

Rumble earned his Trick Dog Advanced title in March. He had a great time learning the tricks needed to earn this title, and with this title he also qualified for the Versatility Certificate (VC) from the Lagotto Romagnolo Club of America. The LRCA versatility awards program is designed to recognize Lagotti that have distinguished themselves in the breed ring and in recognized performance events. These dogs possess the conformation, temperament, intelligence, scenting and working capabilities which represent the essential characteristics of the breed. There are three levels of LRCA versatility awards: Versatility Certificate (VC), Versatility Excellent (VX) award, and Versatility Champion (VCH) award. These versatility awards are based on a point system which is used to weight each title based on its difficulty. Versatility points are awarded for the achievements in each of the categories. The dog must earn 1 point in at least 5 of the categories to qualify for a Versatility award (VC or VCX). To earn a VCH award at least 2 points must be earned in the Scent Skills category. A total of 30 points for a Versatility Certificate (VC). The Versatility Excellent Certificate (VCX) requires a total of 40 points. The Versatility Champion Certificate (VCH) requires a total of 50 points.

- 2) Dock Diving: DJ
- 3) Rally: RN
- 4) CGC/Trick Dog: CGC, CGCA, CGCU, ATT, TKN, TKI, TKA
- 5) Coursing: BCAT
- 6) Scent Skills: SWN, RATN

Tracking Champion!

This girl continues to blow me away. We started our tracking training late in 2016, but then had to step away from it because life and work got in the way. When we picked it back up in 2021 it was like riding a bike for Lira...she remembered everything, including how much she enjoyed it. We passed our Tracking Dog (TD) test in December, our Tracking Dog Excellent (TDX) test in February and now in March Lira has passed her **Variable Surface Tracking** (VST) test. All three were passed on our first try!

Our track layer was Bob Long and our VST test was held at Southwestern College. It was a challenging track, with a lot of the course on asphalt. At one point, when I knew we had to be relatively close to the end...Lira seemed to get lost on the track (or maybe I missed her signals!) and we spent about 15 minutes trying to retrace our steps and get back on track. After a lot of patience and encouragement, she did it and then was quickly able to lead me right to the last article.

A huge thanks to Judge Sally and Judge Stuart, and of course our trainers Kay and Aly for all of the practice tracks they laid down for us!

Passing the VST earns Lira her very first prefix title of **Champion Tracker (CT)** and I also learned she is only the 3rd Lagotto to earn this title. I am so proud of my girl!

VST stands for Variable Surface Tracking Title. The track is 600 to 800 yards long with four to eight turns, is aged three to five hours, and covers three different ground surfaces, mimicking an urban environment. Read more about Tracking
