gifts that were all donated from brothers and sisters from all walks of life, volunteering their time, coming together as one united, with one goal in common, to raise as much money and gifts for these children as we possibly can. We've got people that come in from all different states to come support Joe DiMaggio's Children's Hospital, that we get to see every year during this time. We've been doing it even with the elements, whether it be cold, piping hot, pouring rain, nothing has gotten in the way of raising money and gifts for these children

#### From Sheila:

I have been going to the SFPC Toys in the Sun Run for over 10 years now. I have loved each one for different reasons. In the first few years, I rode in the parade, with my grown daughter on the back of my bike. Then, when I joined ABATE, I worked the event at our booth/tent. That was really great, because I always ran into friends that I hadn't seen all year, but they were there for the same cause as me, the children. I also have

some friends who really work the event, for the SFPC, and have seen how much work these guys and gals put into putting it all together. It is really amazing. They give their hearts for the kids.

In closing, always remember, Toy Runs are for charity! Sadly, sometimes people look at bikers with prejudice, but the Toy Runs help buck those old stereotypes of mean, grizzled bikers. The people that participate in the Toy Runs, those "bikers" are by and large some of the most thoughtful, kind, giving people you could ever hope to run across. And these aren't usually people with a lot of money, but they give their time and the little extra money they have, for the kids. They raise millions of dollars for needy families across America. Bikers and motorcycle clubs have organized and participated in Toy Runs for decades. The motivation is the sense of duty towards community that is ingrained into the biker lifestyle. It also speaks to the sense of protection towards children that exists in almost every biker and club member. Children are truly innocent.




