Rev. Dorothy M. Evans



—1 Samuel 12:24


Rev. Evans is on a mission to bring the lost to Christ and encourage the faithful on their journey!


Rev. Williams specialties include Public Speaking to exhort and encourage; Church Succession Planning; and Business Legacy and Retirement Planning for individuals.

Since that time, the membership has more than quadrupled and the church has consistently been recognized as one of the most progressive churches in Granville County.







Blood Pressure Checks

You should get your blood pressure checked regularly because high blood pressure is a silent killer. There are often no symptoms of this potentially deadly condition. So while you're going about your day, high blood pressure could be damaging your arteries, your heart, and other organs. The nasty consequences of leaving high blood pressure untreated include stroke, kidney damage, and even erectile dysfunction. Your risk of high blood pressure increases with age. If you smoke, are obese, are physically inactive, or have diabetes or high cholesterol, you may also be at an increased risk. The good news is that a blood pressure test is quick and painless and can be done at most any doctor's office, hospital, or clinic. You may also be a candidate for using a home monitoring device. Talk with your doctor about checking your blood pressure at home.






When God Says "Go"



