Letter from the Reverend Beverley Vincent

The passing of time is never more evident than in the changing of the seasons, autumn is looming and often signified by changing our clocks from British Summer Time back to Greenwich Mean Time. The transient pleasure of an extra hour in bed on a Saturday night is quickly replaced with the reality of nights drawing in.

When I was a child, I struggled to understand both how and why we changed the clocks twice a year. How could we alter time? Wasn't time – just time? How could we mess about with it, and decide that what one day was 8am was now 7am? Did it really matter that in the summer it could be light until nearly 10pm – wouldn't 9pm do?

The idea of time as something that could be manipulated and shifted baffled me. It wasn't until I was much older that I understood that the whole notion of measuring and naming 'time' was a human invention. Calendars (for reckoning intervals of time) and clocks (for measuring its passage) have a long history. The first calendars were lunar, and there's evidence of them as long as 6,000 years ago. The first clocks were a form of sundial, found in Egypt. Clearly humans have long felt the need to track the passage of time.

From a human perspective, time is linear and goes in one direction. But what is time like for God? Christians believe that God stands outside of time. There was never a time when God wasn't, and there will never be a time when God isn't. As creatures living in time and subject to it, this is incredibly difficult for us to get our heads around.

In the New Testament the apostle Peter puts it like this: But do not ignore this one fact, dear friends, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. (2 Peter 3:8). From the perspective of God's realm of eternity, time looks very different.

As we follow Jesus we have the promise of eternity, the German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer as a prisoner of war wrote: "What remains for us is only the very narrow path, sometimes barely discernible, of taking each day as if it were the last and yet living it faithfully and responsibly as if there were yet to be a great future."

Let us then take each day as it comes, grateful for the promise it holds and look forward to the timeless future where the light of Christ shows us the way.

Nature Notes

Out walking in the Patch recently with a friend when he declared 'Cormorant'! I



looked up and just glimpsed the rapidly departing subject. At home, I saw that I had only once seen one of these large, fish-eating birds in the area in the last seven years, this on a farm pond in Great Maplestead in May 2020. They are common birds on the coast, and inland on large bodies of fresh water – one of the largest colonies of inland breeding birds in Britain is at Abberton reservoir.

They are a very successful species, found world-wide except for South America and most of North America, the exception there being the far Northeast of Canada. In China they are captured alive, their throats are gently restricted (I know, it seems cruel) and the birds released into the water with a string on the leg. After a successful dive the bird is retrieved, unharmed, the fish is stolen (some astonishingly large) and the process repeated. Human ingenuity – I suspect the cormorant gets a sardine or two for its trouble to keep it working!

Have you heard the tawny owls recently? They are calling incessantly; at night, early in the morning, and I have even heard one in the middle of the day. A very busy period in owl society.

The most exciting moth event of the year occurred on the evening of 6th/7th September when I found a large, completely unexpected, beautiful specimen of *Catocala fraxini*, otherwise known as the Blue Underwing. It is categorised as a recent colonist, immigrant, and former resident. In Essex, it was considered a rare vagrant until quite recently, but is now being seen a little more regularly.



It is a large moth with a wingspan approaching four inches, quite unremarkable with the wings folded but with a spectacular hindwing; black with a broad curved violet blue band and a white fringe. The name *Catocala* comes from the Greek meaning 'beautiful below', in reference to the hindwing; the *fraxini* part comes from the Latin name for ash trees, as it was thought the caterpillar fed on them. Actually, the caterpillar feeds on Aspen and other poplars, but the name can't be changed now. Just a small mistake by the great Systematist, Carl Linnaeus, the founder of the binomial system for naming all plants and animals back in the 1750's.

Do look this moth up on <u>norfolkmoths.co.uk</u> or <u>ukmoths.org.uk</u>, it's a cracker. The flight period is late August until early October, so they could be in your garden too.

Gardening Corner

The shorter days are with us and everything in the garden slows down ready for the colder months ahead. Now is the time for a tidy up; try and leave the odd corner for wildlife either for hibernation or, in the case of wild birds, for seed to provide them with a natural source of nutrition.

Compost in containers or in a heap can be turned top to bottom, ensuring the even break-down of matter ready for mulching next spring.

My plant of the month is the spray chrysanthemum. This perennial comes in a range of colours – from yellow to orange, red and pink – providing a palette of colour before the first frosts. To propagate them, lift each stool once flowering has finished, cut off the old stems and divide into two or three clumps. Replant,



incorporating a little blood, fish and bone and next year's sprays will reward you.

Shrubs in pots, especially those that have been in their container for several years, need to be checked for drainage. If the drainage holes become blocked with excessive root growth pots can become waterlogged in the winter months.

Roses will begin to lose their leaves this month; clear as much of the detritus as you can and place it in the green bin. Black spot spores over-winter around each bush in any fallen leaf material, so doing this will help to keep it at bay.

In the vegetable garden courgettes, marrows and outdoor cucumbers can be cleared away; the leaves will start to show signs of mould, turning from green to grey as a result of colder temperatures and longer nights.

Think about where you're going to plant garlic next month [November]; the bulbs need a long growing season before harvesting around July.

Lastly, prepared Hyacinths can be planted in pots and placed in a frost free shed or unheated room in the dark ready to bring out into a warm atmosphere, preferably on a window sill, at the beginning of December.

roses still looking lovely. It is also the month when the Autumn Crocus/Winter daffodil pop up and of course the trees start to turn their autumn shades. For kids it is a time for gathering conkers and making dens in the wood.

Sunday 15 October is our final full Open Day and together with Wendy's Petcare Services we are planning a dog show to make it a special day out for all the family. There will be dog classes, for the cutest puppy, handsomest dog and prettiest bitch and we are encouraging owners to think about Halloween costume for their dogs too! Essex Police Dog handlers will be with us and Dr Alex to offer veterinary advice. There will be a number of pet food and other stalls, and as usual we will have plant, crafts and the Trust's produce stalls.

Open Thursdays continue to the end of October. They are a time for visitors to see the Trust's volunteers hard at work. We will be taking the last cuttings of the year – if those taken in August and September haven't thrived, which is always a possibility as our volunteers aren't around daily to tend them and the beds we use for cuttings in the walled kitchen garden can get very hot and dry. And we will be starting autumn planting – of bulbs and of shrubs and perennials being moved or newly established before the winter cold arrives.






