ST. PIRAN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH, JOS 2023 GROUPS' REPORTS FOR VESTRY MEETING 2024

A. FELLOWSHIPS:

1. Men's Fellowship:

Bible Studies: This year, we studied Paul's Epistle to the Galatians, which could rightly be called a document of freedom. The simple gospel is that God graciously offers us eternal salvation from sin and death through Christ Jesus completed work of payment for sin, reversal of death, and the redemption of all who trust him. We are saved by faith in Christ, not by religious observances or activities or following any rules. When we come to faith, God's Holy Spirit comes to live in us, and the more we yield every part of us to be occupied by him, the more we are transformed into the image of Christ. We occasionally split into small groups during Bible studies this year to facilitate more participation in the discussion of the passage under study.

Fasting and Prayers: We continued to meet in the homes of various members on the first Friday of most months to get to know one another better and pray for each other, and especially for our hosts. We generally break our fast together following prayers and enjoy relating to one another in a relaxed setting.

Visitation: The fellowship undertook to minister to our shepherds by paying a welcome visit to our new Curate, Rev. Canon Abishai Gaiya, and his family and also a visit to our Vicar, Ven. Austin Eboh, and his family. We also visited other members of the fellowship that were sick: Dr. Bitto, Mr. Akande, Mr. Okafor, Mr. Omiunu, and Prof. Akerele. We condoled with Rev. Ogochukwu on the loss of his mother and with the family of our late brother, Major Bala Gotom. The fellowship also participated in celebrating the marriages of Tochukwu Ikeh, Owen Greene, Dotun Fasanya, Kenedy Shaiyen, Mike Ruek, and others.

Combined Programs with the Women's Fellowship: It is encouraging to include spouse in some of our gatherings. Nearly every month this year the Men's and Women's fellowships had a combined program on one Friday evening. These included general prayer and praise; talks with discussion on the topics of cancer, showing affection to our spouses, parenting, ideals of a Christian home, facing current realities (fuel subsidy removal); and an End of year love feast.

Archdeaconry Men's Fellowship: St. Piran's men welcomed the men from the rest of the churches in the Jos South Archdeaconry to join us for fellowship one evening in the first quarter of the year. The evening included an exhortation by the Vicar, prayers for the gubernatorial elections, and light refreshment.

Diocesan Men's Fellowship: We received the Primate's announcement that the Christian Men's Fellowship uniform throughout the Church of Nigeria is now white on white. St. Piran's Men's Fellowship was privileged this year to have three of her members elected to the Diocesan Christian Men's Fellowship Exco: Barr. Kayode Ogundere, Vice President under the Bishop; Mr. Abayomi Odegbami, Financial Secretary; Mr. Uche Okpata, PRO. We also participated in several Diocesan CMF activities, hosting a health talk, and joining in other talks, a Bible quiz, the annual conference, and a mission outreach in Jos East.

Ministering to Orphans: This year we paid a visit to the Kids With a Vision orphanage in Zarmaganda. One member shared his testimony of salvation and getting to know God through the Scriptures and another shared a brief exhortation. We then fielded a

few questions from the children. We left the orphanage with a gift of some foodstuffs, toiletries, and cash, and followed up by purchasing NIV Bibles for the children who indicated they did not have one.

Father's Day Celebration: This year's celebration kicked off with a talk on Financial Management in the Christian Home by Mr. Williams Ukeh on Friday evening. The Saturday picnic at the church was blessed with dry weather and included a treasure hunt, a laughter-filled scoop hunt, a boisterous game of musical chairs, a drama and recitations by St. Piran's High School students, and a meal of jollof rice or semovita and *egusi* soup, beef or chicken, and *moimoi*. Mr. Abayomi Odegbami conducted the thanksgiving service on Sunday, while Ven. Dr. Eboh brought a sermon on the Love of the Father from the parable of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15:11-24. Thanks to the other groups in the Church, particularly the women and children, that played active roles in the celebration! We pray that God will continue to bless them.

Exco Elections: The current Executive Committee of the fellowship concludes its first tenure of two years in January 2024 is eligible for a final two-years term if reelected. The Exco will soon be dissolved to make way for elections in January.

4. Mission Team

The mission team held its first meeting for the year on 7th of February 2023. At its first meeting, the group agreed that we would have to invite the Vicar to tell us the area of interest of the Church so that the group would focus its evangelism activities on that area. The group was privileged to have the Vicar be in attendance at our meeting which was very encouraging to the group. The Vicar told the group that the church is focusing on Calvary Church Tudun Wada. Hence, we should focus our mission work on Calvary Church. The group then immediately got in touch with the Vicar of Calvary Church Tudun Wada to help fix a meeting for the Mission Team and the members of his church hence all members of the Mission Team will worship at his church on Sunday, so that the meeting will commence.

Outcome of the meeting

The summary of the observations made were as follows:

- i. Most members of the Church left the church after the collapse of the Church building.
- ii. Church services were held in a compacted class room, which was not conducive.
- iii. The building of the new church structure block work had been completed and remaining the decking of the altar area which the vicarage is to be built had put a lot of financial pressure on the members which further resulted to more members leaving the church.
- iv. The mission team proposed to the members of the church to work along with the group to commence door to door evangelism within the Tudun Wada general area.

Resolution

The following resolutions were made at the meeting:

- i. The Mission Team should help talk to St. Piran's Church for financial support towards the decking of the altar and the building of the Vicarage on it and the roofing of the entire building.
- ii. The meeting agreed that once door to door evangelism commences and people are brought to the church in its current situation the new members will be thinking that it's their finance that is our interest to finish the church structure. Hence, they will also leave the church. Hence, the need to roof the church before the commencement of the door to door evangelism.

The mission Team then sent a delegation to the Vicar to inform him of the challenges at hand at Calvary Church which will require the intervention of St. Piran's Church before any evangelism activities can commence in the area.

After our deliberation with Vicar he informed us of his observation that it was not proper to have the Vicarage built on top of the Altar and the estimate for the roofing using iron rafters was on the high side since wood could handle it. He then promised to discuss the issue with the Vicar of Calvary Church.

The mission team sent a delegation the second time to the Vicar to know what was happening and, if possible, the Vicar should inform members of St. Piran's Church for possible assistance towards the roofing of the church. Bringing this issue up will create a lot of burden on the members of the Church; hence we should give him some time to see when it's appropriate to bring up the issue with the church.

At this stage, the mission team could not continue with the evangelism work at Calvary Church. The leadership of the church had advised the mission team to reduce the frequency of our meeting from weekly to twice a month to make more members of the church participate in our activities. This advice was then implemented, and members of the mission team were encouraged to go on with their individual evangelism activities, and we met every two weeks to encourage one another in the Word and prayers. We also shared successes and challenges we faced. We also visited some of our out-station churches. Members carried out such visits with their personal vehicles. We are still trusting God for more members to join us.

It is our prayers that the church would look into the issue of the Calvary Church Tudun Wada building in the New Year to enable us commence our evangelism activities in the area and also to help the life of the church. The mission Team wants to go ahead with evangelism activities in the new year, we have two options to look for another mission field in the new year as the group wants to go out for evangelism in the new year but that would be a great regret for group to abandon what we have started in Calvary Church, it's our desire that a roof is put up on the church to enable us commence our evangelism work.

The Exco of the mission team proposed an election for the group, but the members turned it down and in a unanimous decision that the present Exco should continue as the Exco of the group.

The mission team is still trusting God for a bus. We appreciate members of the church who have donated towards this goal. May the Lord bless them in Jesus name.

The St. Piran's Security Committee (SPSC) was revised towards the end of 2022 and took off in January, 2023 with the following members:

The inaugural meeting of the committee was held 26th June 2022 and activities of the SPSC were reviewed for operational efficiency to take the incessant pilfering and stealing within the Church premises and the Church schools. The Committee was further broken into sub-committees for specific roles to enable us perform effectively. Presently, the Security men numbering nine in all for the Church and School while the High School are five in numbers which were reduce due to lean Church finances as at then with the promises to reconsider increase in their numbers as and when necessary based on need and availability of funds; however, the number has continued to cope with the responsibilities and need. In addition to internal outfit on Sundays and at

special programmes in the Church more hands are always required from Nigerian Police on enumeration basis.

Achievement of the SPSC since last year include the improvement on the dilapidating perimeter fence at the eastern side of the Church premises from where intruders gain access has been blocked and more work for the Church is under way to block the rocky northern side that is also very open but has always been considered to be rugged and difficult to be accessed. By the time the work is completed the Church may have a fairly secure environment from trespasses while the security breaches will greatly reduce. Other achievement made was the items given to the Security men to facilitate their work are as follows:

- i. Reflection jackets by members of SPSC
- ii. Gate pass tags by Centenary Committee
- iii. Torches by member of SPSC

Training, the SPSC supervise and as well conduct training and retraining for the security men when necessary.

Already during the period covered by this report, security breaches have significantly reduced. The SPSC is grateful to the Church for the mutual cooperation for the perimeter fence improvements around the Church premises. However, more attention is still required on other areas for proper kitting of the Security men. Security items required are:

- 1. Uniforms 2. Boots 3. Rain boots 4. Rain coats 5. Umbrellas 6. Torches
- 7. Berets 8. Whistles 9. line yards

Finally, the need for more hands cannot be over emphasized as its very necessary to review the number of security men upwards to enable them have proper shift duties and off duties for efficiency at duty posts. This is very necessary at all duty posts in the church, vicarage, Day school and High school respectively.
