

#### Some of ABATE of Florida, Inc.'s Accomplishments

- On July 1, 2000, we had the 30 year old Florida Helmet law repealed; July 1, 2020 was our 20th Anniversary of Freedom of Choice.
- We've become the 4th largest State Motorcycle Rights Organization (MRO) in the country (IN & IL are 1&2, we regularly switch for 3rd & 4th with PA).
- · We got the handlebar heights law modified.
- We successfully fought a bill that would forbid our children from riding on our bikes.
- We successfully fought the bill that would confiscate motorcycles for going 30MPH over the speed limit.
- We developed an effective MSAP program that has raised motorist's perceptions and awareness of motorcycles, and have received funding from the State of FL totaling over \$750,000 to promote motorcycle safety and awareness.
- We successfully fought the bill against vertical tags that had over \$1,100 in fines for a first offense.
- Supported and fought for a texting-while-driving ban for the last few years.
- Our 2009-2010 Stiffer Penalties Bill made it through five of the FL House & Senate's committees; this is the farthest it has gone in the number of years we have tried. On the last day of session, a committee member strenuously attempted to attach a revival of the helmet law to our Bill. To avoid a new helmet law in Florida, we had to kill the Bill.
- We publish monthly Press Releases and/or Articles of Interest in many online & print publications, including Florida Full Throttle.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. has been asked to be on and currently sits as a member of The Motorcyclist Advisory Council (MAC) to the Federal Highway Administration in Washington, D.C. The Secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Transportation may appoint a representative from only two State MROs throughout the entire U.S.A. to be on this council.
- The President of ABATE of Florida, Inc. sits as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Collation of Motorcyclists (NCOM). NCOM has over 1000 member organizations.

### PRESIDENT'S ARTICLE

I would first like to thank everyone who showed up at our Semi-Annual event at the Boar's Nest. This was very important to us because we recently had our trailer stolen, and we lost everything!!! I'll talk about that more in my rant.

On February 11th, we have our State meeting in Tallahassee, and then February 12th, we have ABATE's Annual Ride to the Capital. It's pretty cool. We get a police escort all the way to the Capital. And we get to park in the Courtyard between the old Capital building and the new one. We set out a giant American Flag, flags for all of our Armed forces, and a MIA/POW flag. Then we do the Pledge of Allegiance and then we ring a bell and say the names of all our fallen brothers and sisters from last year. Then we go into the Capital, around to all of the representatives and senators and let them know about the bills we are trying to pass, and let them know who we are, voters!!! This year we are trying to pass a bill that will have stronger consequences for drivers who hurt vulnerable road users. The Senate bill is 1528 and the House bill is 1133. The way the law is right now, if the driver is not on drugs or alcohol and have legal driver's license, the only fine they get for killing and maiming us is a \$65 fine. And that's what our families will get to bury us, or to pay for our hospital stay, that ain't cool. Don't get me wrong. I don't want to see grandma or grandpa go to jail because they pulled out in front of a motorcyclists and hit them, but I do think they should get some consequences for that. They should pay a hefty fine, maybe get house arrest and loss of a driver's license and have to take safety courses to get their license back. I mean,

they just can't drive away with a \$65 dollar fine. Something has to change, you know.

Back to the ride to Tallahassee, and now you see why we do what we do, anybody can come, and everybody is



welcome. The more motorcycles we have on this ride, the louder our voice will be heard in Tallahassee. So we need everyone to try and take a few days off of work and ride up there. The only way we can truly make the road safer Is to get bills passed, and educate the public. We want our "Watch Out for Motorcycles" and "Look Twice for Motorcycles" signs out there.



#### VICE-PRESIDENT

Our health care system is a mess. One of the top reasons for personal bankruptcy behind job loss is medical bills. On average doctors' compensation according to at December 31, 2023 survey by Medscape indicated that US doctors' average compensation is \$352,000 compared to Canada with \$273,000 and Europe's highest, Germany at \$160,000. The survey did indicate that education In the US and Canada was 2-3 years longer than the other regions mentioned above and the number of doctors per capita was lower in the US than other developed countries.

According to Investopedia, the drug and health-care & product industry spend \$5.17 billion dollars on lobbying efforts over the last 24 years in an effort to get favorable laws and regulations enacted. This top spot was followed by the insurance industry at \$3.3 billion dollars which includes health and other forms of insurance.

There seems to be a common factor that when a service is covered by insurance, costs tend to be higher on those services in the industry. This is true in auto repair, healthcare and other industries as well. If you show up to the emergency room the first question you are asked is do you have insurance and in the case of injury, did you get hurt at work.

Health Insurance companies negotiate prices that they will pay for services provided to their insured customers. Once services are rendered you ordinarily get a statement that indicates the billed rate and the discount rate that you pay if you are subject to a co-pay and or deductible on your insurance policy. Those differences can be and usually are substantial. My question is why? Why are health care providers allowed to charge people without insurance many times what insurance or Medicare reimbursement allows.

Healthcare should not cost you more if you do not have insurance. That is just morally wrong on so many levels. The healthcare industry claims that innovation in treatment methodologies and the need to treat the uninsured costs are covered by... Essentially those who can pay.... the bankruptcy rate suggests.... that they can't afford it. Government does pick up the tab in the form of Medicaid for some of those who are unable to pay, but that still doesn't encourage the health care industry from charging at least twice as much to those without insurance for same services.

The other day I was at a doctor's office and I needed an Air cast for my leg. The assistant came out with two sizes still wrapped in plastic to size me up and asked me to sign a Medicare document. She wasn't aware I wasn't on Medicare yet.. The charge for this Air Boot to government sponsored Medicare was approximately \$320. I got the same EXACT BOOT at Amazon for about \$90 delivered.

By the way if you are wondering who is picking up the tab to cover the healthcare costs of the millions if illegal immigrants in our country, it's the taxpayers getting the bill.

BOTTOM LINE Here in the state of Florida we do not allow individuals to gouge us during times of emergency like a hurricane. Vendors who charge you too much for gas or a bag of ice can face stiff penalties for doing so. I consider a medical emergency such as a disease or broken bone no less an emergency and I feel should be subject to the same type of price gouging scrutiny as a gallon of gas or a bag of ice.

WHEN ARE WE THE PEOPLE GOING TO INSIST SOMETHING CHANGES. If the high costs resulting in personal bankruptcy in large numbers isn't enough.. I don't know what is.

I feel better getting that out. Let me know what you think we should be doing about this problem in America, because it is a big problem..

# <u>SAFETY DIRECTOR'S REPORT –</u> <u>KRIS "THAT GUY" KEYZER-ANDRE</u>:

That Guy discussed the recent accidents and crowded roads, and reminded us that it is still dangerous out there and to be careful. He then talked in-depth about the current push to end combustion engines and the continuing importance of what ABATE means for motorcyclists.

#### STATE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT -JOHNNY ROSE & MARTIN "HUNTER" NEBOJSIC:

Johnny discussed his recent meeting with Kirk "Hardtail" Willard, the current president of the MRF and all that they do for motorcyclists. He spoke about the various efforts at the national level to limit our rights as motorcyclists, especially the right to repair and modify our motorcycles and also the push to end the internal combustion engine. That Guy reminds us that the greatest thing about the United States is the freedom to make a choice and live your life as you see fit. If you choose to buy a combustion engine or an electric vehicle, that choice should be yours. Ross mentioned that Ohio recently passed legislation which banned the state of Ohio from adopting a ban similar to what was recently enacting in the State of California. So it appears, motorcyclists in the State of Ohio will be free to choose a little longer, as long as we can come together and stand with the MRF to prevent a national version of the same ban.

# <u>Legislative Liaison & Legal Counsel –</u> <u>Brad Winston:</u>

Brad discussed how the insurance industry got a big gift from the state of Florida. A gift which is bad for us. They were able to pass legislation that limits a motorcyclist's chances of being adequately compensated for damages suffered in an accident. This legislation only benefits the insur-

ance companies. He also discussed some great work he's been doing with a national organization of motorcycle attorneys, of which he is a founding member, and invited Richard Freeburn, motorcyclist and attorney from Pennsylvania who was in attendance to reach out to discuss those continuing national efforts further.

Brad also discussed ongoing legislation, which if passed, would allow contractors and subcontractors to be covered under the same umbrella of sovereign immunity that currently protects both the State and their inspectors from lawsuits. These bills would provide a \$200,000 cap, no matter the level of resulting damage and associated expenses. The on-going efforts and need to prevent these bills from moving forward was discussed.

#### PRODUCTS REPORT - ROSS HAERTTER:

We are currently waiting on an order of long-sleeve t-shirts and will soon be considering ordering a limited amount of short sleeve t-shirts, both the black & white and the popular color shirt. However, prior to any order, a survey will be taken to see if any active members require shirts and that will be considered when placing the next order. We will be keeping the volume of inventory fairly low going forward. Sheila also informs the group that the vendor said they do have a few patches in stock, so those at least will be available for the upcoming semi-annual.

#### MEMBERSHIP REPORT - SHEILA ROSE:

Sheila read the membership report and discussed the total number of members, and the amount of new members and renewals.

She also said to reach out and go see Lee and Laurie, they are happy to have and appreciate visitors from the community.

#### **EVENTS COORDINATOR – GABE CARRERA:**

Gabe was excused.

#### **NEWSLETTER EDITOR – ADA HIBBS:**

Ada let us know that we have one week to get articles and photos in for the newsletter. Make sure to include the what, why, where and who for all submitted photos. Also, everyone who receives the unpublished copy of the newsletter for review, make sure you review it before it goes to print.

#### **NEWSLETTER DISTRIBUTION – TONY CANTY:**

Tony has been working to decrease lag time and increase efficiency, and it distribution is going smoothly. # From Your Safety Director

Hello again everyone and thank you for taking the time to read my article. This month I'd like to talk about one of the most important pieces of safety equipment that we almost never think about, brakes and braking. It's something we all use, and don't really think about until it becomes an issue. My front brakes recently went out on me, and it brought this subject to my attention. When I spoke to a couple of people about it, I was actually surprised at how many different techniques people use to stop their bikes.I'll go over a few here.

I'm going to start off with the method that I use since it's the one I'm most familiar with. When I'm traveling at higher speeds or in the top part of my gears, I tend to engine brake more than anything, it's very effective, and I don't have to worry about the back wheel locking up. At lower speeds, and when coming to a complete stop, I use a lot more front brake than rear. I do it this way because I have anti-lock in the front and a drum in the back that locks up fairly easily. One of the more tense moments I've had on this bike was the first time I locked that rear brake up and the back of the bike tried to swing around to the front. I used to do this deliberately on dirt bikes when I was a kid, but these heavier cruisers aren't so forgiving.

One of the people that I spoke to had just recently switched from a racing bike to a cruiser. They told me that these days, on the cruiser they were more reliant on the front brakes than the rear. He made a great point in saying the weight of the bike has a lot to with that. I remember when I had my Kawasaki, if I used only the front brake, the back would lift off the ground a little. That doesn't seem to be of much concern with the cruisers.

A couple of the people that I spoke to very religiously use the engine brake method to slow down most of the way and then feather the front brake and press heavy on the back ones to come to a complete stop. The point here is, there is no wrong way to use your brakes as long as you effectively stop the bike before it hits something. I just found it interesting that people had so many different takes on how to do it.







### LESSONS LEADNED



The motorcycle community encompasses the most supportive people I know. We go from club to club, seeing some of the same faces at every event. Yet, how many of us take the time to get to know those we frequent?

I enjoy hearing your stories. We all come from such different walks of life. Our experiences shape who we are, how

we think, and how we relate to one another. But we'll never know what intriguing tales lie behind those familiar faces unless we ask. So lately, I've been doing just that: asking questions so we can get to know one another.

So far, I've found that many of us are hard-working individuals just trying to make it one day at a time. We leave our leathers on the hook, and most of us either punch a clock, snag a shift, or work in our own business. Some of us are finally enjoying retirement, too. 
Even though the disease didn't seem to phase him or those around him, Naaman kept going about his business. On one of his raids, a young Israelite woman was taken captive who suggested he see the prophet Elisha, who was known to heal people. Naaman was willing to try just about anything, so he made the journey to Samaria. (This trip might have been equal to a visit to one of those obscure clinics you hear about in Mexico!)

Elisha's prescription for healing turns out to be quite unusual. The prophet tells Naaman to wash in the Jordan River seven times, and he will be healed. What would you do? I'd wash, but Naaman is unsure of the river and what might lurk in its waters. He complains to Elisha, asking why he can't wash in his local river.

Naaman's friends reason with him, and Naaman finally does what the prophet says, rising out of the river a completely healed man. Wow! What a story worth retelling!



The turnout for last year's ride was exceptional, with 50 beautiful ladies ready to ride and celebrate the day. We enjoyed an escorted ride to Jimmy Johnson's Big Chill in Key Largo for lunch. Behind the scenes, extensive preparation and thoughtful planning go into making this event special – from selecting the venue and route to securing a professional photographer to capture the day's essence. My goal is to create a memorable experience for all participating ladies.

Riding empowers me, and I'm passionate about inspiring other women to feel the same. Riding with these wonderful ladies on this special day brings immense joy, and my top priority is ensuring their safety and fostering the bonds of sisterhood. The connections and friendships that have flourished through this yearly event are a source of pride.

Excitement builds for this year's ride, and I eagerly anticipate the participation of even more ladies. Let's come together, support one another, and embrace our full potential on this exhilarating journey





\*Educate, don't legislate" stuff we thought you might like to know

We were sitting around the other day, bitching a little, you can imagine, about our stolen trailer. Sometime overnight, between Saturday, January 20th and Sunday, January 21st, some thief stole our ABATE trailer. We keep it parked out back of an American Legion, and there are 3 or 4 other trailers also kept there. This location is also directly behind a city hall. We have had this trailer for many years, donated to us by a beloved member, and it is painted nicely with our logo, and once a year, we do a "trailer" clean-out, where we spend a day pulling everything out, doing inventory, checking everything, and repacking it back. We also have a few members who check it for maintenance, making sure we have good tires, etc., just really taking care of this trailer, like it is our own, and it is, OURS. It's not brand new, but it's kept well, and it is OURS, and also all of our members, and all the members across the State, as we are one big family. We had everything in there that we needed to set up for events, to set up our Safety Booth, our products to sell, and on and on. We were really mad, and still are, if truth be told.

We don't think you all want to read an article about us being mad, mentally cussing and kicking things, but what came up while we were talking about this, what kept keep coming through, was how people have been stepping up and being so caring and kind about it. Time and again,

we have seen this, individuals and our community (meaning the Florida biker community), demonstrating that the worst situations tend to bring out the best in people and the organizations to which they belong. In every moment of darkness, it seems, there are countless moments of light — small gestures of compassion and connection that allow people to show who they are, how they want to live, and what matters to them.

We had our Chapter meeting on January 21st, which is when our President, Johnny Rose, discovered the theft. He was SO mad, more than anyone else, we think. He dealt with doing the police report, and letting people know. And then our meeting, wow, we were surprised, even though we know how amazing our group is. It wasn't even half an hour into the meeting when several of our members spoke up and pledged to donate some significant money, for the replacement of our trailer and the contents. Now, at this point, we were still hopeful we would find the thief and get all of our stuff back, so this was big.

Ada, who manages our Facebook page, right away, even during the meeting, started posting about it, with a picture of the trailer, thinking the sooner the better, while the thief's trail was still hot, at least we hoped so. By the end of our meeting, she had so many shares and people commenting and even updating the post with more information. Since then, everywhere we go, people are coming up to us, asking, with concern and care, about the trailer. We have had a few more pledges for the trailer and replacing what was stolen.

This coming together of the community, the love that we feel, is truly amazing. In her book, A Paradise Built in Hell, Rebeccas Solnit writes "The history of disaster demonstrates that most of us are social animals, hungry for connection, as well as for purpose and meaning. A truly dire situation, as tragic as it is, drags us into emergencies that require we act, and act altruistically, bravely, and with initiative in order to survive or save our neighbors, no matter how we vote or what we do

for a living."

The theft of our trailer, while being a pretty rotten thing, does not, in any way, compare to other tragic things that many of us have experienced, especially loss of a human life, a friend, a brother or sister, mother, father, etc., and these losses seem to happen more in our community, where we have a lot of risk, riding the roads with distracted drivers. And we see, during these times, the coming together of our community, the sense of unity, the greater appreciation for life and loved ones, and the increased capacity for altruism, empathy, and the desire to act for the greater good.

In less than two months, we already had three of our members go down, in accidents while riding, and none were at fault, and thank God, than all are still alive and will recover, although a long recovery. We think, too, that because our community deals with more of these kinds of tragedies, that our sense of unity is greater, even in normal times. Sure, we all like to get together for events and we laugh and tell stories, listen to some good music, and then, later in the same year, or even same month, we are getting together over a hospital bed or at a funeral. The family feeling is there, at both. You know that if you want to celebrate, your "family" is there, and when you are falling, with a feeling of loss or hopelessness, your "family" is there to hold you, to pick you up, not let you face it alone. We love to be reminded of this, and it's always with us.

So you know, Johnny Rose is still very mad, as are others, but I (Sheila) remind Johnny to look around, and see all the others who are also mad, and who are supporting us, not financially so much, but in brotherhood and camaraderie, so he sees that the burden is shared, like he doesn't have to be so mad, since others are also mad with him. I really hope the thief is caught and gets what he (or she) deserves.




