Earlier this month we completed our final collections and shipped the samples off to Missoula for analysis. This project would not have happened without early support from the 4CFF conservation fund, and you also further supported the project with the development of a 10 species Pacific Northwest DNA test. 4CFF Newsletter Outings Report August 2022.

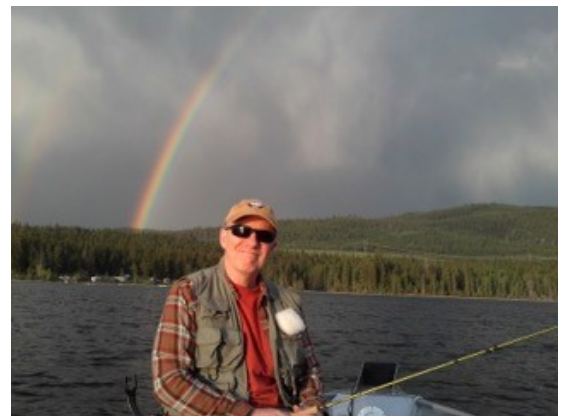
Greetings fellow fly fishers. There are no scheduled Club outings for the rest of 2022, but fishing opportunities are still out there. 2023 will soon be upon us and I'm starting the planning for next year's outings. We will hopefully be able to have our March Pass Lake outing. My understanding is the parking lot repair work is finally underway and will hopefully be completed soon. I've been taking suggestions for possible outings which are listed below.

- ♦ Omak Lake – fishing for Lahontan Cutthroat, April.
- ♦ Sea Run Cutthroat fishing in Puget Sound (spring or fall).
- ♦ Big Twin Lake – Methow Valley spring lakes fishing.
- ♦ Canada – BC spring lake fishing (May-June or fall).
- ♦ Kettle River or Methow River –July.
- ♦ Olympic Peninsula Rivers.
- ♦ Humpy fishing on the Skagit River, Aug-Sept.
- ♦ Upper Skagit River (depending on if the road has been re-opened).
- ♦ Chopaka Lake – fall.
- ♦ Steve Kopp has indicated that he would like to do the small streams class and outing again.

And another milestone has been passed. The 24th edition of the 4th Corner Fly Fishers Biennial Conservation Auction has occurred. And it proved to be quite a success! After the numbers were crunched and the expenses deducted the proceeds were roughly \$18,500! We had more sponsors than ever before.
