Many plants in this botanical garden are trialed for their region, suitability and garden use.

An avid gardener, Richie constantly experiments with plants and growing conditions to learn new ways to become a better gardener and use our natural resources in an efficient manner.

Richie will speak about some of the plant delights in the old Victorian shade gardens, and will show how many of the Victorian gardening practices are making a come back in our modern gardens. We will learn about the lush and abundant plant material available today that rivals the riches of the Victorian era, and find out how to incorporate some of these choice plants in our own gardens
